1 AN ACT Relating to the capital budget; amending RCW 79A.25.210,
2 28B.20.725, 28B.15.210, 28B.15.310, 28B.30.750, 28B.35.370,
3 28B.50.360, 39.35D.030, 43.07.410, 43.88D.010, 43.155.070,
4 43.330.400, 79.70.100, 79.71.060, 28A.525.159, and 43.31.574;
5 amending 2023 c 474 ss 6005, 6014, 6021, 6023, 6024, 6033, 1003,
6 6074, 6087, 1044, 1056, 1066, 2032, 2036, 6244, 6251, 6252, 6310,

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

16 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) A capital budget is hereby adopted
17 and, subject to the provisions set forth in this act, the several
18 dollar amounts hereinafter specified, or so much thereof as shall be
19 sufficient to accomplish the purposes designated, are hereby
20 appropriated and authorized to be incurred for capital projects

1 during the period beginning with the effective date of this act and
2 ending June 30, 2027, out of the several funds specified in this act.

3 (2) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout this act
4 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

5 (a) "Fiscal year 2026" or "FY 2026" means the period beginning
6 July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026.

7 (b) "Fiscal year 2027" or "FY 2027" means the period beginning
8 July 1, 2026, and ending June 30, 2027.

9 (c) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an
10 unappropriated status.

11 (d) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent
12 only for the specified purpose.

13 (3) Unless otherwise specifically authorized in this act, any
14 portion of an amount provided solely for a specified purpose that is
15 not expended subject to the specified conditions and limitations to
16 fulfill the specified purpose shall lapse.

17 (4) The amounts shown under the headings "Prior Biennia," "Future
18 Biennia," and "Total" in this act are for informational purposes only
19 and do not constitute legislative approval of these amounts. "Prior
20 biennia" typically refers to the immediate prior biennium for
21 reappropriations, but may refer to multiple biennia in the case of
22 specific projects. A "future biennia" amount is an estimate of what
23 may be appropriated for the project or program in the 2027-2029
24 biennium and the following three biennia; an amount of zero does not
25 necessarily constitute legislative intent to not provide funding for
26 the project or program in the future.

27 (5) "Reappropriations" in this act are appropriations and, unless
28 the context clearly provides otherwise, are subject to the relevant
29 conditions and limitations applicable to appropriations.
30 Reappropriations shall be limited to the unexpended balances
31 remaining on June 30, 2025, from the 2023-2025 biennial
32 appropriations for each project.

28 The appropriations in this section are subject to the following
29 conditions and limitations:

30 (1)(a) \$52,000,000 of the Ruth LeCocq Kagi early learning
31 facilities development account—state appropriation in this section is
32 provided solely for the early learning facility grant and loan
33 program, subject to the provisions of RCW 43.31.565 through
34 43.31.583, and 43.84.092, to provide state assistance for designing,
35 constructing, purchasing, expanding, or modernizing public or private

1 early learning education facilities for eligible organizations. Up to
2 3.5 percent of the funding in this subsection (1) may be used by the
3 department of children, youth, and families to provide technical
4 assistance to early learning providers interested in applying for the
5 early learning facility grant or loan program.

6 (b) The department is encouraged to leverage private and public
7 match funds when feasible and may not require match funds for
8 applicants experiencing financial hardship. The department may not
9 consider the level of project match funds as a competitive criterion
10 when selecting or recommending projects for funding.

11 (c) Grants may include awards for construction, renovation, or
12 facility purchase projects that will increase early childhood
13 education and assistance program capacity by supporting conversion of
14 slots from part day programs to full day programs or extended day
15 programs, or conversion of full day programs to extended day
16 programs, as defined in RCW 43.216.010.

17 (2) \$3,000,000 of the Ruth LeCocq Kagi early learning facilities
18 development account—state appropriation in this section is provided
19 solely for emergency grants pursuant to HB 1314 (Early learning
20 facilities). The department may use up to \$112,000 of the
21 appropriation in this subsection (2) for administrative expenses.

22 (3) \$8,000,000 of the Ruth LeCocq Kagi early learning facilities
23 development account—state appropriation in this section is provided
24 solely for minor renovation grants.

