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## DEBT LIMIT CONSIDERATIONS

### Overview of Bond Capacity

Washington State has a constitutional debt limit. The state cannot issue bonds for which the debt service (principal and interest payments) on new bonds, when added to the debt service on existing bonds, would exceed 9 percent of the average of the prior three years' general state revenues. Generally speaking, the Washington State Constitution defines general state revenues as all unrestricted state tax revenues.

The House Chair budget proposal assumes passage of House Bill 2019 which eliminates the statutory dedication of the \$0.60 per pack cigarette tax to the Education Legacy Trust Account. Beginning July 1, 2010, the cigarette tax is deposited in the State General Fund, resulting in an increase to general state revenues. The House Chair budget proposal also assumes that for Fiscal Year (FY) 2011 only, general state revenues are increased by the amount of Public Works Assistance Account revenue that was transferred to the State General Fund in the 2011 supplemental operating budget.

The new bond-supported capital budget capacity based on current interest rates, revenue assumptions, and other variables is approximately \$1.43 billion for the 2011 supplemental budget and the 2011-13 biennium. Of this amount, \$801 million in bond capacity is available in FY 2012, with the balance available in FY 2013. In addition, there is Columbia River Water Supply bond capacity remaining from bonds authorized in 2006.

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## PRESERVATION OF ASSETS

### **Renovation, Preservation and Minor Repairs (\$831.9 million)**

Approximately one-quarter of the capital budget is appropriated for projects that preserve the state's public assets through renovation, preservation, and minor works projects, including:

- General government agencies receive \$33.9 million.
- Human service agencies receive \$42.5 million.
- Natural resource agencies receive \$57.3 million.
- Higher education institutions receive \$453.2 million for major renovations, preservation, and preventative facility maintenance.
- K-12 public schools receive \$245.0 million for modernization, urgent school repairs, energy efficiency projects, and minor works preservation.

### **Emergency Repairs (\$10.5 million)**

A \$10.5 million pool of emergency funds is provided to the Office of Financial Management to address unforeseen emergency repairs at state-owned facilities statewide. Emergency funds may only be used for unexpected building or grounds failures that will impact public health and safety, or the day-to-day operations of state facilities.

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## K-12 ASSISTANCE

### **School Construction Assistance Grants (\$718.5 million)**

K-12 School Construction Assistance grants are provided from the following sources: \$389.7 million from state general obligation bonds and \$328.8 million from the Common School Construction Account (CSCA). The CSCA receives revenue from a variety of sources including timber revenue, trust land transfers through the Department of Natural Resources (DNR), federal revenue, and investment and interest income.

### **Vocational Skills Centers (\$60.2 million)**

Funding is provided for skills center projects including:

- \$28.5 million for the Yakima Valley Technical Skills Center;
- \$18.8 million for the Grant County Branch Campus of Wenatchee Valley Skills Center;
- \$7.1 million for the Pierce County Skills Center;
- \$5.7 million for Skills Center minor works projects statewide; and
- \$100,000 for the Clark County Skills Center addition.

### **Energy Efficiency and Urgent Repair Grants (\$25.0 million)**

Funding in the amount of \$20 million is provided for energy efficiency improvements in K-12 public schools. School districts may apply to the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction for energy efficiency project grants that lead to energy and operational cost savings. Additionally, \$5 million is provided for urgent school facility repair and renovation grants to address unforeseen health and safety needs.

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## HIGHER EDUCATION

### Higher Education Capital Projects and Preventative Maintenance (\$626.7 million)

The House Chair proposal includes \$626.7 million in total funds for higher education, including \$407.6 million in state bonds. Of the state bond amount, \$240.4 million is provided for the community and technical college system and \$167.3 for the four-year institutions. In addition, \$16.4 million in certificates of participation are authorized for projects at several community and technical colleges and Central Washington University.

### Major Community and Technical College Projects

Funding is provided for a variety of major projects at community and technical colleges throughout the state, including:

- \$37.7 million for the Health and Science Building at Lower Columbia College.
- \$37.6 million for the replacement of Index Hall at Everett Community College.
- \$35.5 million for the Learning Resource Center at South Puget Sound Community College.
- \$29.5 million for the Academic and Student Services Building at Skagit Valley College.
- \$24.4 million for the Allied Health Care Facility at Clover Park Technical College.
- \$21.8 million for the Science and Math Technology Building at Green River Community College.
- \$20.9 million for renewal of the Technology Building at North Seattle Community College.
- \$20.8 million for campus classrooms at Spokane Falls Community College.

### Major Four-Year Institution Projects

Funding is provided for a variety of major projects at four-year institutions, including:

- \$35.0 million for phase one of the Washington State University Riverpoint Biomedical/Health Services Building in Spokane, Washington.
- \$30.5 million for the second phase of the Patterson Hall remodel at Eastern Washington University.
- \$19.5 million for renovation of the Odegard Undergraduate Learning Center at the University of Washington.
- \$10.8 million for preservation and renovation of the Communications Laboratory Building at The Evergreen State College.

### Preservation of Facilities (\$235.5 million)

Approximately \$167.8 million is provided specifically for preservation and minor works projects for higher education facilities and \$67.8 million is provided for preventative facility maintenance. Preventative facility maintenance funds replace a State General Fund reduction in the operating budget and are to maintain state-owned university facilities housing education and general programs for current occupants and to extend the useful life of buildings.

