PSHB 1102 (H-2522.1) - By Representatives Tharinger and DeBolt

- Authorizes new appropriations of \$4.4 billion, of which \$3.1 billion is financed with bonds in the 2019-21 fiscal biennium.
- Authorizes state agencies to enter into alternative financing contracts totaling \$200.1 million.
- Reduces appropriations by \$36.2 million and reduces reappropriations by \$12.7 million in the 2017-19 fiscal biennium.
- Reappropriates \$3.9 billion, of this \$2.5 billion in bonds, for previously authorized capital projects.

1 AN ACT Relating to the capital budget; making appropriations and
2 authorizing expenditures for capital improvements; amending RCW
3 28B.15.210, 28B.15.310, 28B.20.725, 28B.30.750, 28B.35.370,
4 28B.50.360, 28B.77.070, 43.63A.125, and 43.88D.010; amending 2018 c 2
5 ss 1010, 1019, 1013, 1014, 2019, 3024, 3093, 4002, and 5014; 2018 c
6 298 ss 1004, 1007, 1002, 1008, 2004, 2005, 2008, 2018, and 5040; and
7 2017 3rd sp.s. c 4 ss 1052, 3056, 3127, and 5058 (uncodified);
8 reenacting and amending RCW 43.155.050; creating new sections; making
9 appropriations; providing a contingent effective date; and declaring
10 an emergency.

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

12 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) A capital budget is hereby adopted
13 and, subject to the provisions set forth in this act, the several
14 dollar amounts hereinafter specified, or so much thereof as shall be
15 sufficient to accomplish the purposes designated, are hereby
16 appropriated and authorized to be incurred for capital projects
17 during the period beginning with the effective date of this act and
18 ending June 30, 2021, out of the several funds specified in this act.

19 (2) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout this act
20 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

1 (a) "Fiscal year 2020" or "FY 2020" means the period beginning
2 July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020.

3 (b) "Fiscal year 2021" or "FY 2021" means the period beginning
4 July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021.

5 (c) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an
6 unappropriated status.

7 (d) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent
8 only for the specified purpose.

9 (3) Unless otherwise specifically authorized in this act, any
10 portion of an amount provided solely for a specified purpose that is
11 not expended subject to the specified conditions and limitations to
12 fulfill the specified purpose shall lapse.

13 (4) The amounts shown under the headings "Prior Biennia," "Future
14 Biennia," and "Total" in this act are for informational purposes only
15 and do not constitute legislative approval of these amounts. "Prior
16 biennia" typically refers to the immediate prior biennium for
17 reappropriations, but may refer to multiple biennia in the case of
18 specific projects. A "future biennia" amount is an estimate of what
19 may be appropriated for the project or program in the 2021-2023
20 biennium and the following three biennia; an amount of zero does not
21 necessarily constitute legislative intent to not provide funding for
22 the project or program in the future.

23 (5) "Reappropriations" in this act are appropriations and, unless
24 the context clearly provides otherwise, are subject to the relevant
25 conditions and limitations applicable to appropriations.
26 Reappropriations shall be limited to the unexpended balances
27 remaining on June 30, 2019, from the 2017-2019 biennial
28 appropriations for each project.

20 prior to contract execution. Funds may not be used to add or expand
21 the capacity of the property.

22 (c) To allocate preservation funds, the department must review
23 applications and evaluate projects based on the following criteria:

24 (i) The age of the property, with priority given to buildings
25 that are more than fifteen years old;

26 (ii) The population served, with priority given to projects with
27 at least 50 percent of the housing units being occupied by families
28 and individuals at or below 50 percent area median income;

29 (iii) The degree to which the applicant demonstrates that the
30 improvements will result in a reduction of operating or utilities
31 costs, or both;

32 (iv) The potential for additional years added to the
33 affordability period of the property; and

34 (v) Other criteria that the department considers necessary to
35 achieve the purpose of this program.

