SHB 1080 (H-1437.2) – By Representatives Tharinger and Steele

- Authorizes new appropriations totaling \$5.68 billion in the 2021-23 fiscal biennium:
 - \$3.55 billion in bond proceeds;
 - \$589 million in federal stimulus funds;
 - \$273 million in Model Toxic Control Accounts;
 - \$236 million in alternative financed contracts; and
 - \$1.04 billion in other dedicated accounts.
- Reappropriates \$4.48 billion, of which \$2.88 billion is financed with bonds, for previously authorized capital projects.
- Reduces appropriations and reappropriations by \$44.4 million in the 2019-21 fiscal biennium .

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

15 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) A capital budget is hereby adopted
16 and, subject to the provisions set forth in this act, the several
17 dollar amounts hereinafter specified, or so much thereof as shall be
18 sufficient to accomplish the purposes designated, are hereby
19 appropriated and authorized to be incurred for capital projects
20 during the period beginning with the effective date of this act and
21 ending June 30, 2023, out of the several funds specified in this act.

1 (2) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout this act
2 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

3 (a) "Fiscal year 2022" or "FY 2022" means the period beginning
4 July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022.

5 (b) "Fiscal year 2023" or "FY 2023" means the period beginning
6 July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023.

7 (c) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an
8 unappropriated status.

9 (d) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent
10 only for the specified purpose.

11 (3) Unless otherwise specifically authorized in this act, any
12 portion of an amount provided solely for a specified purpose that is
13 not expended subject to the specified conditions and limitations to
14 fulfill the specified purpose shall lapse.

15 (4) The amounts shown under the headings "Prior Biennia," "Future
16 Biennia," and "Total" in this act are for informational purposes only
17 and do not constitute legislative approval of these amounts. "Prior
18 biennia" typically refers to the immediate prior biennium for
19 reappropriations, but may refer to multiple biennia in the case of
20 specific projects. A "future biennia" amount is an estimate of what
21 may be appropriated for the project or program in the 2023-2025
22 biennium and the following three biennia; an amount of zero does not
23 necessarily constitute legislative intent to not provide funding for
24 the project or program in the future.

25 (5) "Reappropriations" in this act are appropriations and, unless
26 the context clearly provides otherwise, are subject to the relevant
27 conditions and limitations applicable to appropriations.
28 Reappropriations shall be limited to the unexpended balances
29 remaining on June 30, 2021, from the 2019-2021 biennial
30 appropriations for each project.

24 aerospace, maritime, information and communications technology
25 (particularly data center infrastructure, artificial intelligence and
26 machine learning), grid modernization, advanced materials, and
27 decarbonizing the built environment.

28 (3) Subject to the availability of funds, the department must
29 reconvene an advisory committee to support involvement of a broad
30 range of stakeholders in the design and implementation of programs
31 implemented under this section to encourage collaboration, leverage

12 costs of the alternatives explored, in accordance with the predesign
13 manual adopted by the office of financial management.

14 (4) The office of financial management may make an exception to
15 the predesign requirements in this section after notifying the
16 legislative fiscal committees and waiting ten days for comment by the
17 legislature regarding the proposed exception.

18 (5) If House Bill No. 1023 (predesign) is enacted by June 30,
19 2021 this section is null and void.

20 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7004.** (1) To ensure that major construction
21 projects are carried out in accordance with legislative and executive
22 intent, agencies must complete a predesign for state construction
23 projects with a total anticipated cost in excess of \$10,000,000. For
24 purposes of this section, "total anticipated cost" means the sum of
25 the anticipated cost of the predesign, design, and construction
26 phases of the project.

27 (2) Appropriations for design may not be expended or encumbered
28 until the office of financial management has reviewed and approved
29 the agency's predesign.

30 (3) The predesign must explore at least three project
31 alternatives. These alternatives must be both distinctly different
32 and viable solutions to the issue being addressed. The chosen
33 alternative should be the most reasonable and cost-effective
34 solution. The predesign document must include, but not be limited to,
35 program, site, and cost analysis, and an analysis of the life-cycle
36 costs of the alternatives explored, in accordance with the predesign
37 manual adopted by the office of financial management.

38 (4) For projects exceeding the \$10,000,000 predesign threshold
39 established in this section, the office of financial management may

1 make an exception to some or all of the predesign requirements in
2 this section. The office of financial management shall report any
3 exception to the fiscal committees of the legislature:

4 (a) A description of the major capital project for which the
5 predesign waiver is made;

6 (b) An explanation of the reason for the waiver; and

7 (c) A rough order of magnitude cost estimate for the project's
8 design and construction.

9 (5) In deliberations related to submitting an exception under
10 this section, the office of financial management shall consider the
11 following factors:

12 (a) Whether there is any determination to be made regarding the
13 site of the project;

14 (b) Whether there is any determination to be made regarding
15 whether the project will involve renovation, new construction, or
16 both;

17 (c) Whether, within six years of submitting the request for
18 funding, the agency has completed, or initiated the construction of,
19 a substantially similar project;

20 (d) Whether there is any anticipated change to the project's
21 program or the services to be delivered at the facility;

22 (e) Whether the requesting agency indicates that the project may
23 not require some or all of the predesign requirements in this section
24 due to a lack of complexity; and

25 (f) Whether any other factors related to project complexity or
26 risk, as determined by the office of financial management, could
27 reduce the need for, or scope of, a predesign.

