3 "NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) A capital budget is hereby adopted
4 and, subject to the provisions set forth in this act, the several
5 dollar amounts hereinafter specified, or so much thereof as shall be
6 sufficient to accomplish the purposes designated, are hereby
7 appropriated and authorized to be incurred for capital projects
8 during the period beginning with the effective date of this act and
9 ending June 30, 2019, out of the several funds specified in this act.

10 (2) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout this act
11 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

12 (a) "Fiscal year 2018" or "FY 2018" means the period beginning
13 July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2018.

14 (b) "Fiscal year 2019" or "FY 2019" means the period beginning
15 July 1, 2018, and ending June 30, 2019.

16 (c) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an
17 unappropriated status.

18 (d) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent
19 only for the specified purpose.

20 (3) Unless otherwise specifically authorized in this act, any
21 portion of an amount provided solely for a specified purpose that is
22 not expended subject to the specified conditions and limitations to
23 fulfill the specified purpose shall lapse.

24 (4) The amounts shown under the headings "Prior Biennia," "Future
25 Biennia," and "Total" in this act are for informational purposes only
26 and do not constitute legislative approval of these amounts. "Prior
27 biennia" typically refers to the immediate prior biennium for
28 reappropriations, but may refer to multiple biennia in the case of
29 specific projects. A "future biennia" amount is an estimate of what
30 may be appropriated for the project or program in the 2019-2021
31 biennium and the following three biennia; an amount of zero does not

1 necessarily constitute legislative intent to not provide funding for
2 the project or program in the future.

3 (5) "Reappropriations" in this act are appropriations and, unless
4 the context clearly provides otherwise, are subject to the relevant
5 conditions and limitations applicable to appropriations.
6 Reappropriations shall be limited to the unexpended balances
7 remaining on June 30, 2017, from previous biennial appropriations for
8 each project.

14 major building improvements, preservation, and system replacements,
15 necessary for the existing housing trust fund portfolio to maintain
16 long-term viability. The department must require that a capital needs
17 assessment is performed to estimate the cost of the preservation
18 project at contract execution. Funds may not be used to add or expand
19 the capacity of the property. To receive grants, housing projects
20 must meet the following requirements:

21 (i) The property is more than fifteen years old;

22 (ii) At least 50 percent of the housing units are occupied by
23 families and individuals at or below 30 percent area median income.

24 (iii) The improvements will result in reduction of operating or
25 utilities costs, or both; and

26 (iv) Other criteria that the department considers necessary to
27 achieve the purpose of this program.

28 (c) \$5,000,000 is provided solely for housing projects that
29 benefit people at or below 80 percent of the area median income who
30 have been displaced by a natural disaster declared by the governor,
31 including people who have been displaced within the last two biennia.

32 (d) \$1,000,000 of the Washington housing trust account—state
33 appropriation is provided solely for the department to work with the
34 communities of concern commission to focus on creating capital assets
35 that will help reduce poverty and build stronger and more sustainable
36 communities using the communities' cultural understanding and vision.
37 The funding must be used for predevelopment costs for capital
38 projects identified by the commission and for other activities to

1 assist communities in developing capacity to create community-owned
2 capital assets.

3 (e) \$10,098,000 is provided solely for the following list of
4 housing projects:

15 benefit veterans;

16 (ii) 10 percent is provided solely for housing projects that
17 benefit homeownership;

18 (iii) 5 percent is provided solely for housing projects that
19 benefit people with developmental disabilities;

20 (iv) 5 percent is provided solely for grants for high quality
21 low-income housing projects that quickly move people from
22 homelessness into secure housing and are significantly less expensive
23 to construct than traditional housing. In awarding grants, the
24 department must prioritize projects that:

25 (A) Provide permanent, high-quality housing or safe, lockable
26 temporary shelter structures that provide significantly greater
27 safety and security than tents;

28 (B) Serve chronically homeless adults or people being discharged
29 from inpatient mental health or addiction treatment;

30 (C) Offer a community setting that supports residents' transition
31 to stability and self-determination; and

32 (D) Site the housing on under-utilized public land; and

33 (v) The remaining amount is provided solely for projects that
34 serve low-income and special needs populations in need of housing,
35 including, but not limited to, homeless families with children,
36 homeless youth, farmworkers, and seniors.

37 (2) In evaluating projects in this section, the department must
38 give preference for applications based on some or all of the criteria
39 in RCW 43.185.070(5).

