PSHB 1080 (H-1340.1) - By Representatives Tharinger and Steele

- Authorizes new appropriations totaling \$5.68 billion in the 2021-23 fiscal biennium:
 - \$3.55 billion in bond proceeds;
 - o \$589 million in federal stimulus funds;
 - o \$273 million in Model Toxic Control Accounts:
 - o \$236 million in alternative financed contracts; and
 - \$1.04 billion in other dedicated accounts.
- Reappropriates \$4.48 billion, of which \$2.88 billion is financed with bonds, for previously authorized capital projects.
- Reduces appropriations and reappropriations by \$35.2 million in the 2019-21 fiscal biennium.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

15 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. (1) A capital budget is hereby adopted 16 and, subject to the provisions set forth in this act, the several 17 dollar amounts hereinafter specified, or so much thereof as shall be accomplish the purposes 18 sufficient to are designated, hereby 19 appropriated and authorized to be incurred for capital projects 20 during the period beginning with the effective date of this act and 21 ending June 30, 2023, out of the several funds specified in this act. (2) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout this act
 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

3 (a) "Fiscal year 2022" or "FY 2022" means the period beginning
4 July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022.

5 (b) "Fiscal year 2023" or "FY 2023" means the period beginning 6 July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023.

7 (c) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an 8 unappropriated status.

9 (d) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent 10 only for the specified purpose.

(3) Unless otherwise specifically authorized in this act, any portion of an amount provided solely for a specified purpose that is not expended subject to the specified conditions and limitations to fulfill the specified purpose shall lapse.

(4) The amounts shown under the headings "Prior Biennia," "Future 15 16 Biennia," and "Total" in this act are for informational purposes only 17 and do not constitute legislative approval of these amounts. "Prior biennia" typically refers to the immediate prior biennium for 18 19 reappropriations, but may refer to multiple biennia in the case of specific projects. A "future biennia" amount is an estimate of what 20 21 may be appropriated for the project or program in the 2023-2025 biennium and the following three biennia; an amount of zero does not 22 23 necessarily constitute legislative intent to not provide funding for the project or program in the future. 24

(5) "Reappropriations" in this act are appropriations and, unless the context clearly provides otherwise, are subject to the relevant conditions and limitations applicable to appropriations. Reappropriations shall be limited to the unexpended balances remaining on June 30, 2021, from the 2019-2021 biennial appropriations for each project.

This methodology must be linked to the caseload forecast produced by the caseload forecast council and must include 2 estimates of the number of slots needed at each school district. This 3 methodology must inform any early learning facilities needs 4 assessment conducted by the department of commerce and the department 5 6 of children, youth, and families. This methodology must be included 7 as part of the budget submittal documentation required by RCW 43.88.030. 8

9 (6) When prioritizing areas with the highest unmet need for early 10 childhood education and assistance program slots, the committee of 11 early learning experts convened by the department of commerce 12 pursuant to RCW 43.31.581 must first consider those areas at risk of 13 not meeting the entitlement in accordance with RCW 43.216.556.

14 (7) The department of commerce must track the number of slots 15 being renovated separately from the number of slots being constructed 16 and, within these categories, must track the number of slots 17 separately by program for the working connections child care program 18 and the early childhood education and assistance program.

(8) When prioritizing applications for projects, pursuant to subsection (4) of this section, within the boundaries of a regional transit authority in a county that has received distributions or appropriations under RCW 43.79.520, the department must give priority to applications for which at least ten percent of the total project cost is supported by those distributions or appropriations.

25 (9) The department, in consultation with the office of the superintendent of public instruction and the department of children, 26 youth, and families must identify buildings in the inventory and 27 28 condition of schools database that are no longer included in the inventory of K-12 instructional space for purposes of calculating 29 school construction assistance pursuant to chapter 28A.515 RCW, but 30 31 that could be repurposed as early learning facilities and made 32 available to eligible organizations. This requirement does not apply to projects where a share of the appropriation is for design costs only.