28 (6) If under this section, some or all predesign requirements are
29 waived, the office of financial management may instead propose a
30 professional project cost estimate instead of a request for predesign
31 funding.

32 (7) If House Bill No. 1023 (predesign) is not enacted by June 30,
33 2021, this section is null and void.

34 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7005.** (1) The legislature finds that use of
35 life-cycle cost analysis will aid public entities, architects,
36 engineers, and contractors in making design and construction
37 decisions that positively impact both the initial construction cost
38 and the ongoing operating and maintenance cost of a project. To
39 ensure that the total cost of a project is accounted for and the most

1 reasonable and cost efficient design is used, agencies shall develop
2 life-cycle costs for any construction project over \$10,000,000. The
3 life-cycle costs must represent the present value sum of capital
4 costs, installation costs, operating costs, and maintenance costs
5 over the life expectancy of the project. The legislature further
6 finds the most effective approach to the life-cycle cost analysis is
7 to integrate it into the early part of the design process.

8 (2) Agencies must develop a minimum of three project alternatives
9 for use in the life-cycle cost analysis. These alternatives must be
10 both distinctly different and viable solutions to the issue being
11 addressed. Agencies must choose the most reasonable and cost-
12 effective solution, as supported by the life-cycle cost analysis. A
13 brief description of each project alternative and why it was chosen
14 must be included in the life-cycle cost analysis section of the
15 predesign.

16 (3) The office of financial management shall: (a) Make available
17 a life-cycle cost model to be used for analysis; (b) in consultation
18 with the department of enterprise services, provide assistance in
19 using the life-cycle cost model; and (c) update the life-cycle cost
20 model annually including assumptions for inflation rates, discount
21 rates, and energy rates.

22 (4) Agencies shall consider architectural and engineering firms'
23 and general contractors' experience using life-cycle costs, operating
24 costs, and energy efficiency measures when selecting an architectural
25 and engineering firm, or when selecting contractors using alternative
26 contracting methods.

27 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7006.** Agencies administering construction
28 projects with a total anticipated cost in excess of \$5,000,000, or
29 \$10,000,000 for higher education institutions, must submit progress
30 reports to the office of financial management and to the fiscal
31 committees of the house of representatives and senate. "Total
32 anticipated cost" means the sum of the anticipated cost of the
33 predesign, design, and construction phases of the project. Reports
34 must be submitted on July 1st and December 31st of each year in a
35 format determined by the office of financial management. After the
36 project is completed, agencies must also submit a closeout report
37 that identifies the total project cost and any unspent
38 appropriations.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7007.** (1) Allotments for appropriations in
2 this act shall be provided in accordance with the capital project
3 review requirements adopted by the office of financial management and
4 in compliance with RCW 43.88.110. Projects that will be employing
5 alternative public works construction procedures under chapter 39.10
6 RCW are subject to the allotment procedures defined in this section
7 and RCW 43.88.110.

8 (2) Each project is defined as proposed in the legislative budget
9 notes or in the governor's budget document.

10 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7008.** (1) The office of financial management
11 may authorize a transfer of appropriation authority provided for a
12 capital project that is in excess of the amount required for the
13 completion of such project to another capital project for which the
14 appropriation is insufficient. No such transfer may be used to expand
15 the capacity of any facility beyond that intended in making the
16 appropriation. Such transfers may be effected only between capital
17 appropriations to a specific department, commission, agency, or
18 institution of higher education and only between capital projects
19 that are funded from the same fund or account. No transfers may occur
20 between projects to local government agencies except where the grants
21 are provided within a single omnibus appropriation and where such
22 transfers are specifically authorized by the implementing statutes
23 that govern the grants.

24 (2) The office of financial management may find that an amount is
25 in excess of the amount required for the completion of a project only
26 if: (a) The project as defined in the notes to the budget document is
27 substantially complete and there are funds remaining; or (b) bids
28 have been let on a project and it appears to a substantial certainty
29 that the project as defined in the notes to the budget document can
30 be completed within the biennium for less than the amount
31 appropriated in this act.

32 (3) For the purposes of this section, the intent is that each
33 project be defined as proposed to the legislature in the governor's
34 budget document, unless it clearly appears from the legislative
35 history that the legislature intended to define the scope of a
36 project in a different way.

37 (4) A report of any transfer effected under this section, except
38 emergency projects or any transfer under \$250,000, shall be filed
39 with the fiscal committees of the legislature by the office of

1 financial management at least thirty days before the date the
2 transfer is effected. The office of financial management shall report
3 all emergency or smaller transfers within thirty days from the date
4 of transfer.

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7009.** (1) It is expected that projects be
6 ready to proceed in a timely manner depending on the type or phase of
7 the project or program that is the subject of the appropriation in
8 this act. Except for major projects that customarily may take more
9 than two biennia to complete from predesign to the end of
10 construction, or large infrastructure grant or loan programs
11 supporting projects that often take more than two biennia to
12 complete, the legislature generally does not intend to reappropriate
13 funds more than once, particularly for smaller grant programs, local/
14 community projects, and minor works.