- 15 (a) 10 percent is provided solely for housing projects that
 16 benefit veterans;
- 17 (b) 10 percent is provided solely for housing projects that
 18 benefit homeownership;
- 19 (c) 5 percent is provided solely for housing projects that
 20 benefit people with developmental disabilities; and
- 21 (d) The remaining amount is provided solely for projects that
 22 serve low-income and special needs populations in need of housing,
 23 including, but not limited to, homeless families with children,
 24 homeless youth, farmworkers, persons with behavioral health needs,
 25 including substance use disorder, and seniors.

26 (6) In evaluating projects in this section, the department must
 27 give preference for applications based on some or all of the criteria
 28 in RCW 43.185.070(5).

29 (7) The department must strive to allocate all of the amounts
 30 appropriated in this section within the 2019-2021 fiscal biennium in
 31 the manner prescribed in subsections (2) and (5) of this section.
 32 However, if upon review of applications the department determines
 33 that there are not adequate suitable projects in a category, the
 34 department may allocate funds to projects serving other low-income
 35 and special needs populations, provided those projects are located in
 36 an area with an identified need for the type of housing proposed.

Of the amounts in this subsection:

(a) \$24,370,000 is provided solely for housing projects that provide supportive housing and case-management services to persons with chronic mental illness. The department must prioritize low-income supportive housing unit proposals that provide services or include a partner community behavioral health treatment provider;

(b) \$10,000,000 is provided solely for housing preservation grants or loans to be awarded competitively. The grants may be provided for major building improvements, preservation, and system replacements, necessary for the existing housing trust fund portfolio to maintain long-term viability. 2 **MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS**

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7001.** RCW 43.88.031 requires the disclosure
4 of the estimated debt service costs associated with new capital bond
5 appropriations. The estimated debt service costs for the

31 Community College for up to \$6,500,000 plus financing expenses and
32 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to build a student
33 recreation center.

34 (e) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Wenatchee Valley
35 College for up to \$4,500,000 plus financing expenses and required
36 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW for the Wells Hall replacement
37 project.

38 (f) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Yakima Valley
39 Community College for up to \$22,700,000 plus financing expenses and

1 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to build additional
2 instructional and lab classroom space.

3 (g) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Everett
4 Community College for up to \$10,000,000 plus financing expenses and
5 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to purchase one or
6 more properties adjacent to the campus.

7 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7003.** (1) To ensure that major construction
8 projects are carried out in accordance with legislative and executive
9 intent, agencies must complete a predesign for state construction
10 projects with a total anticipated cost in excess of \$5,000,000, or
11 \$10,000,000 for higher education institutions. "Total anticipated
12 cost" means the sum of the anticipated cost of the predesign, design,
13 and construction phases of the project.

14 (2) Appropriations for design may not be expended or encumbered
15 until the office of financial management has reviewed and approved
16 the agency's predesign.

17 (3) The predesign must explore at least three project
18 alternatives. These alternatives must be both distinctly different
19 and viable solutions to the issue being addressed. The chosen
20 alternative should be the most reasonable and cost-effective
21 solution. The predesign document must include, but not be limited to,
22 program, site, and cost analysis, and an analysis of the life-cycle
23 costs of the alternatives explored, in accordance with the predesign
24 manual adopted by the office of financial management.

25 (4) The office of financial management may make an exception to
26 the predesign requirements in this section after notifying the
27 legislative fiscal committees and waiting ten days for comment by the
28 legislature regarding the proposed exception.

29 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7004.** (1) The legislature finds that use of
30 life-cycle cost analysis will aid public entities, architects,
31 engineers, and contractors in making design and construction
32 decisions that positively impact both the initial construction cost
33 and the ongoing operating and maintenance cost of a project. To
34 ensure that the total cost of a project is accounted for and the most
35 reasonable and cost efficient design is used, agencies shall develop
36 life-cycle costs for any construction project over \$10,000,000. The
37 life-cycle costs must represent the present value sum of capital
38 costs, installation costs, operating costs, and maintenance costs

1 over the life expectancy of the project. The legislature further
2 finds the most effective approach to the life-cycle cost analysis is
3 to integrate it into the early part of the design process.

