3 "NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) A capital budget is hereby adopted
4 and, subject to the provisions set forth in this act, the several
5 dollar amounts hereinafter specified, or so much thereof as shall be
6 sufficient to accomplish the purposes designated, are hereby
7 appropriated and authorized to be incurred for capital projects
8 during the period beginning with the effective date of this section
9 and ending June 30, 2021, out of the several funds specified in this
10 act.

11 (2) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout this act
12 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

13 (a) "Fiscal year 2020" or "FY 2020" means the period beginning
14 July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020.

15 (b) "Fiscal year 2021" or "FY 2021" means the period beginning
16 July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021.

17 (c) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an
18 unappropriated status.

19 (d) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent
20 only for the specified purpose.

21 (3) Unless otherwise specifically authorized in this act, any
22 portion of an amount provided solely for a specified purpose that is
23 not expended subject to the specified conditions and limitations to
24 fulfill the specified purpose shall lapse.

25 (4) The amounts shown under the headings "Prior Biennia," "Future
26 Biennia," and "Total" in this act are for informational purposes only
27 and do not constitute legislative approval of these amounts. "Prior
28 biennia" typically refers to the immediate prior biennium for
29 reappropriations, but may refer to multiple biennia in the case of
30 specific projects. A "future biennia" amount is an estimate of what
31 may be appropriated for the project or program in the 2021-2023
32 biennium and the following three biennia; an amount of zero does not

1 necessarily constitute legislative intent to not provide funding for
2 the project or program in the future.

3 (5) "Reappropriations" in this act are appropriations and, unless
4 the context clearly provides otherwise, are subject to the relevant
5 conditions and limitations applicable to appropriations.
6 Reappropriations shall be limited to the unexpended balances
7 remaining on June 30, 2019, from the 2017-2019 biennial
8 appropriations for each project.

5 commission, must develop and implement a process for the collection
6 of certified final development cost data from each grant or loan
7 recipient under this section. The department must use this data as

10 department must provide the legislature with a report of its final
11 cost data for each project under this section. Such cost data must,
12 at a minimum, include total development cost per unit for each
13 project completed within the past year, descriptive statistics such

15 other costs that the department deems necessary to improve cost
16 controls and enhance understanding of development costs. The

38 (5) \$3,000,000 is provided solely for the Evergreen treatment
39 services building purchase, contingent on matching funds.

1 (6) (a) \$3,000,000 is provided solely for a grant to a joint
2 venture between MultiCare-Franciscan to provide community based
3 behavioral health services. Funding provided in this subsection is
4 subject to the criteria in subsection (1) of this section. The
5 department of commerce may not release funding for this project
6 unless MultiCare-Franciscan enters into a memorandum of understanding
7 with the department of social and health services by October 31,
8 2018, to collaborate on development and implementation of strategies
9 to expand the behavioral health workforce in the region. At a
10 minimum, the agreement must include strategies for increasing

25 care professionals to the area and ensure comparable exposure to the
26 benefits of working for each organization. The parties must measure
27 the success of these strategies by the decrease in vacancy rate for
28 health care professionals necessary to provide safe, quality
29 inpatient psychiatric care in MultiCare-Franciscan and department
30 facilities following the first year as the baseline of the
31 partnership/consortium and with updated goals for each subsequent
32 year. MultiCare-Franciscan and the department of social and health
33 services must work to increase the competency and skills of health
34 care professionals across both facilities by establishing organized
35 joint- and cross-training programs. The parties must measure the
36 success of this strategy by the number of health care professionals
37 in total and by discipline complete cross-training activities and by
38 the number and hours of cross-training opportunities offered under
39 the agreement.

1 (7) The department of commerce shall notify all applicants that
2 they may be required to have a construction review performed by the
3 department of health.

4 (8) To accommodate the emergent need for behavioral health
5 services, the department of health and the department of commerce, in
6 collaboration with the health care authority and the department of
7 social and health services, shall establish a concurrent and
8 expedited process to assist grant applicants in meeting any
9 applicable regulatory requirements necessary to operate inpatient
10 psychiatric beds, free-standing evaluation and treatment facilities,
11 enhanced services facilities, triage facilities, crisis stabilization
12 facilities, detox, or secure detox.

PART 7

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7001.** RCW 43.88.031 requires the disclosure of the estimated debt service costs associated with new capital bond appropriations. The estimated debt service costs for the appropriations contained in this act are forty-nine million, six hundred thirteen thousand dollars for the 2019-2021 biennium, three hundred six million, nine hundred ninety four thousand dollars for the 2021-2023 biennium, and four hundred twenty-eight million, eight hundred ninety thousand dollars for the 2023-2025 biennium.

NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7002.** ACQUISITION OF PROPERTIES AND FACILITIES THROUGH FINANCIAL CONTRACTS. (1) The following agencies may enter into financial contracts, paid from any funds of an agency, appropriated or nonappropriated, for the purposes indicated and in not more than the principal amounts indicated, plus financing expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW. When securing properties under this section, agencies shall use the most economical financial contract option available, including long-term leases, lease-purchase agreements, lease-development with option to purchase agreements or financial contracts using certificates of participation. Expenditures made by an agency for one of the indicated purposes before the issue date of the authorized financial contract and any certificates of participation therein are intended to be reimbursed from proceeds of the financial contract and any certificates of participation therein to the extent provided in the agency's financing plan approved by the state finance committee.