15 (2) Agencies shall expedite the expenditure of reappropriations
16 and appropriations in this act in order to: (a) Rehabilitate
17 infrastructure resources; (b) accelerate environmental rehabilitation
18 and restoration projects for the improvement of the state's natural
19 environment; (c) reduce additional costs associated with acquisition
20 and construction inflationary pressures; and (d) provide additional
21 employment opportunities associated with capital expenditures.

22 (3) To the extent feasible, agencies are directed to accelerate
23 expenditure rates at their current level of permanent employees and
24 shall use contracted design and construction services wherever
25 necessary to meet the goals of this section.

26 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7010.** (1) Any building project that receives
27 over \$10,000,000 in funding from the capital budget must be built to
28 sustainable standards. "Sustainable building" means a building that
29 integrates and optimizes all major high-performance building
30 attributes, including energy efficiency, durability, life-cycle
31 performance, and occupant productivity, and minimizes greenhouse gas
32 emissions. The following design and construction attributes must be
33 integrated into the building project:

34 (a) Employ integrated design principles: Use a collaborative,
35 integrated planning and design process that initiates and maintains
36 an integrated project team in all stages of a project's planning and
37 delivery. Establish performance goals for siting, energy, water,
38 materials, and indoor environmental quality along with other

1 comprehensive design goals and ensures incorporation of these goals
2 throughout the design and life-cycle of the building. Consider all
3 stages of the building's life-cycle, including deconstruction.

4 (b) Commissioning: Employ commissioning practices tailored to the
5 size and complexity of the building and its system components in
6 order to verify performance of building components and systems and
7 help ensure that design requirements are met. This should include an
8 experienced commissioning provider, inclusion of commissioning
9 requirements in construction documents, a commissioning plan,
10 verification of the installation and performance of systems to be
11 commissioned, and a commissioning report.

12 (c) Optimize energy performance: Establish a whole building
13 performance target that takes into account the intended use,
14 occupancy, operations, plug loads, other energy demands, and design
15 to earn the ENERGY STAR targets for new construction and major
16 renovation where applicable. For new construction target low energy
17 use index. For major renovations, target reducing energy use by 50
18 percent below prerenovations baseline.

19 (d) On-site renewable energy: Implement renewable energy
20 generation projects on agency property for agency use, when life-
21 cycle cost effective.

22 (e) High-efficiency electric equipment: Use only high-efficiency
23 electric equipment for water and space heating needs not met through
24 on-site renewable energy, when life-cycle cost effective.

25 (f) Measurement and verification: For buildings over 50,000
26 square feet, install building level electricity meters in new major
27 construction and renovation projects to track and continuously
28 optimize performance. Include equivalent meters for natural gas and
29 steam, where natural gas and steam are used. Where appropriate,
30 install dashboards inside buildings to display and incentivize
31 occupants on energy use.

32 (g) Benchmarking: Compare performance data from the first year of
33 operation with the energy design target. Verify that the building
34 performance meets or exceeds the design target. For other building
35 and space types, use an equivalent benchmarking tool.

36 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7011.** State agencies, including institutions
37 of higher education, shall allot and report full-time equivalent
38 staff for capital projects in a manner comparable to staff reporting
39 for operating expenditures.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7012.** HIGHER EDUCATION CAPITAL PROJECT
2 SCORING PROCESS FOR FOUR-YEAR INSTITUTIONS. It is the intent of the
3 legislature that in budget development preparations for the 2023-2025
4 fiscal biennium, the office of financial management, the council of
5 presidents, and four-year higher education institutions return to the
6 objective analysis and scoring process for four-year institutions'
7 capital projects, as prescribed under RCW 28.77.070 and 43.88D.010,
8 in order to produce a single, prioritized capital project list for
9 all four-year higher education institutions.

10 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7013.** Executive Order No. 05-05,
11 archaeological and cultural resources, was issued effective November
12 10, 2005. Agencies shall comply with the requirements set forth in
13 this executive order and must consult with the department of
14 archaeology and historic preservation and affected tribes on the
15 potential effects of projects on cultural resources and historic
16 properties proposed in state-funded construction or acquisition
17 projects, including grant or pass-through funding that culminates in
18 construction or land acquisitions. Consultation with the department
19 of archaeology and historic preservation and affected tribes must be
20 initiated early in the project planning process, prior to
21 construction or taking title.

22 **Sec. 7014.** RCW 43.19.501 and 2020 c 356 s 7005 are each amended
23 to read as follows:

24 The Thurston county capital facilities account is created in the
25 state treasury. The account is subject to the appropriation and
26 allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW. Moneys in the account
27 may be expended for capital projects in facilities owned and managed
28 by the department in Thurston county.

29 During the 2019-2021 and 2021-2023 fiscal (~~(biennium))~~ biennia,
30 the Thurston county capital facilities account may be appropriated
31 for costs associated with staffing to support capital budget and
32 project activities and lease and facility oversight activities.

33 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7015.** FOR THE ARTS COMMISSION—ART WORK
34 ALLOWANCE. (1) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this
35 act for original construction of school plant facilities is provided
36 solely for the purposes of RCW 28A.335.210.

1 (2) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act
2 for original construction or any major renovation or remodel work
3 exceeding \$200,000 by colleges or universities is provided solely for
4 the purposes of RCW 28B.10.027.

