#### ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL 1115

AN ACT Relating to the capital budget; making appropriations and 1 2 authorizing expenditures for capital improvements; amending RCW 3 43.160.080, 27.34.330, 28A.525.166, 28A.525.172, 28B.20.725, 28B.50.360, 4 28B.15.310, 28B.15.210, 28B.30.750, 28B.35.370, 5 43.34.080, 43.19.501, 43.155.050, 43.155.070, 43.160.080, 43.131.413, and 43.131.414; amending 2013 2nd sp.s. c 19 ss 1073, 1074, 1077, б 7 1078, 1090, 1091, 1093, 1099, 1108, 1104, 1105, 2024, 2028, 3067, 8 3058, 3101, 3190, 3212, 5007, 5020, 5015, 5025, 5055, 5108, 5110, and 7043 (uncodified); amending 2013 3rd sp.s. c 1 s 3 (uncodified); 9 reenacting and amending RCW 70.105D.070; adding new sections to 2013 10 2nd sp.s. c 19 (uncodified); creating new sections; repealing 2013 11 12 2nd sp.s. c 19 s 7013 (uncodified); providing an effective date; and 13 declaring an emergency.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

**Sec. 1.** (1) A capital budget is hereby adopted 15 NEW SECTION. 16 and, subject to the provisions set forth in this act, the several 17 dollar amounts hereinafter specified, or so much thereof as shall be 18 sufficient to accomplish the purposes designated, are hereby appropriated and authorized to be incurred for capital projects 19 during the period beginning with the effective date of this act and 20 21 ending June 30, 2017, out of the several funds specified in this act.

(2) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout this act
 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

3 (a) "Fiscal year 2016" or "FY 2016" means the period beginning
4 July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2016.

5 (b) "Fiscal year 2017" or "FY 2017" means the period beginning 6 July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017.

7 (c) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an 8 unappropriated status.

9 (d) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent 10 only for the specified purpose.

(3) Unless otherwise specifically authorized in this act, any portion of an amount provided solely for a specified purpose that is not expended subject to the specified conditions and limitations to fulfill the specified purpose shall lapse.

(4) The amounts shown under the headings "Prior Biennia," "Future 15 16 Biennia," and "Total" in this act are for informational purposes only 17 and do not constitute legislative approval of these amounts. "Prior 18 biennia" typically refers to the immediate prior biennium for 19 reappropriations, but may refer to multiple biennia in the case of specific projects. A "future biennia" amount is an estimate of what 20 may be appropriated for the project or program in the 2017-2019 21 biennium and the following three biennia; an amount of zero does not 22 necessarily constitute legislative intent to not provide funding for 23 24 the project or program in the future.

(5) "Reappropriations" in this act are appropriations and, unless the context clearly provides otherwise, are subject to the relevant conditions and limitations applicable to appropriations. Reappropriations shall be limited to the unexpended balances remaining on June 30, 2015, from the 2013-2015 biennial appropriations for each project.

30 (b) Evidence that the applicant has assessed and would meet gaps 31 in geographical access to short-term detention services under chapter 32 71.05 RCW in their region;

33 (c) A commitment by applicants to serve persons who are publicly 34 funded and persons detained under the involuntary treatment act at 35 chapter 71.05 RCW;

36 (d) A commitment by the applicant to maintain the beds or 37 facility for at least a ten-year period; (e) The date upon which structural modifications or construction
 would begin and the anticipated date of completion of the project;

3 (f) A detailed estimate of the costs associated with opening the 4 beds; and

5 (g) The applicant's commitment to work with local courts and 6 prosecutors to ensure that prosecutors and courts in the area served 7 by the hospital or facility will be available to conduct involuntary 8 commitment hearings and proceedings under chapter 71.05 RCW.

9 (2) To accommodate the emergent need for inpatient psychiatric services, the department of health and the department of commerce, in 10 collaboration with the department of social and health services shall 11 12 establish a concurrent and expedited process for the purpose of grant applicants meeting any applicable regulatory requirements necessary 13 to operate inpatient psychiatric beds, free-standing evaluation and 14 treatment facilities, enhanced services 15 facilities, triage facilities, or crisis stabilization facilities. 16

36 (2)(a) \$10,000,000 of the state taxable building construction
 37 account is provided solely to create a revolving loan fund to support

the widespread use of proven energy efficiency and renewable energy
 technologies now inhibited by lack of access to capital.