25 (4) \$6,000,000 of the Ruth LeCocq Kagi early learning facilities
26 revolving account—state appropriation in this section is provided
27 solely for the Washington early learning loan fund. Up to four
28 percent of the funding in this subsection (4) may be used by the
29 contractor to provide technical assistance to early learning
30 providers interested in applying for the early learning facility
31 grant or loan program. The department may not use any portion of the
32 appropriation in this subsection (4) for administrative expenses of
33 the department.

34 (5) The department of children, youth, and families must develop
35 methodology to identify, at the school district boundary level, the
36 geographic locations of where early childhood education and
37 assistance program slots are needed to meet the entitlement specified
38 in RCW 43.216.556. This methodology must be linked to the caseload
39 forecast produced by the caseload forecast council and must include

1 estimates of the number of slots needed at each school district. This
2 methodology must inform any early learning facilities needs
3 assessment conducted by the department and the department of
4 children, youth, and families. This methodology must be included as
5 part of the budget submittal documentation required by RCW 43.88.030.

6 (6) When prioritizing areas with the highest unmet need for early
7 childhood education and assistance program slots, the committee of
8 early learning experts convened by the department pursuant to RCW
9 43.31.581 must first consider those areas at risk of not meeting the
10 entitlement specified in RCW 43.216.556.

11 (7) The department must track the number of slots being renovated
12 separately from the number of slots being constructed and, within
13 these categories, must track the number of slots separately by
14 program for the working connections child care program and the early
15 childhood education and assistance program.

16 (8) When prioritizing applications for projects pursuant to RCW
17 43.31.581, the department must award priority points to applications
18 from a rural county or from extreme child care deserts as defined by
19 the department of children, youth, and families.

20 (9) For early learning facilities collocated with affordable or
21 supportive housing developments, the department may remit state
22 funding on a reimbursement basis for 100 percent of eligible project
23 costs, regardless of the project's match amount, once the nonstate
24 share of project costs have been either expended or firmly committed
25 in an amount sufficient to complete the entire project or a distinct
26 phase of the project that is useable to the public as an early
27 learning facility.

31 (2) The department must establish a competitive process to
32 solicit proposals for and prioritize projects whose primary objective
33 is to assist libraries operated by governmental units, as defined in
34 RCW 27.12.010, in acquiring, constructing, repairing, or
35 rehabilitating facilities.

36 (3) The department must establish a committee to develop the
37 grant program criteria established under subsection (2) of this
38 section and review proposals. The committee must be composed of five

1 members as provided in this subsection. The committee must include:
2 (a) A representative from the department of commerce; (b) a
3 representative from the department of archaeology and historic
4 preservation; (c) the state librarian; (d) a representative from a
5 library district; and (e) a representative from a municipal library.

6 (4) The department must conduct a statewide solicitation of
7 project applications. The department must evaluate and rank
8 applications in consultation with the committee established in
9 subsection (3) of this section, using objective criteria. The ranking
10 of projects must prioritize library district facilities listed on a
11 local, state, or federal register of historic places and those
12 located in distressed or rural counties. The evaluation and ranking
13 process must also include an examination of existing assets that
14 applicants propose to apply to projects. Grant assistance under this
15 section may not exceed 50 percent of the total cost of the project.
16 The nonstate portion of the total project cost may include cash, the
17 value of real property when acquired solely for the purpose of the
18 project, and in-kind contributions.

19 (5) The department must submit a prioritized list of recommended
20 projects to the governor and the legislature by October 1, 2026, for
21 inclusion in the department of commerce's 2027-2029 biennial capital
22 budget request. The list must include a description of each project,
23 the amount of recommended state funding, and documentation of
24 nonstate funds to be used for the project. Individual grants may not
25 exceed \$2,000,000. The total amount of recommended state funding for
26 the projects on a biennial project list may not exceed \$10,000,000.

