EFFECT:

Appropriates \$1.4 billion in new state general obligation bonds to support the 2011 Supplemental and 2011-13 Capital Budget. Reduces 2011 Supplemental state general obligation bond appropriations by \$32.0 million. Authorizes the State Finance Committee to issue general obligation bonds to support the bond appropriations. Adds a June 30, 2013 expiration date to several bond authorizations that remain unissued.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

18 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) The legislature finds that:

1 (a) The capital budget includes appropriations for the construction
2 and repair of public schools, colleges and universities, prisons and
3 juvenile rehabilitation facilities, state office buildings, housing for
4 low-income and disabled persons, farm workers and others, parks, public
5 infrastructure, and for other capital facilities and programs;

6 (b) The size of the capital budget is determined by the available
7 bond capacity under the constitutional debt limit and by moneys
8 available from dedicated accounts, trust revenue, and other funding
9 sources;

10 (c) Approximately half of the capital budget is financed with
11 state-issued general obligation bonds, which pledge the full faith,
12 credit and taxing power of the state toward payment of debt service;
13 and

14 (d) The capital budget has limited purpose if there is no bond
15 authorization bill to finance appropriations.

16 (2) The legislature therefore intends to increase the transparency
17 and clarity of the uses and sources of the capital budget for the 2011
18 supplemental and 2011-2013 fiscal biennium by combining in one bill the
19 authorization of state general obligation bonds with the appropriations
20 that they support.

21 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** (1) A capital budget is hereby adopted and,
22 subject to the provisions set forth in this act, the several dollar
23 amounts hereinafter specified, or so much thereof as shall be
24 sufficient to accomplish the purposes designated, are hereby
25 appropriated and authorized to be incurred for capital projects during
26 the period beginning with the effective date of this act and ending
27 June 30, 2013, out of the several funds specified in this act.

28 (2) The appropriations in this act are appropriations for capital
29 purposes from proceeds of general obligation and other bonds.
30 Appropriations in this act may not necessarily represent all
31 expenditures authorized for a particular project for the 2011-2013
32 fiscal biennium. For some projects receiving appropriations in this
33 act, additional appropriations from other sources for those projects
34 may also be contained in chapter, Laws of 2011 (House Bill No.
35 1497).

36 (3) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout this act
37 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

1 (a) "Fiscal year 2012" or "FY 2012" means the period beginning July
2 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2012.

3 (b) "Fiscal year 2013" or "FY 2013" means the period beginning July
4 1, 2012, and ending June 30, 2013.

5 (c) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an
6 unappropriated status.

7 (d) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent only
8 for the specified purpose.

9 (4) Amounts appropriated for fiscal year 2012 may be expended from
10 July 1, 2011, through June 30, 2013. Amounts appropriated for fiscal
11 year 2013 may only be expended from July 1, 2012, through June 30,
12 2013.

13 (5) Unless otherwise specifically authorized in this act, any
14 portion of an amount provided solely for a specified purpose that is
15 not expended subject to the specified conditions and limitations to
16 fulfill the specified purpose shall lapse.

17 (6) The amounts shown under the headings "Prior Biennia," "Future
18 Biennia," and "Total" in this act are for informational purposes only
19 and do not constitute legislative approval of these amounts. "Prior
20 biennia" typically refers to the immediate prior biennium for
21 reappropriations, but may refer to multiple biennia in the case of
22 specific projects. A "future biennia" amount is an estimate of what
23 may be appropriated for the project or program in the 2011-2013
24 biennium and the following three biennia; an amount of zero does not
25 necessarily constitute legislative intent to not provide funding for
26 the project or program in the future.

27 (7) "Reappropriations" in this act are appropriations and, unless
28 the context clearly provides otherwise, are subject to the relevant
29 conditions and limitations applicable to appropriations.
30 Reappropriations shall be limited to the unexpended balances remaining
31 on June 30, 2011, from the 2009-2011 biennial appropriations for each
32 project.

24 for services from the division of developmental disabilities within the

32 highest need.