4 (2) Agencies must develop a minimum of three project alternatives
5 for use in the life-cycle cost analysis. These alternatives must be
6 both distinctly different and viable solutions to the issue being
7 addressed. The chosen alternative must be the most reasonable and
8 cost-effective solution. A brief description of each project
9 alternative and why it was chosen must be included in the life-cycle
10 cost analysis section of the predesign.

11 (3) The office of financial management shall: (a) Make available
12 a life-cycle cost model to be used for analysis; (b) in consultation
13 with the department of enterprise services, provide assistance in
14 using the life-cycle cost model; and (c) update the life-cycle cost
15 model annually including assumptions for inflation rates, discount
16 rates, and energy rates.

17 (4) Agencies shall consider architectural and engineering firms'
18 and general contractors' experience using life-cycle costs, operating
19 costs, and energy efficiency measures when selecting an architectural
20 and engineering firm, or when selecting contractors using alternative
21 contracting methods.

22 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7005.** Agencies administering construction
23 projects with a total anticipated cost in excess of \$5,000,000, or
24 \$10,000,000 for higher education institutions, must submit progress
25 reports to the office of financial management and to the fiscal
26 committees of the house of representatives and senate. "Total
27 anticipated cost" means the sum of the anticipated cost of the
28 predesign, design, and construction phases of the project. Reports
29 must be submitted on July 1st and December 31st of each year in a
30 format determined by the office of financial management. After the
31 project is completed, agencies must also submit a closeout report
32 that identifies the total project cost and any unspent
33 appropriations.

34 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7006.** (1) Allotments for appropriations in
35 this act shall be provided in accordance with the capital project
36 review requirements adopted by the office of financial management and
37 in compliance with RCW 43.88.110. Projects that will be employing
38 alternative public works construction procedures under chapter 39.10

1 RCW are subject to the allotment procedures defined in this section
2 and RCW 43.88.110.

3 (2) Each project is defined as proposed in the legislative budget
4 notes or in the governor's budget document.

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7007.** (1) The office of financial management
6 may authorize a transfer of appropriation authority provided for a
7 capital project that is in excess of the amount required for the
8 completion of such project to another capital project for which the
9 appropriation is insufficient. No such transfer may be used to expand
10 the capacity of any facility beyond that intended in making the
11 appropriation. Such transfers may be effected only between capital
12 appropriations to a specific department, commission, agency, or
13 institution of higher education and only between capital projects
14 that are funded from the same fund or account. No transfers may occur
15 between projects to local government agencies except where the grants
16 are provided within a single omnibus appropriation and where such
17 transfers are specifically authorized by the implementing statutes
18 that govern the grants. However, the office of financial management
19 may transfer funds from the emergency repair pool to supplement the
20 western state hospital wards renovations for forensic services
21 project in section 2035 of this act if bids exceed the project
22 appropriation.

23 (2) The office of financial management may find that an amount is
24 in excess of the amount required for the completion of a project only
25 if: (a) The project as defined in the notes to the budget document is
26 substantially complete and there are funds remaining; or (b) bids
27 have been let on a project and it appears to a substantial certainty
28 that the project as defined in the notes to the budget document can
29 be completed within the biennium for less than the amount
30 appropriated in this act.

31 (3) For the purposes of this section, the intent is that each
32 project be defined as proposed to the legislature in the governor's
33 budget document, unless it clearly appears from the legislative
34 history that the legislature intended to define the scope of a
35 project in a different way.

36 (4) A report of any transfer effected under this section, except
37 emergency projects or any transfer under \$250,000, shall be filed
38 with the legislative fiscal committees of the senate and house of
39 representatives by the office of financial management at least thirty

1 days before the date the transfer is effected. The office of
2 financial management shall report all emergency or smaller transfers
3 within thirty days from the date of transfer. However, the office of
4 financial management may effect one or more transfers to supplement
5 the western state hospital wards renovations for forensic services
6 project in section 2035 of this act without waiting thirty days for
7 fiscal committee response.