27 (6) In contracts for grants authorized under this section, the
28 department must include provisions that require that capital
29 improvements be held by the grantee for a specified period of time
30 appropriate to the amount of the grant and that facilities be used
31 for the express purpose of the grant. If the grantee is found to be
32 out of compliance with provisions of the contract, the grantee must
33 repay to the state building construction account—state the principal
34 amount of the grant plus interest calculated at the rate of interest
35 on state of Washington general obligation bonds issued on the date
36 most close in time to the date of authorization of the grant. Any
37 repayments received pursuant to this subsection must be spent before
38 any other amounts in the building construction account—state.

39 (7) The department must assist grant recipients under this
40 section to apply for applicable competitive federal grant funding

1 and, upon receipt of any such funding, an equal amount of the state
2 building construction account—state appropriation must be placed in
3 unallotted status.

33 (1) (a) The appropriation in this section is provided solely for
34 the department to administer grants to nonprofit organizations, local
35 governments, federally recognized tribal governments and tribal

1 entities, state agencies, housing authorities, ports, transit
2 agencies, and research organizations for planning, design, and
3 implementation of capital projects and clean energy technologies that
4 reduce greenhouse gas emissions in vulnerable, overburdened, and
5 tribal communities identified by the department. The department must
6 prioritize grants providing meaningful benefits to vulnerable
7 populations in overburdened communities, as defined in RCW
8 70A.02.010.

9 (b) Eligible uses of grant funds include, but are not limited to,
10 planning for sustainable communities and predesign work, energy
11 efficiency improvements, renewable energy generation, increasing the
12 supply of affordable, energy efficient housing, developing resilient
13 and sustainable infrastructure systems, zero-emission, active
14 mobility, and micromobility transportation infrastructure, education
15 and engagement, and workforce development.

16 (2) Up to three percent of the appropriation in this section is
17 for the department to administer the grant program. Administration
18 includes, but is not limited to, identifying eligible communities,
19 providing technical assistance, managing contracts, reporting, and
20 providing planning and implementation assistance.

29 The appropriation in this section is subject to the following
30 conditions and limitations:

31 (1) (a) \$25,000,000 of the climate commitment account—state
32 appropriation is provided solely for the department to administer
33 grants to eligible third-party administrators for heat pump and other
34 high-efficiency electric equipment rebates, with a focus on low and
35 moderate-income households, renters, nonprofit organizations, and
36 small businesses. State incentives and rebates for installation of
37 high-efficiency electric equipment, including electrical panel
38 upgrades, provide a benefit to the public consistent with the state's

1 energy strategy and climate mandates by reducing greenhouse gas
2 emissions from the built environment. The department shall administer
3 the grant program in a manner that seeks to maximize greenhouse gas
4 emissions reductions.

5 (b) \$5,000,000 of the climate commitment account—state
6 appropriation is provided solely for the department to administer
7 grants to eligible third-party administrators for heat pumps for
8 adult family homes.

9 (2) The department shall implement a statewide high-efficiency
10 electric equipment program consistent with the following:

11 (a) Aid the transition of residential and commercial buildings
12 away from fossil fuels by providing education and outreach resources
13 for the installation of high-efficiency electric heat pumps and other
14 high-efficiency electric equipment;

15 (b) Provide grants, coordination, and technical assistance to
16 eligible third-party administrators to promote the adoption of high-
17 efficiency electric heat pump equipment for space and water heating;
18 and

19 (c) Develop strategies to ensure that the program serves low-
20 income households, vulnerable populations, and overburdened
21 communities, including dedicating at least 40 percent of the program
22 funding for this purpose. For the purposes of this subsection (2)(c),
23 "overburdened communities" has the same meaning as in RCW 70A.65.010
24 and "vulnerable populations" has the same meaning as in RCW
25 70A.02.010.

26 (3) For the purposes of this section, "eligible third-party
27 administrators" include, but are not limited to, nonprofits,
28 utilities, housing providers, community action agencies, and
29 community-based organizations.