(2) Those noninstructional facilities of higher education institutions authorized in this section to enter into financial contracts are not eligible for state funded maintenance and operations. Instructional space that is available for regularly scheduled classes for academic transfer, basic skills, and workforce training programs may be eligible for state funded maintenance and operations.

(3) Western Washington University: Enter into a financing contract for up to \$9,950,000 plus financing expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to construct a consolidated academic support services facility. The university must not increase

1 administrative support rates to pay debt service for this financing
2 contract.

3 (4) Department of fish and wildlife: Enter into a financing
4 contract for up to \$3,099,000 plus financing expenses and required
5 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to purchase automated salmon
6 marking trailers.

7 (5) Department of natural resources: Enter into a financing
8 contract for up to \$1,800,000 plus financing expenses and required
9 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to remodel spaces within
10 agency-owned commercial buildings that will benefit the common school
11 trust.

12 (6) Department of social and health services: Enter into a
13 financing contract for up to \$3,600,000 plus financing expenses and
14 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to purchase the King
15 county secure community transition center.

16 (7) Office of the secretary of state: Enter into a financing
17 contract for up to \$103,143,000 plus financing expenses and required
18 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to construct the library-
19 archives building. The financial contract is provided solely for
20 implementation of Substitute House Bill No. 2015 (library-archives
21 building). If the bill is not enacted by June 30, 2019, the amounts
22 provided in this subsection shall lapse.

23 (8) Washington state patrol: Enter into a financing contract for
24 up to \$7,450,000 plus financing expenses and required reserves
25 pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to construct a replacement for the fire
26 training academy burn building.

27 (9) Community and technical colleges:

28 (a) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Columbia Basin
29 Community College for up to \$27,000,000 plus financing expenses and
30 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to construct a
31 student recreation center.

32 (b) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Pierce College
33 Puyallup for up to \$2,831,000 plus financing expenses and required
34 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to purchase land and construct
35 parking.

36 (c) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Walla Walla
37 Community College for up to \$1,500,000 plus financing expenses and
38 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to build a student
39 activity center on the Clarkston campus.

1 (d) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Walla Walla
2 Community College for up to \$6,500,000 plus financing expenses and
3 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to build a student
4 recreation center.

5 (e) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Wenatchee Valley
6 College for up to \$4,500,000 plus financing expenses and required
7 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW for the Wells Hall replacement
8 project.

9 (f) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Yakima Valley
10 Community College for up to \$22,700,000 plus financing expenses and
11 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to build additional
12 instructional and lab classroom space.

13 (g) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Everett
14 Community College for up to \$10,000,000 plus financing expenses and
15 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to purchase one or
16 more properties adjacent to the campus.

17 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7003.** (1) To ensure that major construction
18 projects are carried out in accordance with legislative and executive
19 intent, agencies must complete a predesign for state construction
20 projects with a total anticipated cost in excess of \$5,000,000, or
21 \$10,000,000 for higher education institutions. "Total anticipated
22 cost" means the sum of the anticipated cost of the predesign, design,
23 and construction phases of the project.

24 (2) Appropriations for design may not be expended or encumbered
25 until the office of financial management has reviewed and approved
26 the agency's predesign.

27 (3) The predesign must explore at least three project
28 alternatives. These alternatives must be both distinctly different
29 and viable solutions to the issue being addressed. The chosen
30 alternative should be the most reasonable and cost-effective
31 solution. The predesign document must include, but not be limited to,
32 program, site, and cost analysis, and an analysis of the life-cycle
33 costs of the alternatives explored, in accordance with the predesign
34 manual adopted by the office of financial management.

35 (4) The office of financial management may make an exception to
36 the predesign requirements in this section after notifying the
37 legislative fiscal committees and waiting ten days for comment by the
38 legislature regarding the proposed exception.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7004.** Agencies administering construction
2 projects with a total anticipated cost in excess of \$5,000,000, or
3 \$10,000,000 for higher education institutions, must submit progress
4 reports to the office of financial management and to the fiscal
5 committees of the house of representatives and senate. "Total
6 anticipated cost" means the sum of the anticipated cost of the
7 predesign, design, and construction phases of the project. Reports
8 must be submitted on July 1st and December 31st of each year in a
9 format determined by the office of financial management. After the
10 project is completed, agencies must also submit a closeout report
11 that identifies the total project cost and any unspent
12 appropriations.

13 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7005.** (1) Allotments for appropriations in
14 this act shall be provided in accordance with the capital project
15 review requirements adopted by the office of financial management and
16 in compliance with RCW 43.88.110. Projects that will be employing
17 alternative public works construction procedures under chapter 39.10
18 RCW are subject to the allotment procedures defined in this section
19 and RCW 43.88.110.