(3) The department must strive to allocate all of the amounts appropriated in this section within the 2017-2019 fiscal biennium in the manner prescribed in subsection (1) of this section. However, if upon review of applications the department determines there are not adequate suitable projects in a category, the department may allocate funds to projects serving other low-income and special needs populations, provided those projects are located in an area with an identified need for the type of housing proposed.

13 revolving account. The total amount transferred in a biennium from
14 the pollution liability insurance program trust account into the
15 pollution liability insurance agency underground storage tank
16 revolving account may not exceed twenty million dollars.

17 **Sec. 6026.** 2016 sp.s. c 35 s 6015 (uncodified) is amended to
18 read as follows:

19 **STATE TREASURER TRANSFER AUTHORITY**

20 State toxics control account: For transfer to the
21 environmental legacy stewardship account. \$24,000,000

22 Local toxics control account: For transfer to the
23 environmental legacy stewardship account. \$30,000,000

24 (1) As directed by the department of ecology in consultation with
25 the office of financial management, the state treasurer shall
26 transfer amounts among the state toxics control account, the local
27 toxics control account, and the environmental legacy stewardship
28 account as needed during the 2015-2017 fiscal biennium to maintain
29 positive account balances in all three accounts.

30 (2) As directed by the department of ecology in consultation with

2 **MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS**

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7001.** RCW 43.88.031 requires the disclosure
4 of the estimated debt service costs associated with new capital bond
5 appropriations. The estimated debt service costs for the
6 appropriations contained in this act are forty million nine hundred
7 ten thousand dollars for the 2017-2019 biennium, two hundred fifty-
8 two million seven hundred thirty-four thousand dollars for the
9 2019-2021 biennium, and three hundred fifty-two million seven hundred
10 thirty-four thousand dollars for the 2021-2023 biennium.

11 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7002.** ACQUISITION OF PROPERTIES AND
12 FACILITIES THROUGH FINANCIAL CONTRACTS. (1) The following agencies
13 may enter into financial contracts, paid from any funds of an agency,
14 appropriated or nonappropriated, for the purposes indicated and in
15 not more than the principal amounts indicated, plus financing
16 expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW. When
17 securing properties under this section, agencies shall use the most
18 economical financial contract option available, including long-term
19 leases, lease-purchase agreements, lease-development with option to
20 purchase agreements or financial contracts using certificates of
21 participation. Expenditures made by an agency for one of the
22 indicated purposes before the issue date of the authorized financial
23 contract and any certificates of participation therein are intended
24 to be reimbursed from proceeds of the financial contract and any
25 certificates of participation therein to the extent provided in the
26 agency's financing plan approved by the state finance committee.

27 (2) Those noninstructional facilities of higher education
28 institutions authorized in this section to enter into financial
29 contracts are not eligible for state funded maintenance and
30 operations. Instructional space that is available for regularly
31 scheduled classes for academic transfer, basic skills, and workforce
32 training programs may be eligible for state funded maintenance and
33 operations.

34 (3) Department of enterprise services: Enter into a financing
35 contract for up to \$5,323,000 plus financing expenses and required
36 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to repair the east plaza
37 garage in Olympia.

38 (4) Washington state patrol:

1 (a) Enter into a financing contract for up to \$7,450,000 plus
2 financing expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94
3 RCW to construct a burn building for live fire training.

4 (b) Enter into a financing contract for up to \$2,700,000 plus
5 financing expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94
6 RCW for furnishings and equipment at the 1063 building.

7 (5) Department of labor and industries: Enter into a financing
8 contract for up to \$12,700,000 plus financing expenses and required
9 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to modernize a lab and
10 training facility.

11 (6) Community and technical colleges:

12 (a) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Cascadia College
13 for up to \$29,500,000 plus financing expenses and required reserves
14 pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to build a parking structure.

15 (b) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Renton Community
16 College for up to \$2,000,000 plus financing expenses and required
17 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to acquire property in Renton.

18 (c) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of South Seattle
19 College for up to \$10,000,000 plus financing expenses and required
20 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to build a student wellness
21 and fitness center.

22 (d) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Shoreline
23 Community College for up to \$31,100,000 plus financing expenses and
24 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to build student
25 housing.

26 (e) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Clark College
27 for up to \$35,000,000 plus financing expenses and required reserves
28 pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to build a student recreation center.