8 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7008.** (1) It is expected that projects be
9 ready to proceed in a timely manner depending on the type or phase of
10 the project or program that is the subject of the appropriation in
11 this act. Except for major projects that customarily may take more
12 than two biennia to complete from predesign to the end of
13 construction, or large infrastructure grant or loan programs
14 supporting projects that often take more than two biennia to
15 complete, the legislature generally does not intend to reappropriate
16 funds more than once, particularly for smaller grant programs, local/
17 community projects, and minor works.

18 (2) Agencies shall expedite the expenditure of reappropriations
19 and appropriations in this act in order to: (a) Rehabilitate
20 infrastructure resources; (b) accelerate environmental rehabilitation
21 and restoration projects for the improvement of the state's natural
22 environment; (c) reduce additional costs associated with acquisition
23 and construction inflationary pressures; and (d) provide additional
24 employment opportunities associated with capital expenditures.

25 (3) To the extent feasible, agencies are directed to accelerate
26 expenditure rates at their current level of permanent employees and
27 shall use contracted design and construction services wherever
28 necessary to meet the goals of this section.

29 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7009.** (1) Any building project that receives
30 over \$10,000,000 in funding from the capital budget must be built to
31 sustainable standards. "Sustainable building" means a building that
32 integrates and optimizes all major high-performance building
33 attributes, including energy efficiency, durability, life-cycle
34 performance, and occupant productivity. The following design and
35 construction attributes must be integrated into the building project:

36 (a) Employ integrated design principles: Use a collaborative,
37 integrated planning and design process that initiates and maintains
38 an integrated project team in all stages of a project's planning and

1 delivery. Establish performance goals for siting, energy, water,
2 materials, and indoor environmental quality along with other
3 comprehensive design goals and ensures incorporation of these goals
4 throughout the design and life-cycle of the building. Consider all
5 stages of the building's life-cycle, including deconstruction.

6 (b) Commissioning: Employ commissioning practices tailored to the
7 size and complexity of the building and its system components in
8 order to verify performance of building components and systems and
9 help ensure that design requirements are met. This should include an
10 experienced commissioning provider, inclusion of commissioning
11 requirements in construction documents, a commissioning plan,
12 verification of the installation and performance of systems to be
13 commissioned, and a commissioning report.

14 (c) Optimize energy performance: Establish a whole building
15 performance target that takes into account the intended use,
16 occupancy, operations, plug loads, other energy demands, and design
17 to earn the ENERGY STAR targets for new construction and major
18 renovation where applicable. For new construction target low energy
19 use index. For major renovations, target reducing energy use by fifty
20 percent below prerenovations baseline.

21 (d) On-site renewable energy: Meet at least thirty percent of the
22 hot water demand through the installation of solar hot water heaters,
23 when life-cycle cost effective. Implement renewable energy generation
24 projects on agency property for agency use, when life-cycle cost
25 effective.

26 (e) Measurement and verification: Where appropriate, install
27 building level electricity meters in new major construction and
28 renovation projects to track and continuously optimize performance.
29 Include equivalent meters for natural gas and steam, where natural
30 gas and steam are used. Where appropriate, install dashboards inside
31 buildings to display and incentivize occupants on energy use.

32 (f) Benchmarking: Compare performance data from the first year of
33 operation with the energy design target. Verify that the building
34 performance meets or exceeds the design target. For other building
35 and space types, use an equivalent benchmarking tool.

36 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7010.** State agencies, including institutions
37 of higher education, shall allot and report full-time equivalent
38 staff for capital projects in a manner comparable to staff reporting
39 for operating expenditures.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7011.** Executive Order No. 05-05,
2 archaeological and cultural resources, was issued effective November
3 10, 2005. Agencies shall comply with the requirements set forth in
4 this executive order.