20 (2) Each project is defined as proposed in the legislative budget
21 notes or in the governor's budget document.

22 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7006.** (1) The office of financial management
23 may authorize a transfer of appropriation authority provided for a
24 capital project that is in excess of the amount required for the
25 completion of such project to another capital project for which the
26 appropriation is insufficient. No such transfer may be used to expand
27 the capacity of any facility beyond that intended in making the
28 appropriation. Such transfers may be effected only between capital
29 appropriations to a specific department, commission, agency, or
30 institution of higher education and only between capital projects
31 that are funded from the same fund or account. No transfers may occur
32 between projects to local government agencies except where the grants
33 are provided within a single omnibus appropriation and where such
34 transfers are specifically authorized by the implementing statutes
35 that govern the grants.

36 (2) The office of financial management may find that an amount is
37 in excess of the amount required for the completion of a project only
38 if: (a) The project as defined in the notes to the budget document is

1 substantially complete and there are funds remaining; or (b) bids
2 have been let on a project and it appears to a substantial certainty
3 that the project as defined in the notes to the budget document can
4 be completed within the biennium for less than the amount
5 appropriated in this act.

6 (3) For the purposes of this section, the intent is that each
7 project be defined as proposed to the legislature in the governor's
8 budget document, unless it clearly appears from the legislative
9 history that the legislature intended to define the scope of a
10 project in a different way.

11 (4) A report of any transfer effected under this section, except
12 emergency projects or any transfer under \$250,000, shall be filed
13 with the legislative fiscal committees of the senate and house of
14 representatives by the office of financial management at least thirty
15 days before the date the transfer is effected. The office of
16 financial management shall report all emergency or smaller transfers
17 within thirty days from the date of transfer.

18 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7007.** (1) It is expected that projects be
19 ready to proceed in a timely manner depending on the type or phase of
20 the project or program that is the subject of the appropriation in
21 this act. Except for major projects that customarily may take more
22 than two biennia to complete from predesign to the end of
23 construction, or large infrastructure grant or loan programs
24 supporting projects that often take more than two biennia to
25 complete, the legislature generally does not intend to reappropriate
26 funds more than once, particularly for smaller grant programs, local/
27 community projects, and minor works.

28 (2) Agencies shall expedite the expenditure of reappropriations
29 and appropriations in this act in order to: (a) Rehabilitate
30 infrastructure resources; (b) accelerate environmental rehabilitation
31 and restoration projects for the improvement of the state's natural
32 environment; (c) reduce additional costs associated with acquisition
33 and construction inflationary pressures; and (d) provide additional
34 employment opportunities associated with capital expenditures.

35 (3) To the extent feasible, agencies are directed to accelerate
36 expenditure rates at their current level of permanent employees and
37 shall use contracted design and construction services wherever
38 necessary to meet the goals of this section.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7008.** (1) Any building project that receives
2 over \$10,000,000 in funding from the capital budget must be built to
3 sustainable standards. "Sustainable building" means a building that
4 integrates and optimizes all major high-performance building
5 attributes, including energy efficiency, durability, life-cycle
6 performance, and occupant productivity. The following design and
7 construction attributes must be integrated into the building project:

8 (a) Employ integrated design principles: Use a collaborative,
9 integrated planning and design process that initiates and maintains
10 an integrated project team in all stages of a project's planning and
11 delivery. Establish performance goals for siting, energy, water,
12 materials, and indoor environmental quality along with other
13 comprehensive design goals and ensures incorporation of these goals
14 throughout the design and life-cycle of the building. Consider all
15 stages of the building's life-cycle, including deconstruction.

16 (b) Commissioning: Employ commissioning practices tailored to the
17 size and complexity of the building and its system components in
18 order to verify performance of building components and systems and
19 help ensure that design requirements are met. This should include an
20 experienced commissioning provider, inclusion of commissioning
21 requirements in construction documents, a commissioning plan,
22 verification of the installation and performance of systems to be
23 commissioned, and a commissioning report.

24 (c) Optimize energy performance: Establish a whole building
25 performance target that takes into account the intended use,
26 occupancy, operations, plug loads, other energy demands, and design
27 to earn the ENERGY STAR targets for new construction and major
28 renovation where applicable. For new construction target low energy
29 use index. For major renovations, target reducing energy use by fifty
30 percent below prerenovations baseline.

31 (d) On-site renewable energy: Meet at least thirty percent of the
32 hot water demand through the installation of solar hot water heaters,
33 when life-cycle cost effective. Implement renewable energy generation
34 projects on agency property for agency use, when life-cycle cost
35 effective.

36 (e) Measurement and verification: Where appropriate, install
37 building level electricity meters in new major construction and
38 renovation projects to track and continuously optimize performance.
39 Include equivalent meters for natural gas and steam, where natural

1 gas and steam are used. Where appropriate, install dashboards inside
2 buildings to display and incentivize occupants on energy use.

3 (f) Benchmarking: Compare performance data from the first year of
4 operation with the energy design target. Verify that the building
5 performance meets or exceeds the design target. For other building
6 and space types, use an equivalent benchmarking tool.