29 (f) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Lower Columbia
30 College for up to \$3,000,000 plus financing expenses and required
31 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to renovate the main building.

32 (g) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Clover Park
33 Technical College for up to \$33,288,000 plus financing expenses and
34 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to construct a center
35 for advanced manufacturing technologies.

36 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7003.** To ensure that major construction
37 projects are carried out in accordance with legislative and executive
38 intent, appropriations in this act in excess of \$5,000,000, or
39 \$10,000,000 for higher education institutions, may not be expended or

1 encumbered until the office of financial management has reviewed and
2 approved the agency's predesign. The predesign document must include,
3 but not be limited to, program, site, and cost analysis, and an
4 analysis of the life-cycle costs of the alternatives explored, in
5 accordance with the predesign manual adopted by the office of
6 financial management. The results of life-cycle cost analysis must be
7 a primary consideration in the selection of a building design.
8 Construction may proceed only upon providing to the office of
9 financial management the life-cycle costs. To improve monitoring of
10 major construction projects, progress reports must be submitted by
11 the agency administering the project to the office of financial
12 management and to the fiscal committees of the house of
13 representatives and senate. Reports must be submitted on July 1st and
14 December 31st each year in a format to be developed by the office of
15 financial management.

16 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7004.** (1) The legislature finds that use of
17 life-cycle cost analysis will aid public entities, architects,
18 engineers, and contractors in making design and construction
19 decisions that positively impact both the initial construction cost
20 and the ongoing operating and maintenance cost of a project. To
21 ensure that the total cost of a project is accounted for and the most
22 reasonable and cost efficient design is used, agencies shall develop
23 life-cycle costs for any construction project over \$10,000,000. The
24 life-cycle costs must represent the present value sum of capital
25 costs, installation costs, operating costs, and maintenance costs
26 over the life expectancy of the project. The legislature further
27 finds the most effective approach to the life-cycle cost analysis is
28 to integrate it into the early part of the design process.

29 (2) Agencies shall develop a minimum of three project
30 alternatives for use in the life-cycle cost analysis. These
31 alternatives must be both distinctly different and viable solutions
32 to the issue being addressed. The chosen alternative must be the most
33 reasonable and cost-effective solution. A brief description of each
34 project alternative and why it was chosen must be included in the
35 life-cycle cost analysis section of the predesign.

36 (3) The office of financial management shall: (a) Make available
37 a life-cycle cost model to be used for analysis; (b) in consultation
38 with the department of enterprise services, provide assistance in
39 using the life-cycle cost model; and (c) update the life-cycle cost

1 model annually including assumptions for inflation rates, discount
2 rates, and energy rates.

3 (4) Agencies shall consider architectural and engineering firms'
4 and general contractors' experience using life-cycle costs, operating
5 costs, and energy efficiency measures when selecting an architectural
6 and engineering firm, or when selecting contractors using alternative
7 contracting methods.

8 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7005.** To improve monitoring of major
9 construction projects, progress reports must be submitted by the
10 agency administering the project to the office of financial
11 management and to the fiscal committees of the house of
12 representatives and senate. Reports must be submitted on July 1st and
13 December 31st each year in a format to be determined by the office of
14 financial management.

15 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7006.** (1) Allotments for appropriations in
16 this act shall be provided in accordance with the capital project
17 review requirements adopted by the office of financial management and
18 in compliance with RCW 43.88.110. Projects that will be employing
19 alternative public works construction procedures under chapter 39.10
20 RCW are subject to the allotment procedures defined in this section
21 and RCW 43.88.110.

22 (2) Each project is defined as proposed in the legislative budget
23 notes or in the governor's budget document.

24 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7007.** (1) The office of financial management
25 may authorize a transfer of appropriation authority provided for a
26 capital project that is in excess of the amount required for the
27 completion of such project to another capital project for which the
28 appropriation is insufficient. No such transfer may be used to expand
29 the capacity of any facility beyond that intended in making the
30 appropriation. Such transfers may be effected only between capital
31 appropriations to a specific department, commission, agency, or
32 institution of higher education and only between capital projects
33 that are funded from the same fund or account. No transfers may occur
34 between projects to local government agencies except where the grants
35 are provided within a single omnibus appropriation and where such
36 transfers are specifically authorized by the implementing statutes
37 that govern the grants.