3 (b) The department shall provide grant funds to one or more 4 competitively selected nonprofit lenders that will provide matching 5 private capital and will administer the loan fund. The department 6 must select the loan fund administrator or administrators through a 7 competitive process, with scoring conducted by a group of qualified 8 experts, applying criteria specified by the department.

9 (c) The department must establish guidelines that specify 10 applicant eligibility, the screening process, and evaluation and 11 selection criteria. The guidelines must be used by the nonprofit 12 lenders.

(d) Loan applications must disclose all sources of public funds 13 14 invested in the project. The nonprofit lender must make loans available to the following types of projects that include, but are 15 16 not limited to: Residential, commercial, industrial, and agricultural 17 retrofits, residential and community-scale energy solar installations, anaerobic digesters to treat dairy and organic waste, 18 19 and combined heat and power projects using woody biomass as a fuel 20 source.

(e) State funds may not exceed fifty percent of the estimated cost of a project, and funding preference must be provided to projects that offer a higher percentage of nonstate match funds.

(f) The department must conduct due diligence activities associated with the use of public funds, including oversight of the project selection process and project monitoring.

11 (2) The legislature intends to complete the data collection, 12 input, and verification of the inventory and condition of public school facilities in order to make informed decisions about K-12 13 school facility and capacity needs to fulfill current educational 14 15 graduation requirements and class-size ratios. These decisions are best made when based on accurate data collected in a thorough and 16 17 consistent manner by professionals experienced in making such inventory and condition assessments for public institutions. 18

19 (3) The Washington State University extension energy office shall 20 conduct on-site visits to assess inventory and condition of all facilities for school districts that have no current study and survey 21 as defined in RCW 28A.525.050 on file with the superintendent of 22 23 public instruction as of July 1, 2015, or no pending study and survey to be filed with the superintendent through an outstanding study and 24 survey grant award. The data collected through on-site visits must be 25 26 input into the inventory and condition of schools system.

27 (4) The Washington State University extension energy office shall 28 input into the inventory and condition of schools system applicable data of inventory and condition of school facilities from all current 29 30 studies and surveys on file with the superintendent of public instruction as of July 1, 2015. The data must be input into the 31 system in a manner that captures older information and data first. As 32 33 studies and surveys from outstanding grant awards are filed with the 34 superintendent, the Washington State University extension energy office shall input data into the system once current study and survey 35 data has been input. Activities conducted pursuant to this subsection 36 37 must occur concurrently with activities in subsection (3) of this 38 section.

1 (5) The Washington State University extension energy office shall conduct on-site verification of data for school districts whose 2 current studies and surveys on file with the superintendent will 3 expire by June 30, 2017. Data verification must be conducted to 4 evaluate the study and survey process as a tool to collect accurate 5 6 inventory and condition of schools data upon which policymakers can make informed decisions regarding school facility and capacity needs. 7 Activities conducted pursuant to this subsection must occur 8 concurrently with activities in subsection (3) of this section and 9 10 once sufficient data has been input into the system per subsection (4) of this section to conduct on-site visits to verification. 11

12 (6) As a general condition of appropriations provided to the 13 superintendent of public instruction in this act, the superintendent 14 of public instruction and each state school district shall provide 15 requested facilities information and access to facilities in a timely 16 manner to enable the Washington State University extension energy 17 office to complete the tasks, oversight, and reporting requirements 18 assigned in this section.

19 (7) The Washington State University extension energy office shall 20 report progress of data collection, input, and verification to the 21 appropriate committees of the legislature no later than December 1, 22 2015. The Washington State University extension energy office must 23 complete all work in this section and make a final report to the 24 appropriate committees of the legislature no later than December 1, 25 2016.

The estimated debt service costs for the appropriations contained in this act are thirty-six million nine б hundred sixty-four thousand dollars for the 2015-2017 biennium, two 7 hundred thirty-one million four hundred thirty-nine thousand dollars 8 for the 2017-2019 biennium, and three hundred twenty-four million six 9 10 hundred three thousand dollars for the 2019-2021 biennium.