(2) Prior to receiving funds, project recipients must demonstrate that the project site is under control for a minimum of ten years, either through ownership or a long-term lease. Sec. 7001. RCW 43.88.031 requires the disclosure 3 NEW SECTION. of the estimated debt service costs associated with new capital bond 4 5 appropriations. The estimated debt service costs for the appropriations contained in this act are \$45,671,549 6 for the 7 2021-2023 biennium, \$301,777,267 for the 2023-2025 biennium, and \$427,425,658 for the 2025-2027 biennium. 8

7002. 9 <u>NEW</u> SECTION. Sec. ACOUISITION OF PROPERTIES AND FACILITIES THROUGH FINANCIAL CONTRACTS. (1) The following agencies 10 may enter into financial contracts, paid from any funds of an agency, 11 12 appropriated or nonappropriated, for the purposes indicated and in not more than the principal amounts indicated, plus financing 13 14 expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW. When 15 securing properties under this section, agencies shall use the most 16 economical financial contract option available, including long-term 17 leases, lease-purchase agreements, lease-development with option to 18 purchase agreements or financial contracts using certificates of 19 participation. For purposes of this section, "total anticipated cost" means the sum of the anticipated cost of the predesign, design, and construction phases of the project.

(2) Appropriations for design may not be expended or encumbered
 until the office of financial management has reviewed and approved

7 (c) A rough order of magnitude cost estimate for the project's8 design and construction.

9 (5) In deliberations related to submitting an exception under 10 this section, the office of financial management shall consider the 11 following factors:

12 (a) Whether there is any determination to be made regarding the13 site of the project;

14 (b) Whether there is any determination to be made regarding 15 whether the project will involve renovation, new construction, or 16 both;

(c) Whether, within six years of submitting the request for funding, the agency has completed, or initiated the construction of, a substantially similar project;

20 (d) Whether there is any anticipated change to the project's 21 program or the services to be delivered at the facility;

(e) Whether the requesting agency indicates that the project may not require some or all of the predesign requirements in this section due to a lack of complexity; and

(f) Whether any other factors related to project complexity or risk, as determined by the office of financial management, could reduce the need for, or scope of, a predesign.

(6) If under this section, some or all predesign requirements are waived, the office of financial management may instead propose a professional project cost estimate instead of a request for predesign funding.

32 (7) If House Bill No. 1023 (predesign) is not enacted by June 30,33 2021, this section is null and void.

34 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7005. (1) The legislature finds that use of 35 life-cycle cost analysis will aid public entities, architects, 36 engineers, and contractors in making design and construction 37 decisions that positively impact both the initial construction cost 38 and the ongoing operating and maintenance cost of a project. To 39 ensure that the total cost of a project is accounted for and the most 340 H-1340.1/21 reasonable and cost efficient design is used, agencies shall develop life-cycle costs for any construction project over \$10,000,000. The life-cycle costs must represent the present value sum of capital costs, installation costs, operating costs, and maintenance costs over the life expectancy of the project. The legislature further finds the most effective approach to the life-cycle cost analysis is to integrate it into the early part of the design process.

(2) Agencies must develop a minimum of three project alternatives 8 for use in the life-cycle cost analysis. A brief description of each project alternative and why it was chosen 13 14 must be included in the life-cycle cost analysis section of the 15 predesign.

16 (3) The office of financial management shall: (a) Make available 17 a life-cycle cost model to be used for analysis; (b) in consultation 18 with the department of enterprise services, provide assistance in 19 using the life-cycle cost model; and (c) update the life-cycle cost 20 model annually including assumptions for inflation rates, discount 21 rates, and energy rates.

(4) Agencies shall consider architectural and engineering firms' and general contractors' experience using life-cycle costs, operating costs, and energy efficiency measures when selecting an architectural and engineering firm, or when selecting contractors using alternative contracting methods.

27 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7006. Agencies administering construction projects with a total anticipated cost in excess of \$5,000,000, or 28 \$10,000,000 for higher education institutions, must submit progress 29 30 reports to the office of financial management and to the fiscal 31 committees of the house of representatives and senate. "Total anticipated cost" means the sum of the anticipated cost of the 32 predesign, design, and construction phases of the project. Reports 33 must be submitted on July 1st and December 31st of each year in a 34 format determined by the office of financial management. After the 35 project is completed, agencies must also submit a closeout report 36 37 that identifies the total project cost and any unspent 38 appropriations.

10 NEW SECTION. Sec. 7008. (1) The office of financial management may authorize a transfer of appropriation authority provided for a 11 capital project that is in excess of the amount required for the 12 completion of such project to another capital project for which the 13 appropriation is insufficient. No such transfer may be used to expand 14 15 the capacity of any facility beyond that intended in making the 16 appropriation. Such transfers may be effected only between capital appropriations to a specific department, commission, 17 agency, or institution of higher education and only between capital projects 18 that are funded from the same fund or account. No transfers may occur 19 20 between projects to local government agencies except where the grants 21 are provided within a single omnibus appropriation and where such 22 transfers are specifically authorized by the implementing statutes 23 that govern the grants.