1 (2) The office of financial management may find that an amount is
2 in excess of the amount required for the completion of a project only
3 if: (a) The project as defined in the notes to the budget document is
4 substantially complete and there are funds remaining; or (b) bids
5 have been let on a project and it appears to a substantial certainty
6 that the project as defined in the notes to the budget document can
7 be completed within the biennium for less than the amount
8 appropriated in this act.

9 (3) For the purposes of this section, the intent is that each
10 project be defined as proposed to the legislature in the governor's
11 budget document, unless it clearly appears from the legislative
12 history that the legislature intended to define the scope of a
13 project in a different way.

14 (4) A report of any transfer effected under this section, except
15 emergency projects or any transfer under \$250,000, shall be filed
16 with the legislative fiscal committees of the senate and house of
17 representatives by the office of financial management at least thirty
18 days before the date the transfer is effected. The office of
19 financial management shall report all emergency or smaller transfers
20 within thirty days from the date of transfer.

21 (5) The transfer authority granted in this section does not apply
22 to appropriations for projects for the state parks and recreation
23 commission. Appropriations for commission projects may be spent only
24 for the specified projects, and funding may not be transferred from
25 one commission project to another or from other sources to a
26 commission project.

27 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7008.** (1) It is expected that projects be
28 ready to proceed in a timely manner depending on the type or phase of
29 the project or program that is the subject of the appropriation in
30 this act. Except for major projects that customarily may take more
31 than two biennia to complete from predesign to the end of
32 construction, or large infrastructure grant or loan programs
33 supporting projects that often take more than two biennia to
34 complete, the legislature generally does not intend to reappropriate
35 funds more than once, particularly for smaller grant programs, local/
36 community projects, and minor works.

37 (2) Agencies shall expedite the expenditure of reappropriations
38 and appropriations in this act in order to: (a) Rehabilitate
39 infrastructure resources; (b) accelerate environmental rehabilitation

1 and restoration projects for the improvement of the state's natural
2 environment; (c) reduce additional costs associated with acquisition
3 and construction inflationary pressures; and (d) provide additional
4 employment opportunities associated with capital expenditures.

5 (3) To the extent feasible, agencies are directed to accelerate
6 expenditure rates at their current level of permanent employees and
7 shall use contracted design and construction services wherever
8 necessary to meet the goals of this section.

9 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7009.** (1) Any building project that receives
10 over \$10,000,000 in funding from the capital budget must be built to
11 sustainable standards. "Sustainable building" means a building that
12 integrates and optimizes all major high-performance building
13 attributes, including energy efficiency, durability, life-cycle
14 performance, and occupant productivity. The following design and
15 construction attributes must be integrated into the building project:

16 (a) Employ integrated design principles: Use a collaborative,
17 integrated planning and design process that initiates and maintains
18 an integrated project team in all stages of a project's planning and
19 delivery. Establish performance goals for siting, energy, water,
20 materials, and indoor environmental quality along with other
21 comprehensive design goals and ensures incorporation of these goals
22 throughout the design and life-cycle of the building. Considers all
23 stages of the building's life-cycle, including deconstruction.

24 (b) Commissioning: Employ commissioning practices tailored to the
25 size and complexity of the building and its system components in
26 order to verify performance of building components and systems and
27 help ensure that design requirements are met. This should include an
28 experienced commissioning provider, inclusion of commissioning
29 requirements in construction documents, a commissioning plan,
30 verification of the installation and performance of systems to be
31 commissioned, and a commissioning report.

32 (c) Optimize energy performance: Establish a whole building
33 performance target that takes into account the intended use,
34 occupancy, operations, plug loads, other energy demands, and design
35 to earn the ENERGY STAR targets for new construction and major
36 renovation where applicable. For new construction target low energy
37 use index. For major renovations, reduce the energy use by fifty
38 percent below prerenovations baseline.

1 (d) On-site renewable energy: Meet at least thirty percent of the
2 hot water demand through the installation of solar hot water heaters,
3 when life-cycle cost effective. Implement renewable energy generation
4 projects on agency property for agency use, when life-cycle cost
5 effective.

6 (e) Measurement and verification: Install building level
7 electricity meters in new major construction and renovation projects
8 to track and continuously optimize performance. Include equivalent
9 meters for natural gas and steam, where natural gas and steam are
10 used. Install dashboards inside buildings to display and incentivize
11 occupants on energy use.