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7012.** FOR THE ARTS COMMISSION—ART WORK
6 ALLOWANCE. (1) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this
7 act for original construction of school plant facilities is provided
8 solely for the purposes of RCW 28A.335.210.

9 (2) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act
10 for original construction or any major renovation or remodel work
11 exceeding \$200,000 by colleges or universities is provided solely for
12 the purposes of RCW 28B.10.027.

13 (3) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act
14 for original construction of any public building by a state agency
15 identified in RCW 43.17.200 is provided solely for the purposes of
16 RCW 43.17.200.

17 (4) At least eighty percent of the moneys spent by the Washington
18 state arts commission during the 2019-2021 biennium for the purposes
19 of RCW 28A.335.210, 28B.10.027, and 43.17.200 must be expended solely
20 for direct acquisition of works of art. Art allocations not expended
21 within the ensuing two biennia will lapse. The commission may use up
22 to \$200,000 of this amount to conserve or maintain existing pieces in
23 the state art collection.

24 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7013.** To carry out the provisions of this
25 act, the governor may assign responsibility for predesign, design,
26 construction, and other related activities to any appropriate agency.

27 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7014.** If any federal moneys appropriated by
28 this act for capital projects are not received by the state, the
29 department or agency to which the moneys were appropriated may
30 replace the federal moneys with funds available from private or local
31 sources. No replacement may occur under this section without the
32 prior approval of the director of financial management in
33 consultation with the senate ways and means committee and the house
34 of representatives capital budget committee.

35 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7015.** (1) Unless otherwise stated, for all
36 appropriations under this act that require a match of nonstate money

1 or in-kind contributions, the following requirement, consistent with
2 RCW 43.88.150, shall apply: Expenditures of state money shall be
3 timed so that the state share of project expenditures never exceeds
4 the intended state share of total project costs.

5 (2) Provision of the full amount of required matching funds is
6 not required to permit the expenditure of capital budget
7 appropriations for phased projects if a proportional amount of the
8 required matching funds is provided for each distinct, identifiable
9 phase of the project.

10 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7016.** NONTAXABLE AND TAXABLE BOND PROCEEDS.
11 Portions of the appropriation authority granted by this act from the
12 state building construction account, or any other account receiving
13 bond proceeds, may be transferred to the state taxable building
14 construction account as deemed necessary by the state finance
15 committee to comply with the federal internal revenue service rules
16 and regulations pertaining to the use of nontaxable bond proceeds.
17 Portions of the general obligation bond proceeds authorized by
18 chapter 3, Laws of 2018, (House Bill No. 1080, the general obligation
19 bond bill) for deposit into the state taxable building construction
20 account that are in excess of amounts required to comply with the
21 federal internal revenue service rules and regulations shall be
22 deposited into the state building construction account. The state
23 treasurer shall submit written notification to the director of
24 financial management if it is determined that a shift of
25 appropriation authority between the state building construction
26 account, or any other account receiving bond proceeds, and the state
27 taxable building construction account is necessary, or that a shift
28 of appropriation authority from the state taxable building
29 construction account to the state building construction account may
30 be made.

31 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7017.** (1) Minor works project lists are
32 single line appropriations that include multiple projects of a
33 similar nature and that are valued between \$25,000 and \$1,000,000
34 each, with the exception of higher education minor works projects
35 that may be valued up to \$2,000,000. Funds appropriated in this act
36 for minor works may not be initially allotted until agencies submit
37 project lists to the office of financial management for review and
38 approval.

1 (2) Revisions to the project lists, including the addition of
2 projects and the transfer of funds between projects, are allowed but
3 must be submitted to the office of financial management, the house of
4 representatives capital budget committee, and the senate ways and
5 means committee for review and comment, and must include an
6 explanation of variances from prior lists. Any project list revisions
7 must be approved by the office of financial management before funds
8 may be expended from the minor works appropriation.