7 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7009.** State agencies, including institutions
8 of higher education, shall allot and report full-time equivalent
9 staff for capital projects in a manner comparable to staff reporting
10 for operating expenditures.

11 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7010.** Executive Order No. 05-05,
12 archaeological and cultural resources, was issued effective November
13 10, 2005. Agencies shall comply with the requirements set forth in
14 this executive order.

15 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7011.** FOR THE ARTS COMMISSION—ART WORK
16 ALLOWANCE. (1) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this
17 act for original construction of school plant facilities is provided
18 solely for the purposes of RCW 28A.335.210.

19 (2) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act
20 for original construction or any major renovation or remodel work
21 exceeding \$200,000 by colleges or universities is provided solely for
22 the purposes of RCW 28B.10.027.

23 (3) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act
24 for original construction of any public building by a state agency
25 identified in RCW 43.17.200 is provided solely for the purposes of
26 RCW 43.17.200.

27 (4) At least eighty percent of the moneys spent by the Washington
28 state arts commission during the 2019-2021 biennium for the purposes
29 of RCW 28A.335.210, 28B.10.027, and 43.17.200 must be expended solely
30 for direct acquisition of works of art. Art allocations not expended
31 within the ensuing two biennia shall lapse. The commission may use up
32 to \$200,000 of this amount to conserve or maintain existing pieces in
33 the state art collection.

34 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7012.** To carry out the provisions of this
35 act, the governor may assign responsibility for predesign, design,
36 construction, and other related activities to any appropriate agency.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7013.** If any federal moneys appropriated by
2 this act for capital projects are not received by the state, the
3 department or agency to which the moneys were appropriated may
4 replace the federal moneys with funds available from private or local
5 sources. No replacement may occur under this section without the
6 prior approval of the director of financial management in
7 consultation with the senate ways and means committee and the house
8 of representatives capital budget committee.

9 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7014.** (1) Unless otherwise stated, for all
10 appropriations under this act that require a match of nonstate money
11 or in-kind contributions, the following requirement, consistent with
12 RCW 43.88.150, shall apply: Expenditures of state money shall be
13 timed so that the state share of project expenditures never exceeds
14 the intended state share of total project costs.

15 (2) Provision of the full amount of required matching funds is
16 not required to permit the expenditure of capital budget
17 appropriations for phased projects if a proportional amount of the
18 required matching funds is provided for each distinct, identifiable
19 phase of the project.

20 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7015.** NONTAXABLE AND TAXABLE BOND PROCEEDS.
21 Portions of the appropriation authority granted by this act from the
22 state building construction account, or any other account receiving
23 bond proceeds, may be transferred to the state taxable building
24 construction account as deemed necessary by the state finance
25 committee to comply with the federal internal revenue service rules
26 and regulations pertaining to the use of nontaxable bond proceeds.
27 Portions of the general obligation bond proceeds authorized by
28 chapter 3, Laws of 2018, (House Bill No. 1080, the general obligation
29 bond bill) for deposit into the state taxable building construction
30 account that are in excess of amounts required to comply with the
31 federal internal revenue service rules and regulations shall be
32 deposited into the state building construction account. The state
33 treasurer shall submit written notification to the director of
34 financial management if it is determined that a shift of
35 appropriation authority between the state building construction
36 account, or any other account receiving bond proceeds, and the state
37 taxable building construction account is necessary, or that a shift
38 of appropriation authority from the state taxable building

1 construction account to the state building construction account may
2 be made.

3 **Sec. 7016.** RCW 28B.20.725 and 2018 c 2 s 7019 are each amended
4 to read as follows:

5 The board is hereby empowered:

6 (1) To reserve the right to issue bonds later on a parity with
7 any bonds being issued;

8 (2) To authorize the investing of moneys in the bond retirement
9 fund and any reserve account therein;

10 (3) To authorize the transfer of money from the University of
11 Washington building account to the bond retirement fund when
12 necessary to prevent a default in the payments required to be made

31 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7018.** (1) Minor works project lists are
32 single line appropriations that include multiple projects of a
33 similar nature and that are valued between \$25,000 and \$1,000,000
34 each, with the exception of higher education minor works projects
35 that may be valued up to \$2,000,000. Funds appropriated in this act
36 for minor works may not be initially allotted until agencies submit
37 project lists to the office of financial management for review and
38 approval.

1 (2) Revisions to the project lists, including the addition of
2 projects and the transfer of funds between projects, are allowed but
3 must be submitted to the office of financial management, the house of
4 representatives capital budget committee, and the senate ways and
5 means committee for review and comment, and must include an
6 explanation of variances from prior lists. Any project list revisions
7 must be approved by the office of financial management before funds
8 may be expended from the minor works appropriation.

9 (3) (a) All minor works projects should be completed within two

29 (d) Minor works preservation projects may include program
30 improvements of no more than twenty-five percent of the individual

32 (e) Improvements for accessibility in compliance with the
33 Americans with disabilities act may be included in any of the minor
34 works categories.