33 (5) \$3,000,000 of the appropriation is provided solely to build
34 low-income housing units in underserved communities and to concurrently
35 develop capacity in these same communities. Underserved communities of
36 concern are those that have high levels of poverty, specifically,

1 thirty percent of the local median income; experience chronic
2 homelessness; and lack affordable housing. Underserved communities
3 include veterans, immigrants, refugees, and those communities of color
4 disproportionately impacted by chronic homelessness and lack of
5 affordable housing. The department must collaborate with
6 representatives of underserved communities and organizations committed
7 to assistance in these efforts to prioritize and plan distribution of
8 funding.

1 (4) Project funds are available on a reimbursement basis only, and
2 shall not be advanced under any circumstances.

3 (5) Projects funded in this section must be held by the recipient
4 for a minimum of ten years and used for the same purpose or purposes
5 intended by the legislature as required in RCW 43.63A.125(6).

6 (6) Projects funded in this section, including those that are owned
7 and operated by nonprofit organizations, are generally required to pay
8 state prevailing wages.

2 major equipment or systems owned by public school districts and public
3 higher education institutions.

4 (g) "Innovative measures" means advanced or emerging technologies,
5 systems or approaches that may not yet be in common practice but
6 improve energy efficiency, accelerate deployment, or reduce energy
7 usage, and become widely commercially available in the future if proven
8 successful in demonstration programs without compromising the
9 guaranteed performance or measurable energy and operational cost
10 savings anticipated. Examples of innovative measures include, but are
11 not limited to, advanced energy and systems operations monitoring,
12 diagnostics and controls systems for buildings; novel heating, cooling,
13 ventilation and water heating systems; advanced windows and insulation
14 technologies, highly efficient lighting technologies, designs, and
15 controls; and integration of renewable energy sources into buildings,
16 and energy savings verification technologies and solutions.

28 that demonstrates energy and operational cost savings resulting from

2 **MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS**

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8001.** (1) Allotments for appropriations in this
4 act shall be provided in accordance with the capital project review
5 requirements adopted by the office of financial management and in
6 compliance with RCW 43.88.110. Projects that will be employing
7 alternative public works construction procedures under chapter 39.10
8 RCW are subject to the allotment procedures defined in this section and
9 RCW 43.88.110.

10 (2) Each project is defined as proposed in the legislative budget
11 notes or in the governor's budget document.

12 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8002.** To ensure that major construction
13 projects are carried out in accordance with legislative and executive
14 intent, appropriations in this act in excess of \$5,000,000 shall not be
15 expended or encumbered until the office of financial management has
16 reviewed and approved the agency's predesign. The predesign document
17 shall include but not be limited to program, site, and cost analysis in
18 accordance with the predesign manual adopted by the office of financial
19 management. To improve monitoring of major construction projects,
20 progress reports shall be submitted by the agency administering the
21 project to the office of financial management and to the fiscal
22 committees of the house of representatives and senate. Reports will be
23 submitted on July 1st and December 31st each year in a format to be
24 developed by the office of financial management.

25 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8003.** (1) To ensure minor works appropriations
26 are carried out in accordance with legislative intent, funds
27 appropriated in this act shall not be allotted until project lists are
28 on file at the office of financial management, the house of
29 representatives capital budget committee, and the senate ways and means
30 committee. All projects must meet the criteria included in subsection
31 (2)(a) of this section. Revisions to the lists must be filed with the
32 office of financial management, the house of representatives capital
33 budget committee, and the senate ways and means committee and include

1 an explanation of variances from the prior lists before funds may be
2 expended on the revisions.

3 (2)(a) Minor works projects are single line appropriations that
4 include multiple projects of a similar nature and that are valued
5 between \$25,000 and \$1,000,000 each, with the exception of higher
6 education minor works projects that may be valued up to \$2,000,000.
7 These projects can generally be completed within two years of the
8 appropriation with the funding provided. Agencies are prohibited from
9 including projects on their minor works lists that are a phase of a
10 larger project, and that if combined over a continuous period of time,
11 would exceed \$1,000,000, or \$2,000,000 for higher education minor works
12 projects. Improvements for accessibility in compliance with the
13 Americans with disabilities act may be included in any of the above
14 minor works categories.