11 NEW SECTION. Sec. 7002. ACQUISITION OF PROPERTIES AND 12 FACILITIES THROUGH FINANCIAL CONTRACTS. (1) The following agencies may enter into financial contracts, paid from any funds of an agency, 13 14 appropriated or nonappropriated, for the purposes indicated and in 15 more than the principal amounts indicated, plus not financing 16 expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW. When 17 securing properties under this section, agencies shall use the most 18 economical financial contract option available, including long-term 19 leases, lease-purchase agreements, lease-development with option to purchase agreements or financial contracts using certificates 20 of participation. To ensure that the total cost of a project is accounted for and the most 14 15 reasonable and cost efficient design is used, agencies shall develop 16 life-cycle costs for any construction project over \$10,000,000. To ensure that major construction projects are carried out in accordance with legislative and executive 2 intent, appropriations in this act in excess of \$10,000,000 may not 3 be expended or encumbered until the office of financial management 4 has reviewed and approved the agency's predesign. The predesign 5 6 document must include, but not be limited to, program, site, and cost 7 analysis, including life-cycle cost, in accordance with the predesign manual adopted by the office of financial management. Except for major projects that customarily may take more 26 27 than two biennia to complete from predesign to the end of 28 construction, or large infrastructure grant or loan programs supporting projects that often take more than two biennia to 29 30 complete, the legislature generally does not intend to reappropriate 31 funds more than once, particularly for smaller grant programs, local/ community projects, and minor works. 32

1 (3) To the extent feasible, agencies are directed to accelerate 2 expenditure rates at their current level of permanent employees and 3 shall use contracted design and construction services wherever 4 necessary to meet the goals of this section.

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7008. (1) Any building project that receives 6 funding from the capital budget must be built to sustainable 7 standards. "Sustainable building" means a building that integrates 8 and optimizes all major high-performance building attributes, 9 including energy efficiency, durability, life-cycle performance, and 10 occupant productivity. The following design and construction 11 attributes must be integrated into the building project:

(a) Employ integrated design principles: Use a collaborative, 12 13 integrated planning and design process that initiates and maintains an integrated project team in all stages of a project's planning and 14 15 delivery. Establish performance goals for siting, energy, water, 16 materials, and indoor environmental quality along with other comprehensive design goals and ensures incorporation of these goals 17 18 throughout the design and life-cycle of the building. Considers all stages of the building's life-cycle, including deconstruction. 19

20 (b) Commissioning: Employ commissioning practices tailored to the size and complexity of the building and its system components in 21 order to verify performance of building components and systems and 22 help ensure that design requirements are met. This should include an 23 experienced commissioning provider, inclusion of commissioning 24 25 requirements in construction documents, a commissioning plan, verification of the installation and performance of systems to be 26 27 commissioned, and a commissioning report.

(c) Optimize energy performance: Establish a whole building performance target that takes into account the intended use, occupancy, operations, plug loads, other energy demands, and design to earn the ENERGY STAR targets for new construction and major renovation where applicable. For new construction target low energy use index. For major renovations, reduce the energy use by fifty percent below pre-renovations baseline.

35 (d) On-site renewable energy: Meet at least thirty percent of the 36 hot water demand through the installation of solar hot water heaters, 37 when life-cycle cost effective. Implement renewable energy generation 38 projects on agency property for agency use, when life-cycle cost 39 effective. 1 (e) Measurement and verification: Install building level 2 electricity meters in new major construction and renovation projects 3 to track and continuously optimize performance. Include equivalent 4 meters for natural gas and steam, where natural gas and steam are 5 used. Install dashboards inside buildings to display and incentivize 6 occupants on energy use.

7 (f) Benchmarking: Compare actual performance data from the first 8 year of operation with the energy design target. Verify that the 9 building performance meets or exceeds the design target. For other 10 building and space types, use an equivalent benchmarking tool for 11 laboratory buildings. Web-based data collection and dashboards must 12 also be provided.

13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7009. State agencies, including institutions 14 of higher education, shall allot and report full-time equivalent 15 staff for capital projects in a manner comparable to staff reporting 16 for operating expenditures.

17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7010. Executive Order No. 05-05, 18 archaeological and cultural resources, was issued effective November 19 10, 2005. Agencies and higher education institutions shall comply 20 with the requirements set forth in this executive order.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 7011. PUGET SOUND PROTECTION AND RESTORATION. 21 Consistent with RCW 90.71.340, when expending appropriations under 22 23 this act that contribute to Puget Sound protection and recovery, 24 agencies shall consult with the Puget Sound partnership to ensure 25 that projects and expenditures are either in, or consistent with the 2020 action agenda. These consultations shall include the exchange of 26 information on specific actions, projects, associated funding, 27 28 performance measures, and other information necessary to track project implementation and ensure alignment with the action agenda. 29 In situations where the Puget Sound partnership finds that a project 30 is not in, or is not consistent with the action agenda, Puget Sound 31 32 partnership shall document this finding and report back to the 33 governor and legislative fiscal committees.