35 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7019. FOR THE STATE TREASURER—TRANSFERS**

36 (1) Public Works Assistance Account: For transfer
37 to the water pollution control revolving account, up to
38 \$6,000,000 for fiscal year 2020 and up to \$6,000,000 for
39 fiscal year 2021 \$12,000,000

1 (2) Public Works Assistance Account: For transfer
2 to the drinking water assistance account, up to
3 \$5,500,000 for fiscal year 2020 and up to \$5,500,000 for
4 fiscal year 2021 \$11,000,000

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7020.** To the extent that any appropriation
6 authorizes expenditures of state funds from the state building
7 construction account, or from any other capital project account in
8 the state treasury, for a capital project or program that is
9 specified to be funded with proceeds from the sale of bonds, the
10 legislature declares that any such expenditures for that project or
11 program made prior to the issue date of the applicable bonds are
12 intended to be reimbursed from proceeds of those bonds in a maximum
13 amount equal to the amount of such appropriation.

14 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7021.** The department of enterprise services,
15 in consultation with the office of financial management, is granted
16 the authority to sell the property known as the Tacoma Rhodes complex
17 for no less than fair market value. The price must cover appraisal
18 costs, all debt service, all closing costs, and the cost of
19 outstanding liabilities necessary to keep the department whole. The
20 property consists of the Broadway building, market building, and
21 parking garage. The terms and conditions of the sale must meet the
22 business needs of the state tenants.

23 **Sec. 7022.** RCW 43.88D.010 and 2018 c 298 s 7013 are each amended
24 to read as follows:

25 (1) By October 1st of each even-numbered year, the office of
26 financial management shall complete an objective analysis and scoring
27 of all capital budget projects proposed by the public four-year
28 institutions of higher education and submit the results of the
29 scoring process to the legislative fiscal committees and the four-
30 year institutions. Each project must be reviewed and scored within
31 one of the following categories, according to the project's principal
32 purpose. Each project may be scored in only one category. The
33 categories are:

34 (a) Access-related projects to accommodate enrollment growth at
35 all campuses, at existing or new university centers, or through
36 distance learning. Growth projects should provide significant
37 additional student capacity. Proposed projects must demonstrate that

1 they are based on solid enrollment demand projections, more
2 cost-effectively provide enrollment access than alternatives such as
3 university centers and distance learning, and make cost-effective use
4 of existing and proposed new space;

5 (b) Projects that replace failing permanent buildings. Facilities
6 that cannot be economically renovated are considered replacement
7 projects. New space may be programmed for the same or a different use
8 than the space being replaced and may include additions to improve
9 access and enhance the relationship of program or support space;

10 (c) Projects that renovate facilities to restore building life
11 and upgrade space to meet current program requirements. Renovation
12 projects should represent a complete renovation of a total facility
13 or an isolated wing of a facility. A reasonable renovation project
14 should cost between sixty to eighty percent of current replacement
15 value and restore the renovated area to at least twenty-five years of
16 useful life. New space may be programmed for the same or a different
17 use than the space being renovated and may include additions to
18 improve access and enhance the relationship of program or support
19 space;

20 (d) Major stand-alone campus infrastructure projects;

21 (e) Projects that promote economic growth and innovation through
22 expanded research activity. The acquisition and installation of
23 specialized equipment is authorized under this category; and

24 (f) Other project categories as determined by the office of
25 financial management in consultation with the legislative fiscal
26 committees.

27 (2) The office of financial management, in consultation with the
28 legislative fiscal committees, shall establish a scoring system and
29 process for each four-year project category that is based on the
30 framework used in the community and technical college system of
31 prioritization. Staff from the state board for community and
32 technical colleges and the four-year institutions shall provide
33 technical assistance on the development of a scoring system and
34 process.

35 (3) The office of financial management shall consult with the
36 legislative fiscal committees in the scoring of four-year institution
37 project proposals, and may also solicit participation by independent
38 experts.

39 (a) For each four-year project category, the scoring system must,
40 at a minimum, include an evaluation of enrollment trends,

1 reasonableness of cost, the ability of the project to enhance
2 specific strategic master plan goals, age and condition of the
3 facility if applicable, and impact on space utilization.

4 (b) Each four-year project category may include projects at the
5 predesign, design, or construction funding phase.

6 (c) To the extent possible, the objective analysis and scoring
7 system of all capital budget projects shall occur within the context
8 of any and all performance agreements between the office of financial
9 management and the governing board of a public, four-year institution
10 of higher education that aligns goals, priorities, desired outcomes,
11 flexibility, institutional mission, accountability, and levels of
12 resources.

13 (4) In evaluating and scoring four-year institution projects, the
14 office of financial management shall take into consideration project
15 schedules that result in realistic, balanced, and predictable
16 expenditure patterns over the ensuing three biennia.

17 (5) The office of financial management shall distribute common
18 definitions, the scoring system, and other information required for
19 the project proposal and scoring process as part of its biennial
20 budget instructions. The office of financial management, in
21 consultation with the legislative fiscal committees, shall develop
22 common definitions that four-year institutions must use in developing
23 their project proposals and lists under this section.