15 (b) Minor works appropriations shall not be used for, among other
16 things: Studies, except for technical or engineering reviews or
17 designs that lead directly to and support a project on the same minor
18 works list; planning; design outside the scope of work on a minor works
19 list; moveable, temporary, and traditionally funded operating equipment
20 not in compliance with the equipment criteria established by the office
21 of financial management; software not dedicated to control of a
22 specialized system; moving expenses; land or facility acquisition; or
23 to supplement funding for projects with funding shortfalls unless
24 expressly authorized elsewhere in this act. The office of financial
25 management may make an exception to the limitations described in this
26 subsection (2)(b) for exigent circumstances after notifying the
27 legislative fiscal committees and waiting ten days for comments by the
28 legislature regarding the proposed exception.

29 (c) Minor works preservation projects may include program
30 improvements of no more than twenty-five percent of the individual
31 minor works preservation project cost.

32 (3) It is generally not the intent of the legislature to make
33 future appropriations for capital expenditures or for maintenance and
34 operating expenses for an acquisition project or a significant
35 expansion project that is initiated through the minor works process and
36 therefore does not receive a policy and fiscal analysis by the
37 legislature. Minor works projects are intended to be one-time
38 expenditures that do not require future state resources to complete.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8004.** (1) The office of financial management
2 may authorize a transfer of appropriation authority provided for a
3 capital project that is in excess of the amount required for the
4 completion of such project to another capital project for which the
5 appropriation is insufficient. No such transfer may be used to expand
6 the capacity of any facility beyond that intended in making the
7 appropriation. Such transfers may be effected only between capital
8 appropriations to a specific department, commission, agency, or
9 institution of higher education and only between capital projects that
10 are funded from the same fund or account. No transfers may occur
11 between projects to local government agencies except where the grants
12 are provided within a single omnibus appropriation and where such
13 transfers are specifically authorized by the implementing statutes that
14 govern the grants.

15 (2) The office of financial management may find that an amount is
16 in excess of the amount required for the completion of a project only
17 if: (a) The project as defined in the notes to the budget document is
18 substantially complete and there are funds remaining; or (b) bids have

21 completed within the biennium for less than the amount appropriated in

28 (4) The office of financial management shall report any transfer

9 (2) Provision of the full amount of required matching funds is not
10 required to permit the expenditure of capital budget appropriations for
11 phased projects if a proportional amount of the required matching funds
12 is provided for each distinct, identifiable phase of the project.

14 PROVIDED, That during the fiscal year 2011, taxes received by the state
15 under this chapter must be deposited in the general fund for general
16 purpose expenditures. Any person collecting the tax who appropriates
17 or converts the tax collected shall be guilty of a gross misdemeanor if
18 the money required to be collected is not available for payment on the

13 percent salary reduction effective July 1, 2011, through June 29, 2013,
14 for all employees of the executive, legislative, and judicial branches,
15 including those employees in the Washington management service, and
16 including employees exempt from merit system rules, except for:

17 (a) Elected officials whose salaries are set by the commission on
18 salaries for elected officials;

19 (b) Student employees at state institutions of higher education;

22 are reduced in an amount reflecting a 3.0 percent reduction in faculty

32 (g) Employees whose salary is less than \$2,500 per month; and

34 (2) For employees subject to the 3.0 percent reduction in salary
35 under subsection (1) of this section employees will receive temporary
36 salary reduction leave of up to 5.2 hours per month. The director of

1 personnel shall adopt rules governing the accrual and use of temporary
2 salary reduction leave.

3 (3) The department of retirement systems shall include any forgone
4 salary or lost work hours under subsections (1) and (3) of this section
5 in the final average compensation of employees affected for purposes of
6 calculating retirement benefits, as specified in executive request
7 legislation Z-0211.1/11.

8 (4) The appropriation from dedicated funds and accounts shall be
9 made in the amounts specified and from the dedicated funds and accounts
10 specified in office of financial management document 2011-01, which is
11 hereby incorporated by reference. The office of financial management
12 shall allocate the moneys appropriated in this section in the amounts
13 specified and to the state agencies specified in office of financial
14 management document 2011-01 and adjust appropriation schedules
15 accordingly.

16 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8018.** If any provision of this act or its
17 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
18 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
19 persons or circumstances is not affected.

20 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8019.** Section 8013 of this act expires June 30,
21 2013.

22 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8020.** Section 8014 of this act takes effect
23 June 30, 2013.

24 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8021.** This act is necessary for the immediate
25 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
26 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
27 immediately.