5 (3) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act
6 for original construction of any public building by a state agency
7 identified in RCW 43.17.200 is provided solely for the purposes of
8 RCW 43.17.200.

9 (4) At least 80 percent of the moneys spent by the Washington
10 state arts commission during the 2021-2023 biennium for the purposes
11 of RCW 28A.335.210, 28B.10.027, and 43.17.200 must be expended solely
12 for direct acquisition of works of art. Except for art allocations
13 made under K-3 class size reduction grants under section 5029 of this
14 act, art allocations not expended within the ensuing two biennia will
15 lapse. The commission may use up to \$200,000 of this amount to
16 conserve or maintain existing pieces in the state art collection.

17 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7016.** To carry out the provisions of this
18 act, the governor may assign responsibility for predesign, design,
19 construction, and other related activities to any appropriate agency.

20 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7017.** If any federal moneys appropriated by
21 this act for capital projects are not received by the state, the
22 department or agency to which the moneys were appropriated may
23 replace the federal moneys with funds available from private or local
24 sources. No replacement may occur under this section without the
25 prior approval of the director of financial management in
26 consultation with the senate ways and means committee and the house
27 of representatives capital budget committee.

28 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7018.** (1) Unless otherwise stated, for all
29 appropriations under this act that require a match of nonstate money
30 or in-kind contributions, the following requirement, consistent with
31 RCW 43.88.150, shall apply: Expenditures of state money shall be
32 timed so that the state share of project expenditures never exceeds
33 the intended state share of total project costs.

34 (2) Provision of the full amount of required matching funds is
35 not required to permit the expenditure of capital budget
36 appropriations for phased projects if a proportional amount of the

1 required matching funds is provided for each distinct, identifiable
2 phase of the project.

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7019.** NONTAXABLE AND TAXABLE BOND PROCEEDS.
4 Portions of the appropriation authority granted by this act from the
5 state building construction account, or any other account receiving
6 bond proceeds, may be transferred to the state taxable building
7 construction account as deemed necessary by the state finance
8 committee to comply with the federal internal revenue service rules
9 and regulations pertaining to the use of nontaxable bond proceeds.
10 Portions of the general obligation bond proceeds authorized by
11 chapter . . . (Substitute House Bill No. 1081), Laws of 2021, (State
12 General Bonds and General Accounts) for deposit into the state
13 taxable building construction account that are in excess of amounts
14 required to comply with the federal internal revenue service rules
15 and regulations shall be deposited into the state building
16 construction account. The state treasurer shall submit written
17 notification to the director of financial management if it is
18 determined that a shift of appropriation authority between the state
19 building construction account, or any other account receiving bond
20 proceeds, and the state taxable building construction account is
21 necessary, or that a shift of appropriation authority from the state
22 taxable building construction account to the state building
23 construction account may be made.

24 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7020.** (1) Minor works project lists are
25 single line appropriations that include multiple projects of a
26 similar nature and that are valued between \$25,000 and \$1,000,000
27 each, with the exception of higher education minor works projects
28 that may be valued up to \$2,000,000. Funds appropriated in this act
29 for minor works may not be initially allotted until agencies submit
30 project lists to the office of financial management for review and
31 approval.

32 (2) Revisions to the project lists, including the addition of
33 projects and the transfer of funds between projects, are allowed but
34 must be submitted to the office of financial management, the house of
35 representatives capital budget committee, and the senate ways and
36 means committee for review and comment, and must include an
37 explanation of variances from prior approved lists. Any project list

1 revisions must be approved by the office of financial management
2 before funds may be expended from the minor works appropriation.

3 (3) (a) All minor works projects should be completed within two
4 years of the appropriation with the funding provided.

5 (b) Agencies are prohibited from including projects on their
6 minor works lists that are a phase of a larger project, and that if
7 combined over a continuous period of time, would exceed \$1,000,000,
8 or \$2,000,000 for higher education minor works projects.

9 (c) Minor works appropriations may not be used for the following:
10 Studies, except for technical or engineering reviews or designs that
11 lead directly to and support a project on the same minor works list;
12 planning; design outside the scope of work on a minor works list;
13 movable, temporary, and traditionally funded operating equipment not
14 in compliance with the equipment criteria established by the office
15 of financial management; software not dedicated to control of a
16 specialized system; moving expenses; land or facility acquisition;
17 rolling stock; computers; or to supplement funding for projects with
18 funding shortfalls unless expressly authorized. The office of
19 financial management may make an exception to the limitations
20 described in this subsection (3) (c) for exigent circumstances after
21 notifying the legislative fiscal committees and waiting ten days for
22 comments by the legislature regarding the proposed exception.

23 (d) Minor works preservation projects may include program
24 improvements of no more than 25 percent of the individual minor works
25 preservation project cost.

26 (e) Improvements for accessibility in compliance with the
27 Americans with disabilities act may be included in any of the minor
28 works categories.