24 (6) In developing any scoring system for capital projects
25 proposed by the four-year institutions, the office of financial
26 management:

27 (a) Shall be provided with all required information by the four-
28 year institutions as deemed necessary by the office of financial
29 management;

30 (b) May utilize independent services to verify, sample, or
31 evaluate information provided to the office of financial management
32 by the four-year institutions; and

33 (c) Shall have full access to all data maintained by the joint
34 legislative audit and review committee concerning the condition of
35 higher education facilities.

36 (7) By August 1st of each even-numbered year each public four-
37 year higher education institution shall prepare and submit
38 prioritized lists of the individual projects proposed by the
39 institution for the ensuing six-year period in each category. The
40 lists must be submitted to the office of financial management and the

1 legislative fiscal committees. The four-year institutions may
2 aggregate minor works project proposals by primary purpose for
3 ranking purposes. Proposed minor works projects must be prioritized
4 within the aggregated proposal, and supporting documentation,
5 including project descriptions and cost estimates, must be provided
6 to the office of financial management and the legislative fiscal
7 committees.

8 (8) For the 2017-2019 fiscal biennium and the 2019-2021 fiscal
9 biennium, pursuant to subsection (1) of this section, by November 1,
10 ((2018)) 2020, the office of financial management must score higher
11 education capital project criteria with a rating scale that assesses
12 how well a particular project satisfies those criteria. The office of
13 financial management may not use a rating scale that weighs the
14 importance of those criteria.

15 (9) For the 2017-2019 fiscal biennium and the 2019-2021 fiscal
16 biennium, pursuant to subsection (6)(a) of this section and in lieu
17 of the requirements of subsection (7) of this section, by August 15,
18 ((2018)) 2020, the institutions of higher education shall prepare and
19 submit or resubmit to the office of financial management and the
20 legislative fiscal committees:

21 (a) Individual project proposals developed pursuant to subsection
22 (1) of this section;

23 (b) Individual project proposals scored in prior biennia pursuant
24 to subsection (1) of this section; and

25 (c) A prioritized list of up to five project proposals submitted
26 pursuant to (a) and (b) of this subsection.

27 **Sec. 7023.** RCW 28B.77.070 and 2018 c 298 s 7014 are each amended
28 to read as follows:

29 (1) The council shall identify budget priorities and levels of
30 funding for higher education, including the two and four-year
31 institutions of higher education and state financial aid programs. It
32 is the intent of the legislature for the council to make budget
33 recommendations for allocations for major policy changes in
34 accordance with priorities set forth in the ten-year plan, but the
35 legislature does not intend for the council to review and make
36 recommendations on individual institutional budgets. It is the intent
37 of the legislature that recommendations from the council prioritize
38 funding needs for the overall system of higher education in
39 accordance with priorities set forth in the ten-year plan. It is also

1 the intent of the legislature that the council's recommendations take
2 into consideration the total per-student funding at similar public
3 institutions of higher education in the global challenge states.

4 (2) By December of each odd-numbered year, the council shall
5 outline the council's fiscal priorities under the ten-year plan that
6 it must distribute to the institutions, the state board for community
7 and technical colleges, the office of financial management, and the
8 joint higher education committee.

9 (a) Capital budget outlines for the two-year institutions shall
10 be submitted to the office of financial management by August 15th of
11 each even-numbered year, and shall include the prioritized ranking of
12 the capital projects being requested, a description of each capital
13 project, and the amount and fund source being requested.

14 (b) Capital budget outlines for the four-year institutions must
15 be submitted to the office of financial management by August 15th of
16 each even-numbered year, and must include: The institutions' priority
17 ranking of the project; the capital budget category within which the
18 project will be submitted to the office of financial management in
19 accordance with RCW 43.88D.010; a description of each capital
20 project; and the amount and fund source being requested.

21 (c) The office of financial management shall reference these
22 reporting requirements in its budget instructions.

23 (3) The council shall submit recommendations on the operating
24 budget priorities to support the ten-year plan to the office of
25 financial management by October 1st each year, and to the legislature
26 by January 1st each year.

27 (4)(a) The office of financial management shall develop one
28 prioritized list of capital projects for the legislature to consider
29 that includes all of the projects requested by the four-year
30 institutions of higher education that were scored by the office of
31 financial management pursuant to chapter 43.88D RCW, including
32 projects that were previously scored but not funded. The prioritized
33 list of capital projects shall be based on the following priorities
34 in the following order:

35 (i) Office of financial management scores pursuant to chapter
36 43.88D RCW;

37 (ii) Preserving assets;

38 (iii) Degree production; and

39 (iv) Maximizing efficient use of instructional space.

1 (b) The office of financial management shall include all of the
2 capital projects requested by the four-year institutions of higher
3 education, except for the minor works projects, in the prioritized
4 list of capital projects provided to the legislature.