12 (f) Benchmarking: Compare actual performance data from the first
13 year of operation with the energy design target. Verify that the
14 building performance meets or exceeds the design target. For other
15 building and space types, use an equivalent benchmarking tool for
16 laboratory buildings. Web-based data collection and dashboards must
17 also be provided.

18 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7010.** State agencies, including institutions
19 of higher education, shall allot and report full-time equivalent
20 staff for capital projects in a manner comparable to staff reporting
21 for operating expenditures.

22 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7011.** Executive Order No. 05-05,
23 archaeological and cultural resources, was issued effective November
24 10, 2005. Agencies shall comply with the requirements set forth in
25 this executive order.

26 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7012.** FOR THE ARTS COMMISSION—ART WORK
27 ALLOWANCE. (1) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this
28 act for original construction of school plant facilities is provided
29 solely for the purposes of RCW 28A.335.210.

30 (2) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act
31 for original construction or any major renovation or remodel work
32 exceeding \$200,000 by colleges or universities is provided solely for
33 the purposes of RCW 28B.10.027.

34 (3) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act
35 for original construction of any public building by a state agency
36 identified in RCW 43.17.020 is provided solely for the purposes of
37 RCW 43.17.200.

1 (4) At least eighty-five percent of the moneys spent by the
2 Washington state arts commission during the 2017-2019 biennium for
3 the purposes of RCW 28A.335.210, 28B.10.027, and 43.17.200 must be
4 expended solely for direct acquisition of works of art. Art
5 allocations not expended within the ensuing two biennia will lapse.
6 The commission may use up to \$150,000 of this amount to conserve or
7 maintain existing pieces in the state art collection pursuant to RCW
8 28A.335.210.

9 (5) The executive director of the arts commission shall appoint a
10 study group to review the operations of the one-half of one percent
11 for works of art purchased or commissioned as required by RCW
12 28A.335.210, 28B.10.027, and 43.17.200. The findings of the review
13 must be reported annually to the office of financial management and
14 the fiscal committees of the legislature by September 15th. The
15 review must include, but is not limited to, the following: (a)
16 Projects purchased or commissioned per biennium; (b) partner
17 agencies; (c) funding sources by fiscal year; (d) artwork costs; (e)
18 administrative costs; (f) collection care costs; and (g) project
19 status.

20 **Sec. 7013.** RCW 28B.10.027 and 2016 sp.s. c 35 s 6008 are each
21 amended to read as follows:

22 (1) All universities and colleges shall allocate as a
23 nondeductible item, out of any moneys appropriated for the original
24 construction or any major renovation or remodel work exceeding two
25 hundred thousand dollars of any building, an amount of one-half of
26 one percent of the appropriation to be expended by the Washington
27 state arts commission with the approval of the board of regents or
28 trustees for the acquisition of works of art.

29 (2) For projects funded in the 2015-2017 capital budget and the

13 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7014.** To carry out the provisions of this
14 act, the governor may assign responsibility for predesign, design,
15 construction, and other related activities to any appropriate agency.

16 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7015.** If any federal moneys appropriated by
17 this act for capital projects are not received by the state, the
18 department or agency to which the moneys were appropriated may
19 replace the federal moneys with funds available from private or local
20 sources. No replacement may occur under this section without the
21 prior approval of the director of financial management in
22 consultation with the senate ways and means committee and the house
23 of representatives capital budget committee.

24 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7016.** (1) Unless otherwise stated, for all
25 appropriations under this act that require a match of nonstate money

26 use the following strategies when providing grants to local

33 million dollars must be allocated as follows: (A) Thirty percent to
34 the habitat conservation account; (B) thirty percent to the outdoor
35 recreation account; (C) thirty percent to the riparian protection
36 account; and (D) ten percent to the farmlands preservation account.

37 (2) Beginning July 1, 2016, moneys appropriated for this chapter
38 must be allocated as follows: (a) Forty-five percent to the habitat
39 conservation account; (b) forty-five percent to the outdoor

1 recreation account; and (c) ten percent to the farm and forest
2 account. However, for the 2017-2019 biennium, moneys appropriated for
3 this chapter must be allocated as specified in section 3183 of this
4 act.

5 (3) Moneys deposited in these accounts shall be invested as
6 authorized for other state funds, and any earnings on them shall be
7 credited to the respective account.