29 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7021. FOR THE STATE TREASURER—TRANSFERS**

30 (1) Public Works Assistance Account: For transfer
31 to the drinking water assistance account, up to
32 \$5,500,000 for fiscal year 2022 and up to \$5,500,000 for
33 fiscal year 2023 \$11,000,000

34 (2) Public Works Assistance Account: For
35 transfer to the water pollution control revolving
36 account, up to \$7,500,000 for fiscal year 2022 and
37 up to \$7,500,000 for fiscal year 2023. \$15,000,000

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7022.** To the extent that any appropriation
2 authorizes expenditures of state funds from the state building
3 construction account, or from any other capital project account in
4 the state treasury, for a capital project or program that is
5 specified to be funded with proceeds from the sale of bonds, the
6 legislature declares that any such expenditures for that project or
7 program made prior to the issue date of the applicable bonds are
8 intended to be reimbursed from proceeds of those bonds in a maximum
9 amount equal to the amount of such appropriation.

10 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7023.** In order to accelerate the reduction of
11 embodied carbon and improve the environmental performance of
12 construction materials, agencies shall, whenever possible, review and
13 consider embodied carbon reported in environmental product
14 declarations when evaluating proposed structural materials for
15 construction projects.

16 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7024.** The joint legislative task force
17 created in 2018 c 298 s 7011 (uncodified) is hereby reauthorized
18 through June 30, 2023, subject to the requirements that studies and
19 selection of scientists or organizations to implement the studies
20 must be made by a 60 percent majority of the members of the task
21 force and that if a member has not been designated for a position set
22 forth in section 7011(2), chapter 298, Laws of 2018 (uncodified),
23 that position may not be counted for purposes of determining a
24 quorum.

25 **Sec. 7025.** RCW 90.94.090 and 2019 c 413 s 7035 are each
26 reenacted and amended to read as follows:

27 (1) A joint legislative task force on water resource mitigation
28 is established to review the treatment of surface water and
29 groundwater appropriations as they relate to instream flows and fish
30 habitat, to develop and recommend a mitigation sequencing process and
31 scoring system to address such appropriations, and to review the
32 Washington supreme court decision in *Foster v. Department of Ecology*,
33 184 Wn.2d 465, 362 P.3d 959 (2015).

34 (2) The task force must consist of the following members:

35 (a) Two members from each of the two largest caucuses of the
36 senate, appointed by the president of the senate;

1 (b) Two members from each of the two largest caucuses of the
2 house of representatives, appointed by the speaker of the house of
3 representatives;

4 (c) A representative from the department, appointed by the
5 director of the department;

6 (d) A representative from the department of fish and wildlife,
7 appointed by the director of the department of fish and wildlife;

8 (e) A representative from the department of agriculture,
9 appointed by the director of the department of agriculture;

10 (f) One representative from each of the following groups,
11 appointed by the consensus of the cochairs of the task force:

12 (i) An organization representing the farming industry in
13 Washington;

14 (ii) An organization representing Washington cities;

15 (iii) Two representatives from an environmental advocacy
16 organization or organizations;

17 (iv) An organization representing municipal water purveyors;

18 (v) An organization representing business interests;

19 (vi) Representatives of two federally recognized Indian tribes,
20 one invited by recommendation of the Northwest Indian fisheries
21 commission, and one invited by recommendation of the Columbia river
22 intertribal fish commission.

23 (3) If a member has not been designated for a position set forth
24 in subsection (2) of this section, that position may not be counted
25 for purposes of determining a quorum.

26 (4) One cochair of the task force must be a member of the
27 majority caucus of one chamber of the legislature, and one cochair
28 must be a member of the minority caucus of the other chamber of the
29 legislature, as those caucuses existed as of January 19, 2018.

30 (5) The first meeting of the task force must occur by June 30,
31 2018.

32 (6) Staff support for the task force must be provided by the
33 office of program research and senate committee services. The
34 department and the department of fish and wildlife shall cooperate
35 with the task force and provide information as the cochairs
36 reasonably request.

37 (7) Within existing appropriations, the expenses of the
38 operations of the task force, including the expenses associated with
39 the task force's meetings, must be paid jointly and in equal amounts
40 by the senate and the house of representatives. Task force

1 expenditures are subject to approval by the house executive rules
2 committee and the senate facility and operations committee.
3 Legislative members of the task force are reimbursed for travel
4 expenses in accordance with RCW 44.04.120. Nonlegislative members are
5 not entitled to be reimbursed for travel expenses if they are elected
6 officials or are participating on behalf of an employer, governmental
7 entity, or other organization. Any reimbursement for other
8 nonlegislative members is subject to chapter 43.03 RCW.

9 (8) (a) By November 15, 2019, and November 15, 2022, the joint
10 legislative task force must make recommendations to the legislature
11 in compliance with RCW 43.01.036. (~~The task force may update its
12 November 15, 2019, recommendations by November 15, 2020, if a
13 majority of the members of the task force determine that such an
14 update is appropriate based on additional information developed as a
15 result of the pilot projects established under subsection (9) of this
16 section.~~)

17 (b) Recommendations of the joint legislative task force must be
18 made by a sixty percent majority of the appointed members of the task
19 force. The representatives of the departments of fish and wildlife,
20 ecology, and agriculture are not eligible to vote on the
21 recommendations. Minority recommendations that achieve the support of
22 at least five of the appointed voting members of the task force may
23 also be submitted to the legislature.