9 (3) (a) All minor works projects should be completed within two
10 years of the appropriation with the funding provided.

11 (b) Agencies are prohibited from including projects on their
12 minor works lists that are a phase of a larger project, and that if
13 combined over a continuous period of time, would exceed \$1,000,000,
14 or \$2,000,000 for higher education minor works projects.

15 (c) Minor works appropriations may not be used for the following:
16 Studies, except for technical or engineering reviews or designs that
17 lead directly to and support a project on the same minor works list;
18 planning; design outside the scope of work on a minor works list;
19 movable, temporary, and traditionally funded operating equipment not
20 in compliance with the equipment criteria established by the office
21 of financial management; software not dedicated to control of a
22 specialized system; moving expenses; land or facility acquisition;
23 rolling stock; computers; or to supplement funding for projects with
24 funding shortfalls unless expressly authorized. The office of
25 financial management may make an exception to the limitations
26 described in this subsection (3) (c) for exigent circumstances after
27 notifying the legislative fiscal committees and waiting ten days for
28 comments by the legislature regarding the proposed exception.

29 (d) Minor works preservation projects may include program
30 improvements of no more than twenty-five percent of the individual
31 minor works preservation project cost.

32 (e) Improvements for accessibility in compliance with the
33 Americans with disabilities act may be included in any of the minor
34 works categories.

35 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7018. FOR THE STATE TREASURER—TRANSFERS**

36 (1) Public Works Assistance Account: For transfer
37 to the water pollution control revolving account, up to
38 \$6,000,000 for fiscal year 2020 and up to \$6,000,000 for
39 fiscal year 2021 \$12,000,000

1 (2) Public Works Assistance Account: For transfer
2 to the drinking water assistance account, up to
3 \$5,500,000 for fiscal year 2020 and up to \$5,500,000 for
4 fiscal year 2021 \$11,000,000

5 (3) (a) Public Works Assistance Account: For transfer
6 to the statewide broadband account, \$12,500,000 for fiscal
7 year 2020 and \$12,500,000 for fiscal year 2021. \$25,000,000

8 (b) The transfer identified in this subsection is contingent upon
9 the enactment of chapter . . ., Laws of 2019 (Third Substitute House
10 Bill No. 1498) by June 30, 2019.

11 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7019. STATE TREASURER TRANSFER AUTHORITY**

12 Local Toxics Control Account: For transfer
13 to the Environmental Legacy Stewardship Account,
14 \$4,900,000 for fiscal year 2020 and \$4,900,000
15 for fiscal year 2021 \$9,800,000

16 Local Toxics Control Account: For transfer to the
17 state toxics control account, \$18,200,000 for fiscal year
18 2020 and \$18,200,000 for fiscal year 2021 \$36,400,000

19 (1) (a) As directed by the department of ecology, in consultation
20 with the office of financial management, the state treasurer shall
21 transfer amounts among the state toxics control account, the local
22 toxics control account, and the environmental legacy stewardship
23 account as needed during the 2019-2021 fiscal biennium to maintain
24 positive account balances in all three accounts.

25 (b) If, after using the interfund transfer authority granted in
26 this section, the department of ecology determines that further
27 reductions are needed to maintain positive account balances in the
28 state toxics control account, the local toxics control account, and
29 the environmental legacy stewardship account, the department is
30 authorized to delay the start of any capital projects based on acuity
31 of need, readiness to proceed, cost-efficiency, purposes of
32 increasing affordable housing, or need to ensure geographic
33 distribution. If the department uses this authority, the department
34 must submit a prioritized list of projects that may be delayed to the
35 office of financial management and the appropriate fiscal committees
36 of the legislature.

37 (2) As directed by the pollution liability insurance agency in
38 consultation with the office of financial management, the state

1 treasurer shall transfer from the pollution liability insurance
2 program trust account to the underground storage tank revolving
3 account the lesser of \$20,000,000 or the balance of the fund
4 exceeding \$7,500,000 after excluding the reserves during the
5 2019-2021 fiscal biennium.