32 (3) For the purposes of this section, the intent is that each 33 project be defined as proposed to the legislature in the governor's 34 budget document, unless it clearly appears from the legislative 35 history that the legislature intended to define the scope of a 36 project in a different way.

37 (4) A report of any transfer effected under this section, except
 38 emergency projects or any transfer under \$250,000, shall be filed
 39 with the fiscal committees of the legislature by the office of

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7009. (1) It is expected that projects be ready to proceed in a timely manner depending on the type or phase of 6 the project or program that is the subject of the appropriation in 7 this act. Except for major projects that customarily may take more 8 than two biennia to complete from predesign to the 9 end of 10 construction, or large infrastructure grant or loan programs supporting projects that often take more than two biennia to 11 complete, the legislature generally does not intend to reappropriate 12 funds more than once, particularly for smaller grant programs, local/ 13 community projects, and minor works. 14

(3) To the extent feasible, agencies are directed to accelerate expenditure rates at their current level of permanent employees and shall use contracted design and construction services wherever necessary to meet the goals of this section.

26 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7010. (1) Any building project that receives over \$10,000,000 in funding from the capital budget must be built to 27 sustainable standards. "Sustainable building" means a building that 28 29 integrates and optimizes all major high-performance building attributes, including energy efficiency, durability, life-cycle 30 performance, and occupant productivity, and minimizes greenhouse gas 31 emissions. The following design and construction attributes must be 32 integrated into the building project: 33

(a) Employ integrated design principles: Use a collaborative,
 integrated planning and design process that initiates and maintains
 an integrated project team in all stages of a project's planning and
 delivery. Establish performance goals for siting, energy, water,
 materials, and indoor environmental quality along with other
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1 comprehensive design goals and ensures incorporation of these goals 2 throughout the design and life-cycle of the building. Consider all 3 stages of the building's life-cycle, including deconstruction.

(b) Commissioning: Employ commissioning practices tailored to the 4 size and complexity of the building and its system components in 5 6 order to verify performance of building components and systems and help ensure that design requirements are met. This should include an 7 experienced commissioning provider, inclusion of commissioning 8 requirements in construction documents, a commissioning 9 plan, verification of the installation and performance of systems to be 10 11 commissioned, and a commissioning report.

12 (c) Optimize energy performance: Establish a whole building 13 performance target that takes into account the intended use, 14 occupancy, operations, plug loads, other energy demands, and design 15 to earn the ENERGY STAR targets for new construction and major 16 renovation where applicable. For new construction target low energy 17 use index. For major renovations, target reducing energy use by 50 18 percent below prerenovations baseline.

19 (d) On-site renewable energy: Implement renewable energy 20 generation projects on agency property for agency use, when life-21 cycle cost effective.

(e) High-efficiency electric equipment: Use only high-efficiency
 electric equipment for water and space heating needs not met through
 on-site renewable energy, when life-cycle cost effective.

(f) Measurement and verification: For buildings over 50,000 square feet, install building level electricity meters in new major construction and renovation projects to track and continuously optimize performance. Include equivalent meters for natural gas and steam, where natural gas and steam are used. Where appropriate, install dashboards inside buildings to display and incentivize occupants on energy use.

32 (g) Benchmarking: Compare performance data from the first year of 33 operation with the energy design target. Verify that the building 34 performance meets or exceeds the design target. For other building 35 and space types, use an equivalent benchmarking tool.

36 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7011. State agencies, including institutions 37 of higher education, shall allot and report full-time equivalent 38 staff for capital projects in a manner comparable to staff reporting 39 for operating expenditures.