24 (9) The department shall issue permit decisions for up to five
25 water resource mitigation pilot projects. It is the intent of the
26 legislature to use the pilot projects to inform the legislative task
27 force process while also enabling the processing of water right
28 applications that address water supply needs. The department is
29 authorized to issue permits in reliance upon water resource
30 mitigation of impacts to instream flows and closed surface water
31 bodies under the following mitigation sequence:

32 (a) Avoiding impacts by: (i) Complying with mitigation required
33 by adopted rules that set forth minimum flows, levels, or closures;
34 or (ii) making the water diversion or withdrawal subject to the

2 detrimental impacts to fish and related aquatic resources; or

3 (c) Where avoidance and minimization are not reasonably
4 attainable, compensating for impacts by providing net ecological
5 benefits to fish and related aquatic resources in the water resource
6 inventory area through in-kind or out-of-kind mitigation or a
7 combination thereof, that improves the function and productivity of
8 affected fish populations and related aquatic habitat. Out-of-kind
9 mitigation may include instream or out-of-stream measures that
10 improve or enhance existing water quality, riparian habitat, or other
11 instream functions and values for which minimum instream flows or
12 closures were established in that watershed.

13 (10) The department must monitor the implementation of the pilot
14 projects, including all mitigation associated with each pilot

9 federal funding for an airport.

10 (c) (i) If the board chooses to require a local match, the board
11 must develop guidelines for local participation and allowable match
12 and activities.

13 (ii) An application must:

14 (A) Be supported by the port district, city, or county in which
15 the project is located; or

16 (B) Clearly identify the source of funds intended to repay the
17 loan.

18 (5) The public use general aviation airport loan program, when
19 authorized by the community aviation revitalization board, is subject
20 to the following conditions:

21 (a) The moneys in the public use general aviation airport loan
22 revolving account created in section 7034 of this act must be used
23 only to fulfill commitments arising from loans authorized in this
24 section. The total outstanding amount that the board must dispense at
25 any time pursuant to this section must not exceed the moneys
26 available from the account.

27 (b) On contracts made for public use general aviation airport
28 loans, the board must determine the interest rate that loans must
29 bear. The interest rate must not exceed the amount needed to cover
30 the administrative expenses of the board and the loan program. The
31 board may provide reasonable terms and conditions for the repayment
32 of loans, with the repayment of a loan to begin no later than three
33 years after the award date of the loan. The loans must not exceed 20
34 years in duration.

35 (c) The repayment of any loan made from the public use general
36 aviation airport loan revolving account under the contracts for
37 aviation loans must be paid into the public use general aviation
38 airport loan revolving account.

1 (6) All receipts from moneys collected under this section must be
2 deposited into the public use general aviation airport loan revolving
3 account.

4 **Sec. 7036.** RCW 43.155.150 and 2017 3rd sp.s. c 10 s 11 are each
5 amended to read as follows:

6 (1) An interagency, multijurisdictional system improvement team
7 must identify, implement, and report on system improvements that
8 achieve the designated outcomes, including:

9 (a) Projects that maximize value, minimize overall costs and
10 disturbance to the community, and ensure long-term durability and
11 resilience;

12 (b) Projects that are designed to meet the unique needs of each
13 community, rather than the needs of particular funding programs;

14 (c) Project designs that maximize long-term value by fully
15 considering and responding to anticipated long-term environmental,
16 technological, economic and population changes;

17 (d) The flexibility to innovate, including utilizing natural
18 systems, addressing multiple regulatory drivers, and forming regional
19 partnerships;

20 (e) The ability to plan and collaborate across programs and
21 jurisdictions so that different investments are packaged to be
22 complementary, timely, and responsive to economic and community
23 opportunities;

24 (f) The needed capacity for communities, appropriate to their
25 unique financial, planning, and management capacities, so they can
26 design, finance, and build projects that best meet their long-term
27 needs and minimize costs;

28 (g) Optimal use and leveraging of federal and private
29 infrastructure dollars; and

30 (h) Mechanisms to ensure periodic, system-wide review and ongoing
31 achievement of the designated outcomes.

32 (2) The system improvement team must consist of representatives
33 of state infrastructure programs that provide funding for drinking
34 water, wastewater, ~~((and))~~ stormwater, and broadband programs,
35 including but not limited to representatives from the public works
36 board, department of ecology, department of health, and the
37 department of commerce. The system improvement team may invite
38 representatives of other infrastructure programs, such as
39 transportation ~~((and))~~, energy, and broadband, as needed in order to

1 achieve efficiency, minimize costs, and maximize value across
2 infrastructure programs. The system improvement team shall also
3 consist of representatives of users of those programs,
4 representatives of infrastructure project builders, and other parties
5 the system improvement team determines would contribute to achieving
6 the desired outcomes, including but not limited to representatives
7 from a state association of cities, a state association of counties,
8 a state association of public utility districts, a state association
9 of water and sewer districts, a state association of general
10 contractors, and a state organization representing building trades.
11 The public works board, a representative from the department of
12 ecology, department of health, and department of commerce shall
13 facilitate the work of the system improvement team.

14 (3) The system improvement team must focus on achieving the
15 designated outcomes within existing program structures and
16 authorities. The system improvement team shall use lean practices to
17 achieve the designated outcomes.