6 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7020.** To the extent that any appropriation
7 authorizes expenditures of state funds from the state building
8 construction account, or from any other capital project account in
9 the state treasury, for a capital project or program that is
10 specified to be funded with proceeds from the sale of bonds, the
11 legislature declares that any such expenditures for that project or
12 program made prior to the issue date of the applicable bonds are
13 intended to be reimbursed from proceeds of those bonds in a maximum
14 amount equal to the amount of such appropriation.

15 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7021.** The department of enterprise services,
16 in consultation with the office of financial management, is granted
17 the authority to sell the property known as the Tacoma Rhodes complex
18 for no less than fair market value. The price must cover appraisal
19 costs, all debt service, all closing costs, and the cost of
20 outstanding liabilities necessary to keep the department whole. The
21 property consists of the Broadway building, market building, and
22 parking garage. The terms and conditions of the sale must meet the
23 business needs of the state tenants.

24 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7022.** (1) The department of natural resources
25 must conduct an asset valuation of state lands and state forestlands
26 held in trust and managed by the department. The analysis required in
27 subsections (3) and (4) of this section may be provided through
28 contracted services.

29 (2) The department must describe all trust lands, by trust,
30 including timber lands, agricultural lands, commercial lands, and
31 other lands, and identify revenues from leases or other sources for
32 those lands. The department must briefly describe the income from
33 these trust lands, and potential enhancements to income, including
34 intergenerational income, from the asset bases of these trusts.

35 (3) The analysis must estimate the current fair market value of
36 these lands for each trust beneficiary, including the separate
37 beneficiaries of state lands as defined in RCW 79.02.010, and the

1 beneficiaries of state forestlands as specified in chapter 79.22 RCW.
2 The estimation of current fair market values must specify the values
3 by the various asset classes including, but not limited to, the
4 following asset classes: Timber lands; irrigated agriculture; dryland
5 agriculture, including grazing lands; commercial real estate; mining;
6 and other income production. The analysis must also estimate the
7 value of ecosystem services and recreation benefits for asset classes
8 that produce these benefits. The legislature encourages the
9 department and its contractors to develop methods and tools to allow
10 tracking of the estimated fair market values over time.

11 (4) For each of the different asset classes and for each of the
12 various trusts, the analysis must calculate the average annual gross
13 and net income as a percentage of estimated current asset value.

14 (5) The department must provide a progress report to the
15 legislature by December 1, 2019, which may include any initial
16 recommendations. The final report must be submitted by June 30, 2020,
17 and must include options to:

18 (a) Improve the net rates of return on different classes of
19 assets;

20 (b) Increase the reliability of, and enhance if possible, revenue
21 for trust beneficiaries; and

22 (c) Present and explain factors that either (i) define, (ii)
23 constrict, or (iii) define and constrict the department's management
24 practices and revenue production. The factors to be considered
25 include, but are not limited to, statutory, constitutional,
26 operational, and social factors.

27 **Sec. 7023.** RCW 28B.15.210 and 2017 3rd sp.s. c 1 s 952 are each
28 amended to read as follows:

29 Within thirty-five days from the date of collection thereof, all
30 building fees at the University of Washington, including building
31 fees to be charged students registering in the schools of medicine
32 and dentistry, shall be paid into the state treasury and credited as
33 follows:

34 One-half or such larger portion as may be necessary to prevent a
35 default in the payments required to be made out of the bond

16 routine facility maintenance, utility costs, and facility condition
17 assessments.