8 (4) All moneys deposited in the habitat conservation, outdoor
9 recreation, and farm and forest accounts shall be allocated as
10 provided under RCW 79A.15.040, 79A.15.050, and 79A.15.130 as grants
11 to state or local agencies or nonprofit nature conservancies for
12 acquisition, development, and renovation within the jurisdiction of
13 those agencies, subject to legislative appropriation. The board may
14 use or permit the use of any funds appropriated for this chapter as
15 matching funds where federal, local, or other funds are made
16 available for projects within the purposes of this chapter. Moneys
17 appropriated to these accounts that are not obligated to a specific

31 conservation account, the outdoor recreation account, and the farm
32 and forest account for the purposes specified in this chapter.

33 (8) The board may retain a portion of the funds appropriated for
34 this chapter for its office for the administration of the programs
35 and purposes specified in this chapter. The portion of the funds
36 retained for administration may not exceed: (a) The actual
37 administration costs averaged over the previous five biennia as a
38 percentage of the legislature's new appropriation for this chapter;
39 or (b) the amount specified in the appropriation, if any. Each
40 biennium the percentage specified under (a) of this subsection must

1 be approved by the office of financial management and submitted along
2 with the prioritized lists of projects to be funded in RCW
3 79A.15.060, 79A.15.070, and 79A.15.130.

4 (9) Habitat and recreation land and facilities acquired or
5 developed with moneys appropriated for this chapter may not, without
6 prior approval of the board, be converted to a use other than that
7 for which funds were originally approved. The board shall adopt rules
8 and procedures governing the approval of such a conversion.

9 **Sec. 7028.** RCW 79A.15.050 and 2016 c 149 s 5 are each amended to
10 read as follows:

11 (1) Moneys appropriated prior to July 1, 2016, for this chapter
12 to the outdoor recreation account shall be distributed in the
13 following way:

14 (a) Not less than thirty percent to the state parks and
15 recreation commission for the acquisition and development of state
16 parks, with at least fifty percent of the money for acquisition
17 costs;

18 (b) Not less than thirty percent for the acquisition,
19 development, and renovation of local parks, with at least fifty
20 percent of this money for acquisition costs;

38 **Sec. 7029.** RCW 79A.15.130 and 2016 c 149 s 10 are each amended
39 to read as follows:

1 (1) The farm and forest account is established in the state
2 treasury. The board will administer the account in accordance with
3 chapter 79A.25 RCW and this chapter, and hold it separate and apart
4 from all other money, funds, and accounts of the board. Moneys
5 appropriated for this chapter to the farm and forest account must be
6 distributed for the acquisition and preservation of farmlands and

34 (ii) On-site production and support facilities such as barns,
35 irrigation systems, crop processing and storage facilities, wells,
36 housing, livestock sheds, and other farming infrastructure;

37 (iii) Suitability for producing different types or varieties of
38 crops;

39 (iv) Farm-to-market access;

40 (v) Water availability; and

1 (i) Other community values provided by the property when used as
2 agricultural land, including, but not limited to:

5 (iii) Occasional or periodic collector for storm water runoff;

6 (iv) Agricultural sector job creation;

9 (11) In allotting funds for environmental enhancement or
10 restoration projects, the board will require the projects to meet the
11 following criteria:

12 (a) Enhancement or restoration projects must further the
13 ecological functions of the farmlands;

15 replanting native vegetation, replacing culverts, clearing of

4 restoration projects, the board must require the projects to meet the
5 following criteria:

6 (a) Enhancement or restoration projects must further the
7 ecological functions of the forestlands;

8 (b) The projects, such as fencing, bridging watercourses,
9 replanting native vegetation, replacing culverts, etc., must be less
10 than fifty percent of the acquisition cost of the project including
11 any in-kind contribution by any party;

12 (c) The projects should be based on accepted methods of achieving
13 beneficial enhancement or restoration results;

14 (d) The projects should enhance the viability of the preserved
15 forestland to provide timber production while conforming to any legal
16 requirements for habitat protection.

17 (14) Before November 1st of each even-numbered year, the board
18 will recommend to the governor a prioritized list of all projects to

25 minor works may not be allotted until final project lists are
26 submitted to the office of financial management. Revisions to the

4 Local Toxics Control Account: For transfer to the

7 (1)(a) As directed by the department of ecology in consultation
8 with the office of financial management, the state treasurer shall