18 (4) The system improvement team shall provide briefings as
19 requested to the public works board on the current state of
20 infrastructure programs to build an understanding of the
21 infrastructure investment program landscape and the interplay of its
22 component parts.

23 (5) If the system improvement team encounters statutory or
24 regulatory barriers to system improvements, the system improvement
25 team must inform the public works board and consult on possible
26 solutions. When achieving the designated outcomes would be best
27 served through changes in program structures or authorities, the
28 system improvement team must report those findings to the public
29 works board.

30 (6) By September 1, 2022, in compliance with RCW 43.01.036, the
31 system improvement team must submit a report to the appropriate
32 committees of the legislature that includes the following:

33 (a) A list of all projects funded by members of the system
34 improvement team;

35 (b) A description of the coordination the system improvement team
36 has completed with other grant programs and funds leveraged; and

37 (c) A description of regional planning that has occurred.

38 (7) This section expires June 30, ((2021)) 2023.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7037.** The department of natural resources, in
2 coordination with the department of social and health services, may
3 enter into long-term, revenue-generating opportunities for under used
4 portions of the Fircrest Residential Habilitation Center bounded by
5 15th Ave NE and NE 150th Street to benefit the charitable,
6 educational, penal, and reformatory institutions account. Long-term,
7 revenue generating opportunities may include, but are not limited to,
8 land leases, land sales, and land swaps. It is the intent of the
9 legislature that any revenue to the account obtained from these
10 opportunities be appropriated to the department of social and health
11 services for community services benefiting those with developmental
12 disabilities. The department of social and health services and the
13 department of natural resources must amend their lease if necessary
14 to conform with this section.

15 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7038.** The coronavirus capital projects
16 account is created in the state treasury. All receipts from the
17 federal coronavirus capital projects fund moneys under P.L. 117-2,
18 Sec. 604, must be deposited into the account. Moneys in the account
19 may be spent only after appropriation. Expenditures from the account
20 may be used only for capital projects directly enabling work,
21 education and health monitoring, including remote options, in
22 response to the public health emergency with respect to the
23 coronavirus disease.

24 **Sec. 7039.** RCW 39.35D.030 and 2011 c 99 s 1 are each amended to
25 read as follows:

26 (1) All major facility projects of public agencies receiving any
27 funding in a state capital budget, or projects financed through a
28 financing contract as defined in RCW 39.94.020, must be designed,
29 constructed, and certified to at least the LEED silver standard. This
30 subsection applies to major facility projects that have not entered
31 the design phase prior to July 24, 2005, and to the extent
32 appropriate LEED silver standards exist for that type of building or
33 facility.

34 (2) All major facility projects of any entity other than a public
35 agency or public school district receiving any funding in a state
36 capital budget must be designed, constructed, and certified to at
37 least the LEED silver standard. This subsection applies to major
38 facility projects that have not entered the grant application process

1 prior to July 24, 2005, and to the extent appropriate LEED silver
2 standards exist for that type of building or facility.

3 (3) (a) Public agencies, under this section, shall monitor and
4 document ongoing operating savings resulting from major facility
5 projects designed, constructed, and certified as required under this
6 section.

7 (b) Public agencies, under this section, shall report annually to
8 the department on major facility projects and operating savings.

9 (4) The department shall consolidate the reports required in
10 subsection (3) of this section into one report and report to the
11 governor and legislature by September 1st of each even-numbered year
12 beginning in 2006 and ending in 2016. In its report, the department
13 shall also report on the implementation of this chapter, including
14 reasons why the LEED standard was not used as required by RCW
15 39.35D.020(5)(b). The department shall make recommendations regarding
16 the ongoing implementation of this chapter, including a discussion of
17 incentives and disincentives related to implementing this chapter.

18 (5) For the purposes of determining compliance with the
19 requirement for a project to be designed, constructed, and certified
20 to at least the LEED silver standard, the department must credit one
21 additional point for a project that uses wood products with a
22 credible third-party sustainable forest certification or from forests
23 regulated under chapter 76.09 RCW, the Washington forest practices
24 act. For projects that qualify for this additional point, and for
25 which an additional point would have resulted in formal certification
26 under the LEED silver standard, the project must be deemed to meet
27 the standard under this section.

28 (6) During the 2021-2023 fiscal biennium, an alternative high-
29 performance building certification, as determined by the legislature,
30 may be used instead of the LEED silver building design, construction,
31 and certification standard required by this section.

32 **Sec. 7040.** RCW 43.63A.125 and 2019 c 413 s 7030 are each amended
33 to read as follows:

34 (1) The department shall establish the building communities fund
35 program. Under the program, capital and technical assistance grants
36 may be made to nonprofit organizations for acquiring, constructing,
37 or rehabilitating facilities used for the delivery of nonresidential
38 community services, including social service centers and multipurpose
39 community centers, including those serving a distinct or ethnic

1 population. Such facilities must be located in a distressed community
2 or serve a substantial number of low-income or disadvantaged persons.

3 (2) The department shall establish a competitive process to
4 solicit, evaluate, and rank applications for the building communities
5 fund program as follows:

6 (a) The department shall conduct a statewide solicitation of
7 project applications from nonprofit organizations.