37 The appropriation in this section is subject to the following
38 conditions and limitations:

1 (1) The appropriation in this section is provided solely for the
2 department to issue grants to community hospitals or other community
3 providers to expand and establish new capacity for behavioral health
4 services in communities. The department must consult an advisory
5 group consisting of representatives from the department of social and
6 health services, the health care authority, one representative from a
7 managed care organization, one representative from an accountable
8 care organization, and one representative from the association of
9 county human services. The amounts provided in this section may be
10 used for construction and equipment costs associated with
11 establishment or preservation of the facilities. The department may
12 approve funding for the acquisition of a facility if the project will
13 result in increased behavioral health capacity. Amounts provided in
14 this section may not be used for operating costs associated with the
15 treatment of patients using these services.

16 (2) The department must establish criteria for the issuance of
17 the grants, which must include:

18 (a) Evidence that the application was developed in collaboration
19 with one or more regional behavioral health entities that administer
20 the purchasing of services;

21 (b) Evidence that the applicant has assessed and would meet gaps
22 in the geographical availability of behavioral health services in
23 their region;

24 (c) Evidence that the applicant is able to meet applicable
25 licensing and certification requirements in the facility that will be
26 used to provide services;

27 (d) A commitment by applicants to serve persons who are publicly
28 funded or persons detained for involuntary commitment under chapter
29 71.05 RCW;

30 (e) A commitment by the applicant to maintain and operate the
31 beds or facility for a time period commensurate to the state
32 investment, but for at least a 10-year period;

33 (f) The date upon which structural modifications or construction
34 would begin and the anticipated date of completion of the project;

35 (g) A detailed estimate of the costs associated with opening the
36 beds;

37 (h) A financial plan demonstrating the applicant's ability to
38 maintain and operate the facility; and

39 (i) The applicant's commitment to work with local courts and
40 prosecutors as applicable to ensure that prosecutors and courts in

1 the area served by the hospital or facility will be available to
2 conduct involuntary commitment hearings and proceedings under chapter
3 71.05 RCW.

4 (3) In awarding funding for projects in subsection (5) of this
5 section, the department, in consultation with the advisory group
6 established in subsection (1) of this section, must strive for
7 geographic distribution and to allocate funding based on population
8 and service needs of an area. The department must consider current
9 services available, anticipated services available based on projects
10 underway, and the service delivery needs of an area.

11 (4) The department must prioritize projects that increase
12 capacity in unserved and underserved areas of the state.

13 (5) \$70,000,000 of the state building construction account—state
14 appropriation in this section is provided solely for competitive

35 (1) The department shall not expend the appropriation in this

37 been either expended or firmly committed, or both, in an amount

1 sufficient to complete the project or a distinct phase of the project
2 that is useable to the public for the purpose intended by the
3 legislature. This requirement does not apply to projects where a
4 share of the appropriation is for design costs only.

5 (2) Prior to receiving funds, project recipients must demonstrate

7 2025-2027 biennium, \$425,999,496 for the 2027-2029 biennium, and
8 \$655,708,813 for the 2029-2031 biennium.

9 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8002.** ACQUISITION OF PROPERTIES AND
10 FACILITIES THROUGH FINANCIAL CONTRACTS. (1) The following agencies
11 may enter into financial contracts, paid from any funds of an agency,
12 appropriated or nonappropriated, for the purposes indicated and in
13 not more than the principal amounts indicated, plus financing
14 expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW. When
15 securing properties under this section, agencies shall use the most
16 economical financial contract option available, including long-term
17 leases, lease-purchase agreements, lease-development with option to
18 purchase agreements or financial contracts using certificates of
19 participation. Expenditures made by an agency for one of the
20 indicated purposes before the issue date of the authorized financial
21 contract and any certificates of participation therein are intended
22 to be reimbursed from proceeds of the financial contract and any
23 certificates of participation therein to the extent provided in the
24 agency's financing plan approved by the state finance committee.

25 (2) Those noninstructional facilities of higher education
26 institutions authorized in this section to enter into financial
27 contracts are not eligible for state funded maintenance and
28 operations. Instructional space that is available for regularly
29 scheduled classes for academic transfer, basic skills, and workforce
30 training programs may be eligible for state funded maintenance and
31 operations.

32 (3) Western Washington University: Enter into a financing
33 contract for up to \$3,000,000 plus financing expenses, required
34 reserves, and capitalized interest pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to
35 construct a parking lot replacement.

