

K-12 School Employee Salaries Assignment Categories

- “Teachers” include Elementary Teachers, Secondary Teachers, Other Teachers, Library Media Specialists, Substitute Teachers, Contractor Teachers (duty codes 31, 32, 33, 41, 52, and 63), and as of SY2015-16, Elementary Homeroom Teachers (now 31) and Elementary Specialist Teachers (34)
- “ESAs” (Education Support Associates) include Other Support Personnel, Counselors, Occupational Therapists, Social Workers, Speech-Language Pathologists and Audiologists, Psychologists, Nurses, Physical Therapists, Reading Resource Specialists, Extracurricular staff, and Contractor ESAs (duty codes 40, 42 through 51, and 64)
- “Classified” includes Aides, Crafts and Trades, Laborers, Office and Clerical, Operators, Professionals, Service Workers, Technical staff, and Director and Supervisor who are not certificated (duty codes 91 through 99)
- “Admin” includes Superintendents, Deputy and Assistant Superintendents, Other District Administrators, Elementary Principals, Elementary Vice Principals, Secondary Principals, Secondary Vice Principals, and Other School Administrators (duty codes 11 through 25)

The data include full-time and part-time staff, and staff that did not work the entire school year. The data for part-time staff have not been annualized.

For staff with multiple duty assignments, the assignment categories with the greatest two FTE values were appended. For staff with multiple district assignments, the report displays the total final salary for each district.