8 (b) The department shall evaluate and rank applications in
9 consultation with a citizen advisory committee using objective
10 criteria. To be considered qualified, applicants must demonstrate
11 that the proposed project:

12 (i) Will increase the range, efficiency, or quality of the
13 services provided to citizens;

14 (ii) Will be located in a distressed community or will serve a
15 substantial number of low-income or disadvantaged persons;

16 (iii) Will offer three or more distinct activities that meet a
17 single community service objective or offer a diverse set of
18 activities that meet multiple community service objectives, including
19 but not limited to: Providing social services; expanding employment
20 opportunities for or increasing the employability of community
21 residents; or offering educational or recreational opportunities
22 separate from the public school system or private schools, as long as
23 recreation is not the sole purpose of the facility;

24 (iv) Reflects a long-term vision for the development of the
25 community, shared by residents, businesses, leaders, and partners;

26 (v) Requires state funding to accomplish a discrete, usable phase
27 of the project;

28 (vi) Is ready to proceed and will make timely use of the funds;

29 (vii) Is sponsored by one or more entities that have the
30 organizational and financial capacity to fulfill the terms of the
31 grant agreement and to maintain the project into the future;

32 (viii) Fills an unmet need for community services;

33 (ix) Will achieve its stated objectives; and

34 (x) Is a community priority as shown through tangible commitments
35 of existing or future assets made to the project by community
36 residents, leaders, businesses, and government partners.

37 (c) (i) The evaluation and ranking process shall also include an
38 examination of existing assets that applicants may apply to projects.
39 Grant assistance under this section shall not exceed (~~twenty-five~~)

1 25 percent of the total cost of the project, except(~~(, under)~~) as
2 provided in (c)(ii) and (iii) of this subsection (2).

3 (ii) For project lists submitted during the 2021-2023 fiscal
4 biennium, grant assistance under this section may not exceed:

5 (A) One hundred percent of the total cost for projects up to
6 \$100,000;

7 (B) Seventy-five percent of the total cost for projects that
8 exceed \$100,000, up to \$250,000;

9 (C) Fifty percent of the total cost for projects that exceed
10 \$250,000, up to \$500,000.

11 (iii) Under exceptional circumstances, the department may reduce
12 the amount of nonstate match required. However, during the 2019-2021
13 biennium, the legislature may waive the match required for the
14 projects specified in section 1009, chapter 413, Laws of 2019. No
15 more than (~~ten~~) 10 percent of the total granted amount may be
16 awarded to qualified eligible projects that meet the definition of
17 exceptional circumstances defined in this subsection. For project
18 lists submitted during the 2021-2023 fiscal biennium, there is no
19 limit to the total granted amount awarded to qualified eligible
20 projects that meet the definition of exceptional circumstances
21 defined in this subsection. For purposes of this subsection,
22 exceptional circumstances include but are not limited to: Natural
23 disasters affecting projects; emergencies beyond an applicant's
24 control, such as a fire or an unanticipated loss of a lease where
25 services are currently provided; or a delay that could result in a
26 threat to public health or safety. The nonstate portion of the total
27 project cost may include cash, the value of real property when
28 acquired solely for the purpose of the project, and in-kind
29 contributions.

30 (d) The department may not set a monetary limit to funding
31 requests.

32 (3) The department shall submit biennially to the governor and
33 the legislature in the department's capital budget request a ranked
34 list of the qualified eligible projects for which applications were
35 received. The list must include a description of each project, its
36 total cost, and the amount of state funding requested. The
37 appropriate fiscal committees of the legislature shall use this list
38 to determine building communities fund projects that may receive
39 funding in the capital budget. The total amount of state capital
40 funding available for all projects on the biennial list shall be

1 determined by the capital budget beginning with the 2009-2011
2 biennium and thereafter. In addition, (~~if cash funds have been~~
3 ~~appropriated,~~) up to (~~three million dollars~~) \$3,000,000 may be
4 used for technical assistance grants. The department shall not sign
5 contracts or otherwise financially obligate funds under this section
6 until the legislature has approved a specific list of projects.

7 (4) In addition to the list of ranked qualified eligible
8 projects, the department shall submit to the appropriate fiscal
9 committees of the legislature a summary report that describes the
10 solicitation and evaluation processes, including but not limited to
11 the number of applications received, the total amount of funding
12 requested, issues encountered, if any, and any recommendations for
13 process improvements.

14 (5) After the legislature has approved a specific list of
15 projects in law, the department shall develop and manage appropriate
16 contracts with the selected applicants; monitor project expenditures
17 and grantee performance; report project and contract information; and
18 exercise due diligence and other contract management responsibilities
19 as required.

20 (6) In contracts for grants authorized under this section the
21 department shall include provisions which require that capital
22 improvements shall be held by the grantee for a specified period of
23 time appropriate to the amount of the grant and that facilities shall
24 be used for the express purpose of the grant. If the grantee is found
25 to be out of compliance with provisions of the contract, the grantee
26 shall repay to the state general fund the principal amount of the
27 grant plus interest calculated at the rate of interest on state of
28 Washington general obligation bonds issued most closely to the date
29 of authorization of the grant.

30 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7041.** If any provision of this act or its
31 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
32 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
33 persons or circumstances is not affected.

34 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7042.** This act is necessary for the immediate
35 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of
36 the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes
37 effect immediately.