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## NATURAL RESOURCES

### **Recreation, Conservation and Habitat Protection (\$249.4 million)**

\$50.0 million is provided for Washington Wildlife and Recreation Program grants to support habitat conservation, outdoor recreation, riparian protection, and farmland preservation projects statewide. Grants are awarded to projects based on rankings achieved through competitive application processes and statutory formulas. \$30.0 million in state funds and \$60.0 million in federal expenditure authority are provided for salmon and other species recovery efforts, including programs focused statewide and on the Puget Sound.

In addition, the Trust Land Transfer program within the DNR is provided \$85.5 million to transfer common school trust lands with low income-producing potential but high recreational and environmental value to other public agencies for use as natural or wildlife areas, parks, recreation, or open space.

The State Parks and Recreation Commission receives \$23.9 million for making capital improvements in state parks and trails.

### **Toxics Clean-Up and Prevention (\$181.8 million)**

Hazardous substance tax revenue deposited in the Local and State Toxics Control Accounts are appropriated to several Department of Ecology (DOE) programs, including:

- \$28.6 million for Coordinated Prevention Grants for local government management of solid and hazardous wastes including waste reduction and recycling, disposal, and enforcement.
- \$52 million for the Remedial Action Grant program for clean-up of contaminated industrial sites statewide that the DOE has ranked in priority order on a "worst first" basis.
- \$24.6 million to fund clean-up of toxic sites in the Puget Sound, remediation of soils at schools in central Washington, and clean-up of contaminated sites in eastern Washington.
- \$46.0 million for statewide stormwater projects which will be awarded on a competitive basis to local governments for infrastructure projects that meet critical stormwater management needs.
- \$7.0 million to reduce diesel emissions.
- \$3.0 million to reduce wood stove pollution.

In addition, \$20.6 million in ASARCO settlement funds are provided for continued clean-up of specific sites related to the operation of the smelter plant in Tacoma and mines in northwest and eastern Washington.

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### **Water Quality and Quantity (\$320.2 million)**

Funding is provided for several programs to improve the quality and quantity of Washington state waters. \$273.2 million in state and federal funds are provided for grants and loans for projects that address the state's highest priority water quality needs through the Centennial Clean Water and the Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund programs. \$47.0 million is provided to the Columbia River Basin Water Supply Development program for its mandate to pursue development of water supplies to benefit in-stream and out-of-stream uses.

### **Private Forest and Agricultural Lands (\$24.0 million)**

\$1 million in funding is provided for the Forest Riparian Easement Program and \$19 million, primarily in federal funding, is provided to the Family Forest Fish Passage Program to continue to assist family forest landowners with the financial and regulatory impacts of Forest and Fish legislation enacted in 1999. The funds will be used, respectively, to purchase 50-year conservation easements along riparian areas from family forest landowners and to repair or remove fish passage barriers on forest road crossings over streams.

\$4.0 million is provided to the State Conservation Commission and conservation districts to assist agricultural landowners with installation and maintenance of riparian buffers under the Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program (CREP) and with planning and implementation of livestock nutrient management practices. These state dollars leverage federal investments; for example, the federal government pays for 90 percent of the project costs under CREP and once the installation becomes established, compensates the landowner for fifteen years for taking land out of production.

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## GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS

### **Local Government Infrastructure (\$433.7 million)**

Funding is provided to assist local governments in repairing and developing infrastructure systems. \$330.8 million is provided for loans through the Public Works Board (PWB) to finance the construction, repair, and rehabilitation of local infrastructure systems such as water, storm and sanitary sewers, and solid waste. An additional \$97.9 million in state and federal funds is provided to the PWB and the Department of Health to protect and improve the state's drinking water facilities. The Community Economic Revitalization Board also receives \$5.0 million for grants and loans to assist local governments and federally-recognized Indian tribes with financing public infrastructure improvements that encourage new business development and expansion in areas seeking economic growth.

### **Grants Benefitting Local Communities (\$43.4 million)**

Funding is provided for competitive grant programs managed by the Department of Commerce (Commerce) and the Washington State Historical Society. \$14.7 million is provided to assist 22 nonprofit organizations with technical assistance and capital funding for social service and multipurpose community centers. \$5.3 million is provided to assist 11 nonprofit organizations to develop facilities that feature a youth recreational component and a supporting social service or educational component. \$10 million is provided to support the capital needs and facilities of 29 heritage organizations, tribal governments, public development authorities, or local government agencies that interpret and preserve Washington's history and heritage. \$13.4 million in grants is also provided to a variety of local community and nonprofit organization projects through Commerce.

### **Low-Income Housing Assistance and Weatherization (\$60.0 million)**

State funding in the amount of \$60.0 million is provided for loans and grants through the Housing Trust Fund program to construct, acquire, and rehabilitate low-income housing and for weatherization. Specific funding is allocated for housing projects to serve homeless veterans, people with developmental disabilities, farmworkers, and under-served communities of concern. \$6 million is provided for weatherization administered through the Energy Matchmakers program.

### **Maple Lane School Closure**

The Department of Social and Health Services (Department) receives \$1.34 million in the 2011 Supplemental to complete design and planning to provide capacity as a result of the closure of Maple Lane School. The Department also receives authority to use a financing contract in the amount of \$15.8 million for the construction of required capacity in the 2011-13 Capital Budget.