5 (c) The form of the prioritized list for capital projects
6 requested by the four-year institutions of higher education shall be
7 provided as one list, ranked in priority order with the highest
8 priority project ranked number "1" through the lowest priority
9 project numbered last. The ranking for the prioritized list of
10 capital projects may not:

11 (i) Include subpriorities;

12 (ii) Be organized by category;

13 (iii) Assume any state bond or building account biennial funding
14 level to prioritize the list; or

15 (iv) Assume any specific share of projects by institution in the
16 priority list.

17 (5) Institutions and the state board for community and technical
18 colleges shall submit any supplemental capital budget requests and
19 revisions to the office of financial management by November 1st and
20 to the legislature by January 1st.

21 (6) For the 2017-2019 fiscal biennium and the 2019-2021 fiscal
22 biennium, pursuant to subsection (4) of this section, the office of
23 financial management may, but is not obligated to, develop one
24 prioritized list of capital projects for the legislature to consider
25 that includes all of the projects requested by the four-year
26 institutions of higher education that were scored by the office of
27 financial management pursuant to chapter 43.88D RCW, including
28 projects that were previously scored but not funded.

29 NEW SECTION. Sec. 7024. (1) The department of natural resources
30 must conduct an asset valuation of state lands and state forestlands
31 held in trust and managed by the department. The analysis required in
32 subsections (3) and (4) of this section may be provided through
33 contracted services.

34 (2) The department must describe all trust lands, by trust,
35 including timber lands, agricultural lands, commercial lands, and
36 other lands, and identify revenues from leases or other sources for
37 those lands. The department must briefly describe the income from
38 these trust lands, and potential enhancements to income, including
39 intergenerational income, from the asset bases of these trusts.

1 (3) The analysis must estimate the current fair market value of
2 these lands for each trust beneficiary, including the separate
3 beneficiaries of state lands as defined in RCW 79.02.010, and the
4 beneficiaries of state forestlands as specified in chapter 79.22 RCW.
5 The estimation of current fair market values must specify the values
6 by the various asset classes including, but not limited to, the
7 following asset classes: Timber lands; irrigated agriculture; dryland
8 agriculture, including grazing lands; commercial real estate; mining;
9 and other income production. The analysis must also estimate the
10 value of ecosystem services and recreation benefits for asset classes
11 that produce these benefits. The legislature encourages the
12 department and its contractors to develop methods and tools to allow
13 tracking of the estimated fair market values over time.

14 (4) For each of the different asset classes and for each of the
15 various trusts, the analysis must calculate the average annual gross
16 and net income as a percentage of estimated current asset value.

17 (5) The department must provide a progress report to the
18 legislature by December 1, 2019, which may include any initial
19 recommendations. The final report must be submitted by June 30, 2020,
20 and must include options to:

21 (a) Improve the net rates of return on different classes of
22 assets;

23 (b) Increase the reliability of, and enhance if possible, revenue
24 for trust beneficiaries; and

25 (c) Present and explain factors that either (i) define, (ii)
26 constrict, or (iii) define and constrict the department's management
27 practices and revenue production. The factors to be considered
28 include, but are not limited to, statutory, constitutional,
29 operational, and social factors.

30 **Sec. 7025.** RCW 43.155.050 and 2017 3rd sp.s. c 10 s 5 and 2017
31 3rd sp.s. c 1 s 974 are each reenacted and amended to read as
32 follows:

33 The public works assistance account is hereby established in the
34 state treasury. Money may be placed in the public works assistance
35 account from the proceeds of bonds when authorized by the legislature
36 or from any other lawful source. Money in the public works assistance
37 account shall be used to make loans and grants and to give financial
38 guarantees to local governments for public works projects. Moneys in
39 the account may also be appropriated or transferred to the water

1 pollution control revolving account [fund] and the drinking water
2 assistance account to provide for state match requirements under
3 federal law. Not more than twenty percent of the biennial capital
4 budget appropriation to the public works board from this account may
5 be expended or obligated for preconstruction loans and grants,
6 emergency loans and grants, or loans and grants for capital facility
7 planning under this chapter. Not more than ten percent of the
8 biennial capital budget appropriation to the public works board from
9 this account may be expended or obligated as grants for
10 preconstruction, emergency, capital facility planning, and
11 construction projects. During the ((2015-2017)) 2019-2021 fiscal
12 biennium, the legislature may transfer from the public works
13 assistance account to the general fund, the water pollution control
14 revolving account [fund], and the drinking water assistance account
15 such amounts as reflect the excess fund balance of the account.
16 During the ((2015-2017 and)) 2017-2019 fiscal ((biennia)) biennium,
17 the legislature may appropriate moneys from the account for
18 activities related to rural economic development, the growth
19 management act, the department of health drinking water system
20 repairs and consolidation program, and the voluntary stewardship
21 program. ((During the 2015-2017 fiscal biennium, the legislature may
22 transfer from the public works assistance account to the state
23 general fund such amounts as specified by the legislature.)) During
24 the 2017-2019 fiscal biennium, the legislature may direct the state
25 treasurer to make transfers of moneys in the public works assistance
26 account to the education legacy trust account. It is the intent of
27 the legislature that this policy will be continued in subsequent
28 fiscal biennia.