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1 NEW SECTION. Sec. 7012. HIGHER EDUCATION CAPITAL PROJECT SCORING PROCESS FOR FOUR-YEAR INSTITUTIONS. It is the intent of the 2 legislature that in budget development preparations for the 2023-2025 3 fiscal biennium, the office of financial management, the council of 4 presidents, and four-year higher education institutions return to the 5 6 objective analysis and scoring process for four-year institutions' capital projects, as prescribed under RCW 28.77.070 and 43.88D.010, 7 in order to produce a single, prioritized capital project list for 8 all four-year higher education institutions. 9

10 NEW SECTION. Sec. **7013.** Executive Order No. 05-05, archaeological and cultural resources, was issued effective November 11 10, 2005. Agencies shall comply with the requirements set forth in 12 13 this executive order and must consult with the department of archaeology and historic preservation and affected tribes on the 14 15 potential effects of projects on cultural resources and historic 16 properties proposed in state-funded construction or acquisition 17 projects, including grant or pass-through funding that culminates in construction or land acquisitions. Consultation with the department 18 19 of archaeology and historic preservation and affected tribes must be 20 initiated early in the project planning process, prior to 21 construction or taking title.

22 Sec. 7014. RCW 43.19.501 and 2020 c 356 s 7005 are each amended 23 to read as follows:

The Thurston county capital facilities account is created in the state treasury. The account is subject to the appropriation and allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW. Moneys in the account may be expended for capital projects in facilities owned and managed by the department in Thurston county.

During the 2019-2021 <u>and 2021-2023</u> fiscal ((biennium)) <u>biennia</u>, the Thurston county capital facilities account may be appropriated for costs associated with staffing to support capital budget and project activities and lease and facility oversight activities.

33 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7015. FOR THE ARTS COMMISSION—ART WORK 34 ALLOWANCE. (1) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this 35 act for original construction of school plant facilities is provided 36 solely for the purposes of RCW 28A.335.210.

1 (2) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act 2 for original construction or any major renovation or remodel work 3 exceeding \$200,000 by colleges or universities is provided solely for 4 the purposes of RCW 28B.10.027.

5 (3) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act 6 for original construction of any public building by a state agency 7 identified in RCW 43.17.200 is provided solely for the purposes of 8 RCW 43.17.200.

(4) At least 80 percent of the moneys spent by the Washington 9 state arts commission during the 2021-2023 biennium for the purposes 10 of RCW 28A.335.210, 28B.10.027, and 43.17.200 must be expended solely 11 for direct acquisition of works of art. Except for art allocations 12 made under K-3 class size reduction grants under section 5029 of this 13 14 act, art allocations not expended within the ensuing two biennia will lapse. The commission may use up to \$200,000 of this amount to 15 16 conserve or maintain existing pieces in the state art collection.

17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7016. To carry out the provisions of this 18 act, the governor may assign responsibility for predesign, design, 19 construction, and other related activities to any appropriate agency.

20 Sec. 7017. If any federal moneys appropriated by NEW SECTION. this act for capital projects are not received by the state, the 21 department or agency to which the moneys were appropriated may 22 23 replace the federal moneys with funds available from private or local 24 sources. No replacement may occur under this section without the prior approval of the director of financial management 25 in consultation with the senate ways and means committee and the house 26 27 of representatives capital budget committee.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 7018. (1) Unless otherwise stated, for all appropriations under this act that require a match of nonstate money or in-kind contributions, the following requirement, consistent with RCW 43.88.150, shall apply: Expenditures of state money shall be timed so that the state share of project expenditures never exceeds the intended state share of total project costs.

34 (2) Provision of the full amount of required matching funds is
 35 not required to permit the expenditure of capital budget
 36 appropriations for phased projects if a proportional amount of the

1 required matching funds is provided for each distinct, identifiable
2 phase of the project.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 7019. NONTAXABLE AND TAXABLE BOND PROCEEDS. 3 Portions of the appropriation authority granted by this act from the 4 5 state building construction account, or any other account receiving bond proceeds, may be transferred to the state taxable building 6 construction account as deemed necessary by the state finance 7 committee to comply with the federal internal revenue service rules 8 and regulations pertaining to the use of nontaxable bond proceeds. 9 10 Portions of the general obligation bond proceeds authorized by chapter . . . (Substitute House Bill No. 1081), Laws of 2021, (State 11 General Bonds and General Accounts) for deposit into the state 12 taxable building construction account that are in excess of amounts 13 required to comply with the federal internal revenue service rules 14 15 and regulations shall be deposited into the state building 16 construction account. The state treasurer shall submit written 17 notification to the director of financial management if it is 18 determined that a shift of appropriation authority between the state building construction account, or any other account receiving bond 19 20 proceeds, and the state taxable building construction account is 21 necessary, or that a shift of appropriation authority from the state 22 taxable building construction account to the state building construction account may be made. 23