18 **Sec. 7024.** RCW 28B.15.310 and 2017 3rd sp.s. c 1 s 953 are each
19 amended to read as follows:

20 Within thirty-five days from the date of collection thereof, all
21 building fees shall be paid and credited as follows: To the
22 Washington State University bond retirement fund, one-half or such
23 larger portion as may be necessary to prevent a default in the
24 payments required to be made out of such bond retirement fund; and
25 the remainder thereof to the Washington State University building

27 The sum so credited to the Washington State University building
28 account shall be expended by the board of regents for buildings,

39 projects should represent a complete renovation of a total facility

1 or an isolated wing of a facility. A reasonable renovation project
2 should cost between sixty to eighty percent of current replacement
3 value and restore the renovated area to at least twenty-five years of
4 useful life. New space may be programmed for the same or a different
5 use than the space being renovated and may include additions to
6 improve access and enhance the relationship of program or support
7 space;

8 (d) Major stand-alone campus infrastructure projects;

9 (e) Projects that promote economic growth and innovation through
10 expanded research activity. The acquisition and installation of
11 specialized equipment is authorized under this category; and

12 (f) Other project categories as determined by the office of
13 financial management in consultation with the legislative fiscal
14 committees.

15 (2) The office of financial management, in consultation with the
16 legislative fiscal committees, shall establish a scoring system and
17 process for each four-year project category that is based on the
18 framework used in the community and technical college system of
19 prioritization. Staff from the state board for community and
20 technical colleges and the four-year institutions shall provide
21 technical assistance on the development of a scoring system and

7 the project proposal and scoring process as part of its biennial

14 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7033.** UNIVERSITY OF WASHINGTON TRANSFER TO
15 SEATTLE. By June 30, 2020, the University of Washington must transfer
16 the deed of the property and general purpose facility, King County
17 parcel number 308500-2100, located at 2901 27th Avenue South,
18 Seattle, to the city of Seattle for the purposes of developing
19 affordable housing for households at or below eighty percent of the
20 area median income and providing health care services in partnership
21 with a public hospital system. The University of Washington may
22 reserve easements in the transferred property at no cost to the
23 university. The transfer shall count toward the obligation to build
24 affordable housing under the university's institutional campus master
25 plan agreement. Liabilities existing on the property at the time of
26 transfer will transfer with the property. When the deed is
27 transferred to the city, any existing leases of the property expire.
28 The transfer must be at no cost to the city.

29 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7034.** DSHS FIRCREST LAND TRANSFER TO
30 SHORELINE. The department of social and health services must transfer
31 the deed for up to five acres of land on the southeast corner of the
32 Fircrest School campus to the city of Shoreline for development of a
33 public park. The transfer must include the land between NE 150th
34 Street North and the northern border of the land currently leased for
35 use as a public park. The transfer must be at no cost to the city.
36 The department may reserve easements in the transferred property at
37 no cost to the department. When the deed is transferred to the city,
38 the current lease expires.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7035.** DSHS TRANSFER TO DNR. To compensate the
2 charitable, educational, penal, and reformatory institutions trust
3 for the property transferred out of trust status in section 3312 of
4 this act, the department of social and health services must designate
5 and transfer by deed property owned by the department on the Fircrest
6 School campus to the department of natural resources for the purposes
7 of implementing section 3312 of this act. The department of social
8 and health services must consult with the department of natural
9 resources to ensure that the type and value of the property
10 transferred is in the best interest of the trust.

11 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7036.** PROPERTY TRANSFER SEATTLE CENTRAL. If
12 House Bill No. 1918 (community preservation auth.) is enacted by June
13 30, 2019, the Seattle Central College must transfer the deed of the
14 property located at 2120 South Jackson Street, Seattle, Washington
15 98144, to the community preservation and development authority
16 established in the bill. The transfer must be made by no later than
17 June 30, 2021, once the community preservation and development
18 authority has selected board members. The transfer must be at no cost
19 to the community preservation and development authority.

20 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7037.** Section 7032 of this act takes effect
21 only if chapter . . ., Laws of 2019 (Third Substitute House Bill No.
22 1498) is enacted by June 30, 2019.

23 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7038.** If any provision of this act or its
24 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
25 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
26 persons or circumstances is not affected.

27 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7039.** This act is necessary for the immediate
28 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of
29 the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes
30 effect immediately.