34 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7012. FOR THE ARTS COMMISSION—ART WORK 35 ALLOWANCE. (1) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this

3 (2) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act 4 for original construction or any major renovation or remodel work 5 exceeding \$200,000 by colleges or universities is provided solely for 6 the purposes of RCW 28B.10.027.

The findings of the review 22 must be reported annually to the office of financial management and 23 the fiscal committees of the legislature by August 15th. The review 24 25 must include, but is not limited to, the following: (a) Projects 26 purchased or commissioned per biennium; (b) partner agencies; (c) 27 funding sources by fiscal year; (d) artwork costs; (e) administrative 28 costs; (f) collection care costs; and (g) project status.

The director shall consult with the 35 office of financial management prior to making such determination.

1 The Washington state historical society shall establish a competitive process to solicit proposals for and prioritize heritage 2 capital projects for potential funding in the state capital budget. 3 The society shall adopt rules governing project eligibility and 4 evaluation criteria. Application for funding of specific projects may 5 be made to the society by local governments, public development б 7 authorities, nonprofit corporations, tribal governments, and other entities, as determined by the society. The society, with the advice 8 of leaders in the heritage field, including but not limited to 9 representatives from the office of the secretary of state, the 10 eastern Washington state historical society, and the department of 11 12 archaeology and historic preservation, shall establish and submit a prioritized list of heritage capital projects to the governor and the 13 legislature in the society's biennial capital budget request. The 14 list shall include a description of each project, the amount of 15 16 recommended state funding, and documentation of nonstate funds to be 17 used for the project. The total amount of recommended state funding for projects on a biennial project list shall not exceed ten million 18 19 dollars. The prioritized list shall be developed through open and public meetings and the amount of state funding shall not exceed 20 thirty-three and thirty-three one hundredths percent of the total 21 cost of the project. The nonstate portion of the total project cost 22 may include cash, the value of real property when acquired solely for 23 the purpose of the project, and in-kind contributions. The department 24 25 shall not sign contracts or otherwise financially obligate funds 26 under this section until the legislature has approved a specific list of projects. In contracts for grants authorized under this section, 27 28 the society shall include provisions requiring that capital improvements be held by the grantee for a specified period of time 29 appropriate to the amount of the grant and that facilities be used 30 31 for the express purpose of the grant. If the grantee is found to be 32 out of compliance with provisions of the contract, the grantee shall repay to the state general fund the principal amount of the grant 33 plus interest calculated at the rate of interest on 34 state of Washington general obligation bonds issued most closely to the date 35 36 of authorization of the grant.

37 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7015. To carry out the provisions of this 38 act, the governor may assign responsibility for predesign, design, 39 construction, and other related activities to any appropriate agency.

PROVIDED, That in the event the state funding assistance percentage 14 to any school district based on the above formula is less than twenty 15 16 percent and such school district is otherwise eligible for state funding assistance under RCW 28A.525.162 through 28A.525.180, the 17 superintendent may establish for such district a state funding 18 19 assistance percentage not in excess of twenty percent of the approved 20 cost of the project, if the superintendent finds that such additional 21 assistance is necessary to provide minimum facilities for housing the 22 pupils of the district.

(3) In addition to the computed state funding assistance percentage developed in subsection (2) of this section, a school district shall be entitled to additional percentage points determined by the average percentage of growth for the past three years. One percent shall be added to the computed state funding assistance percentage for each percent of growth, with a maximum of twenty percent.

30 (4) In computing the state funding assistance percentage in 31 subsection (2) of this section and adjusting the percentage under subsection (3) of this section, students residing outside the school 32 district who are enrolled in alternative learning experience courses 33 under RCW 28A.232.010 shall be excluded from the count of total 34 pupils. In lieu of the exclusion in this subsection, a district may 35 36 submit an alternative calculation for excluding students enrolled in alternative learning experience courses. The alternative calculation 37 38 must show the student headcount use of district classroom facilities

1 on a regular basis for a reasonable duration by out-of-district alternative learning experience students subtracted by the headcount 2 3 of in-district alternative learning experience students not using district classroom facilities on a regular basis for a reasonable 4 duration. The alternative calculation must be submitted in a form 5 б approved by the office of the superintendent of public instruction. The office of the superintendent of public instruction must develop 7 rules to define "regular basis" and "reasonable duration." 8