29 **Sec. 7026.** 2018 c 298 s 1016 (uncodified) is amended to read as
30 follows:

31 **FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE**

32 Local and Community Projects 2016 (92000369)

33 The appropriation in this section is subject to the following
34 conditions and limitations:

35 (1) Except as directed otherwise prior to the effective date of
36 this section, the department may not expend the appropriation in this
37 section unless and until the nonstate share of project costs have
38 been either expended, or firmly committed, or both, in an amount

1 sufficient to complete the project or a distinct phase of the project
2 that is useable to the public for the purpose intended by the
3 legislature. This requirement does not apply to projects where a
4 share of the appropriation is released for design costs only.

5 (2) Prior to receiving funds, project recipients must demonstrate
6 that the project site is under control for a minimum of ten years,
7 either through ownership or a long-term lease. This requirement does
8 not apply to appropriations for preconstruction activities or
9 appropriations whose sole purpose is to purchase real property that
10 does not include a construction or renovation component.

11 (3) Projects funded in this section may be required to comply
12 with Washington's high performance building standards as required by
13 chapter 39.35D RCW.

14 (4) Project funds are available on a reimbursement basis only,
15 and shall not be advanced under any circumstances.

16 (5) Projects funded in this section must be held by the recipient
17 for a minimum of ten years and used for the same purpose or purposes
18 intended by the legislature as required in RCW 43.63A.125(6).

19 (6) Projects funded in this section, including those that are
20 owned and operated by nonprofit organizations, are generally required
21 to pay state prevailing wages.

22 (7) \$2,209,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided
23 solely for the Fairchild air force base protection and community
24 empowerment project, including the purchase of twenty acres of land
25 by Spokane county or the city of Airway Heights for development of
26 affordable housing and the purchase of mobile home parks by Spokane
27 county or the city of Airway Heights in order to reduce the use of
28 the accident potential zone for residential purposes. There shall be
29 no limitations on the sequence of the purchase of mobile home parks.
30 If Spokane county or the city of Airway Heights subsequently rezones,
31 develops, and leases the mobile home park property for commercial or
32 industrial uses contrary to the allowed uses in the accident
33 potential zone, Spokane county or the city of Airway Heights must
34 repay to the state the amount spent on the purchase of mobile home
35 parks in its entirety within ten years. Mobile home parks purchased
36 under the provisions of this subsection may be sold by Spokane county
37 or the city of Airway Heights, provided that the uses of the mobile
38 home park property are not contrary to the allowed uses in the
39 accident potential zone. Any moneys from this sale must be used to
40 purchase other mobile home parks in the Fairchild air force base

1 protection and community empowerment project. The twenty acres of
2 land purchased under this subsection for development as affordable
3 housing may be sold, in whole or in part, by the recipient, provided
4 the property sold is used for affordable housing as required in the
5 Fairchild air force base protection and community empowerment
6 project. Recipients of funds provided under this subsection are not
7 required to demonstrate that the project site is under their control
8 for a minimum of ten years but they must demonstrate that the project
9 site is under their control through ownership or long-term lease.
10 Projects funded under this subsection are not required to meet the
11 provisions of RCW 43.63A.125(6) and subsection (5) of this section.

12 (8) \$850,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided
13 solely for the White River restoration project. Design solutions for
14 flooding reductions in the lower White River must include a
15 floodplain habitat design that both reduces flood risks and restores
16 salmon habitat by reconnecting the river with its floodplain and a
17 sustainable riparian corridor. Project designs and plans must also
18 identify lands for acquisition needed for floodplain reconnection
19 where pending or existing development eliminates the potential for
20 riparian and aquatic habitat restoration. The city shall work
21 cooperatively with the Muckleshoot Indian Tribe and the Puyallup
22 Tribe of Indians, and develop a plan collaboratively to achieve both
23 flood reduction and habitat restoration.

24 (9) Up to \$300,000 of the appropriation in this section for the
25 veterans helping veterans: Emergency transition shelter project may
26 be spent on preconstruction or preacquisition activities, including,
27 but not limited to, building inspections, design of necessary
28 renovations, cost estimation, and other activities necessary to
29 identify and select a facility appropriate for the program. The
30 remainder of the appropriation must be used for eventual acquisition
31 and renovations of a facility.

32 (10) \$2,500,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided
33 solely for the mercy housing and health care center at Sand Point.
34 During the 2015-2017 fiscal biennium, the center may not house any
35 community health care training organization that has been
36 investigated by and has paid settlement fees to the attorney
37 general's office for alleged medicaid fraud.

38 (11) The Lake Chelan land use plan must be developed without
39 adverse impacts on agricultural operations.

1 (12) \$1,300,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided
2 solely for phase one of the main street revitalization project in the
3 city of Mountlake Terrace.

4 (13) \$300,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided
5 solely for the city of Stanwood to acquire property for a new city
6 hall/public safety facility.

7 (14) Up to 30 percent of the funding for the Kennewick boys and
8 girls club may be used for land acquisition.