36 (4) Community and technical colleges:

37 (a) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Columbia Basin
38 College for up to \$18,000,000 plus financing expenses, required

1 reserves, and capitalized interest pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to
2 construct student housing.

3 (b) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Edmonds College
4 for up to \$9,000,000 plus financing expenses, required reserves, and
5 capitalized interest pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to acquire student
6 housing.

7 (c) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Clover Park
8 Technical College for up to \$15,000,000 plus financing expenses,
9 required reserves, and capitalized interest pursuant to chapter 39.94
10 RCW to acquire an eastside training facility.

11 (d) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Renton Technical
12 College for up to \$8,000,000 plus financing expenses, required
13 reserves, and capitalized interest pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to
14 continue renovations in Building J.

15 (e) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of South Puget
16 Sound Community College for up to \$5,000,000 plus financing expenses,
17 required reserves, and capitalized interest pursuant to chapter 39.94
18 RCW to construct an athletic field and related support amenities.

19 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8003.** (1) To ensure that major construction
20 projects are carried out in accordance with legislative and executive
21 intent, agencies must complete a predesign for state construction
22 projects with a total anticipated cost in excess of \$10,000,000. For
23 purposes of this section, "total anticipated cost" means the sum of
24 the anticipated cost of the predesign, design, and construction
25 phases of the project.

26 (2) Appropriations for design may not be expended or encumbered
27 until the office of financial management has reviewed and approved
28 the agency's predesign.

29 (3) The predesign must explore at least three project
30 alternatives. These alternatives must be both distinctly different
31 and viable solutions to the issue being addressed. The chosen
32 alternative should be the most reasonable and cost-effective
33 solution. The predesign document must include, but not be limited to,
34 program, site, and cost analysis, and an analysis of the life-cycle
35 costs of the alternatives explored, in accordance with the predesign
36 manual adopted by the office of financial management.

37 (4) For projects exceeding the \$10,000,000 predesign threshold
38 established in this section, the office of financial management may
39 make an exception to some or all of the predesign requirements in

1 this section. The office of financial management shall report any
2 exception to the fiscal committees of the legislature:

3 (a) A description of the major capital project for which the
4 predesign waiver is made;

5 (b) An explanation of the reason for the waiver; and

6 (c) A rough order of magnitude cost estimate for the project's
7 design and construction.

8 (5) In deliberations related to submitting an exception under
9 this section, the office of financial management shall consider the
10 following factors:

11 (a) Whether there is any determination to be made regarding the
12 site of the project;

13 (b) Whether there is any determination to be made regarding
14 whether the project will involve renovation, new construction, or
15 both;

16 (c) Whether, within six years of submitting the request for
17 funding, the agency has completed, or initiated the construction of,
18 a substantially similar project;

19 (d) Whether there is any anticipated change to the project's
20 program or the services to be delivered at the facility;

21 (e) Whether the requesting agency indicates that the project may
22 not require some or all of the predesign requirements in this section
23 due to a lack of complexity; and

24 (f) Whether any other factors related to project complexity or
25 risk, as determined by the office of financial management, could
26 reduce the need for, or scope of, a predesign.

27 (6) If under this section, some or all predesign requirements are
28 waived, the office of financial management may instead propose a
29 professional project cost estimate instead of a request for predesign
30 funding.

31 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8004.** (1) The legislature finds that use of
32 life-cycle cost analysis will aid public entities, architects,
33 engineers, and contractors in making design and construction
34 decisions that positively impact both the initial construction cost
35 and the ongoing operating and maintenance cost of a project. To
36 ensure that the total cost of a project is accounted for and the most
37 reasonable and cost efficient design is used, agencies shall develop
38 life-cycle costs for any construction project over \$10,000,000. The
39 life-cycle costs must represent the present value sum of capital

1 costs, installation costs, operating costs, and maintenance costs
2 over the life expectancy of the project. The legislature further
3 finds the most effective approach to the life-cycle cost analysis is
4 to integrate it into the early part of the design process.