(5) The approved cost of the project determined in the manner 9 prescribed in this section multiplied by the state funding assistance 10 11 percentage derived as provided for in this section shall be the 12 amount of state funding assistance to the district for the financing of the project: PROVIDED, That need therefor has been established to 13 satisfaction of the superintendent: PROVIDED, FURTHER, 14 the That additional state funding assistance may be allowed if it is found by 15 16 superintendent, considering policy recommendations from the the 17 school facilities citizen advisory panel that such assistance is 18 necessary in order to meet (a) a school housing emergency resulting 19 from the destruction of a school building by fire, the condemnation of a school building by properly constituted authorities, a sudden 20 21 excessive and clearly foreseeable future increase in school population, or other conditions similarly emergent in nature; or (b) 22 a special school housing burden resulting from projects of statewide 23 significance or imposed by virtue of the admission of nonresident 24 25 students into educational programs established, maintained and operated in conformity with the requirements of law; or (c) a 26 deficiency in the capital funds of the district resulting from 27 28 financing, subsequent to April 1, 1969, and without benefit of the 29 state funding assistance provided by prior state assistance programs, the construction of a needed school building project or projects 30 31 approved in conformity with the requirements of such programs, after 32 having first applied for and been denied state funding assistance because of the inadequacy of state funds available for the purpose, 33 or (d) a condition created by the fact that an excessive number of 34 students live in state owned housing, or (e) a need for the 35 construction of a school building to provide for improved school 36 district organization or racial balance, or (f) conditions similar to 37 those defined under (a), (b), (c), (d), and (e) of this subsection, 38 39 creating a like emergency.

1 (2)(a) Minor works project lists are single line appropriations that include multiple projects of a similar nature and that are 2 valued between \$25,000 and \$1,000,000 each, with the exception of 3 higher education minor works projects that may be valued up to 4 \$2,000,000. All projects must meet the criteria included in this 5 6 subsection (2)(a). These projects should be completed within two years of the appropriation with the funding provided. Agencies are 7 prohibited from including projects on their minor works lists that 8 are a phase of a larger project, and that if combined over a 9 continuous period of time, would exceed \$1,000,000, or \$2,000,000 for 10 higher education minor works projects. Improvements for accessibility 11 12 in compliance with the Americans with disabilities act may be included in any of the minor works categories. 13

14 (b) Minor works appropriations may not be used for the following: Studies, except for technical or engineering reviews or designs that 15 16 lead directly to and support a project on the same minor works list; 17 planning; design outside the scope of work on a minor works list; moveable, temporary, and traditionally funded operating equipment not 18 19 in compliance with the equipment criteria established by the office of financial management; software not dedicated to control of a 20 21 specialized system; moving expenses; land or facility acquisition; 22 rolling stock; computers; or to supplement funding for projects with funding shortfalls unless expressly authorized. The office 23 of financial management may make an exception to the 24 limitations 25 described in this subsection (2)(b) for exigent circumstances after 26 notifying the legislative fiscal committees and waiting ten days for comments by the legislature regarding the proposed exception. 27

(c) Minor works preservation projects may include program
 improvements of no more than twenty-five percent of the individual
 minor works preservation project cost.

Sec. 7038. To the extent that any appropriation 2 NEW SECTION. authorizes expenditures of state funds from the state building 3 construction account, or from any other capital project account in 4 5 the state treasury, for a capital project or program that is specified to be funded with proceeds from the sale of bonds, the 6 legislature declares that any such expenditures for that project or 7 program made prior to the issue date of the applicable bonds are 8 intended to be reimbursed from proceeds of those bonds in a maximum 9 10 amount equal to the amount of such appropriation.

11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7039. The office of financial management, in 12 accordance with RCW 28B.77.070 and 43.88D.010, shall include the 13 following in the scoring process:

(1) The office of financial management shall develop a single prioritized list that includes all projects requesting funding, with the exception of minor works and predesign requests. Predesigns must be on a separate prioritized list.

18 The office of financial management shall weight (2) the 19 reasonableness of cost criteria based on the following criteria in 20 the following order: (a) Expected maximum allowable construction costs per square foot; and (b) life-cycle cost analysis using the 21 22 office of financial management's life-cycle cost tool.

(3) Prior legislative commitment to the project funding ofpredesign or design must be included in the scoring criteria.

(4) Projects must be scored only once unless the office of financial management, or the requesting school, find that the project scope or budget has significantly changed.