24 NEW SECTION. Sec. 7020. (1) Minor works project lists are single line appropriations that include multiple projects of a 25 26 similar nature and that are valued between \$25,000 and \$1,000,000 27 each, with the exception of higher education minor works projects that may be valued up to \$2,000,000. Funds appropriated in this act 28 29 for minor works may not be initially allotted until agencies submit 30 project lists to the office of financial management for review and approval. 31

(1) Remodeling and improvements as required to meet building code, licensing requirements, or legal operations to residential properties owned and operated by an entity eligible under RCW 43.185A.040, which were transferred as described in RCW 82.45.010(3)(t) by the parent of a child with developmental disabilities.

31 (3) Preference must be given for projects that include an early 32 learning facility.

33 (4) Legislative appropriations from capital bond proceeds may be used only for the costs of projects authorized under subsection 34 (2)(a), (i), and (j) of this section, and not for the administrative 35 costs of the department, except that during the 2021-2023 fiscal 36 biennium, the department may use up to three percent of the 37 appropriations from capital bond proceeds for administrative costs 38 39 associated with application, distribution, and project development 40 activities of the housing assistance program.

1 (5) Moneys from repayment of loans from appropriations from 2 capital bond proceeds may be used for all activities necessary for 3 the proper functioning of the housing assistance program except for 4 activities authorized under subsection (2)(b) and (c) of this 5 section.

6 (6) Administrative costs associated with application, 7 distribution, and project development activities of the department 8 may not exceed three percent of the annual funds available for the 9 housing assistance program. 16 NEW SECTION. Sec. 7034. The public use general aviation airport 17 loan revolving account is created in the custody of the state 18 treasurer. All receipts from moneys directed by law to the account must be deposited into the account. 12 (g) Enter into agreements or other transactions with and accept 13 grants and cooperation from any governmental agency in furtherance of 14 this section;

Expenditures from the account 19 may be used only for capital projects directly enabling work, 20 21 education and health monitoring, including remote options, in 22 response to the public health emergency with respect to the 23 coronavirus disease.

24 NEW SECTION. Sec. 7039. The state intends to transfer the Olympia armory from the military department to the city of Olympia 25 26 for use as a community asset dedicated to using the arts to support 27 community development, arts education, and economic development initiatives for a minimum of 10 years. If by November 30, 2022, the 28 29 city and the department have reached a memorandum of understanding to transfer the property for these purposes, along with the city's 30 assumption of closing costs, then the department shall transfer the 31 property to the city. 9 (1) The department shall establish the building communities fund program. Under the program, capital and technical assistance grants 10 11 may be made to nonprofit organizations for acquiring, constructing, or rehabilitating facilities used for the delivery of nonresidential 12 community services, including social service centers and multipurpose 13 community centers, including those serving a distinct or ethnic 14 15 population. (vi) Is ready to proceed and will make timely use of the funds;

(ix) Will achieve its stated objectives; and

(x) Is a community priority as shown through tangible commitments of existing or future assets made to the project by community 10 residents, leaders, businesses, and government partners. 11

12 (c) (i) The evaluation and ranking process shall also include an examination of existing assets that applicants may apply to projects. 13 Grant assistance under this section shall not exceed ((twenty-five)) 14 25 percent of the total cost of the project, except((, under)) as 15 16 provided in (c) (ii) and (iii) of this subsection (2).

17 (ii) For project lists submitted during the 2021-2023 fiscal biennium, grant assistance under this section may not exceed: 18

19 (A) One hundred percent of the total cost for projects up to 20 \$100,000;

(B) Seventy-five percent of the total cost for projects that 21 22 exceed \$100,000, up to \$250,000;

4 (d) The department may not set a monetary limit to funding 5 requests.

6 (3) The department shall submit biennially to the governor and the legislature in the department's capital budget request a ranked 7 list of the qualified eligible projects for which applications were 8 received. The list must include a description of each project, its 9 total cost, and the amount of state funding requested. The 10 appropriate fiscal committees of the legislature shall use this list 11 12 to determine building communities fund projects that may receive funding in the capital budget. The total amount of state capital 13 funding available for all projects on the biennial list shall be 14 determined by the capital budget beginning with the 2009-2011 15 16 biennium and thereafter. In addition, ((if cash funds have been 17 appropriated,)) up to ((three million dollars)) \$3,000,000 may be 18 used for technical assistance grants.