5 (2) Agencies must develop a minimum of three project alternatives
6 for use in the life-cycle cost analysis. These alternatives must be
7 both distinctly different and viable solutions to the issue being
8 addressed. Agencies must choose the most reasonable and cost-
9 effective solution, as supported by the life-cycle cost analysis. A
10 brief description of each project alternative and why it was chosen
11 must be included in the life-cycle cost analysis section of the
12 predesign.

13 (3) The office of financial management shall: (a) Make available
14 a life-cycle cost model to be used for analysis; (b) in consultation
15 with the department of enterprise services, provide assistance in
16 using the life-cycle cost model; and (c) update the life-cycle cost
17 model annually including assumptions for inflation rates, discount
18 rates, and energy rates.

19 (4) Agencies shall consider architectural and engineering firms'
20 and general contractors' experience using life-cycle costs, operating
21 costs, and energy efficiency measures when selecting an architectural
22 and engineering firm, or when selecting contractors using alternative
23 contracting methods.

24 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8005.** Agencies administering construction
25 projects with a total anticipated cost in excess of \$10,000,000 must
26 submit progress reports to the office of financial management and to
27 the fiscal committees of the house of representatives and senate.
28 "Total anticipated cost" means the sum of the anticipated cost of the
29 predesign, design, and construction phases of the project. Reports
30 must be submitted on July 1st and December 31st of each year in a
31 format determined by the office of financial management. After the
32 project is completed, agencies must also submit a closeout report
33 that identifies the total project cost and any unspent
34 appropriations.

35 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8006.** (1) Allotments for appropriations in
36 this act shall be provided in accordance with the capital project
37 review requirements adopted by the office of financial management and
38 in compliance with RCW 43.88.110. Projects that will be employing

1 alternative public works construction procedures under chapter 39.10
2 RCW are subject to the allotment procedures defined in this section
3 and RCW 43.88.110.

4 (2) Each project is defined as proposed in the legislative budget
5 notes or in the governor's budget document.

6 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8007.** (1) The office of financial management
7 may authorize a transfer of appropriation authority provided for a
8 capital project that is in excess of the amount required for the
9 completion of such project to another capital project for which the
10 appropriation is insufficient. No such transfer may be used to expand
11 the capacity of any facility beyond that intended in making the
12 appropriation. Such transfers may be effected only between capital
13 appropriations to a specific department, commission, agency, or
14 institution of higher education and only between capital projects
15 that are funded from the same fund or account. No transfers may occur
16 between projects to local government agencies except where the grants
17 are provided within a single omnibus appropriation and where such
18 transfers are specifically authorized by the implementing statutes
19 that govern the grants.

20 (2) The office of financial management may find that an amount is
21 in excess of the amount required for the completion of a project only
22 if: (a) The project as defined in the notes to the budget document is
23 substantially complete and there are funds remaining; or (b) bids
24 have been let on a project and it appears to a substantial certainty
25 that the project as defined in the notes to the budget document can
26 be completed within the biennium for less than the amount
27 appropriated in this act.

28 (3) For the purposes of this section, the intent is that each
29 project be defined as proposed to the legislature in the governor's
30 budget document, unless it clearly appears from the legislative
31 history that the legislature intended to define the scope of a
32 project in a different way.

33 (4) A report of any transfer effected under this section, except
34 emergency projects or any transfer under \$250,000, shall be filed
35 with the fiscal committees of the legislature by the office of
36 financial management at least 30 days before the date the transfer is
37 effected. The office of financial management shall report all
38 emergency or smaller transfers within 30 days from the date of
39 transfer.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8008.** (1) It is expected that projects be
2 ready to proceed in a timely manner depending on the type or phase of
3 the project or program that is the subject of the appropriation in
4 this act. Except for major projects that customarily may take more
5 than two biennia to complete from predesign to the end of
6 construction, or large infrastructure grant or loan programs
7 supporting projects that often take more than two biennia to
8 complete, the legislature generally does not intend to reappropriate
9 funds more than once, particularly for smaller grant programs, local/
10 community projects, and minor works.

11 (2) Agencies shall expedite the expenditure of reappropriations
12 and appropriations in this act in order to: (a) Rehabilitate
13 infrastructure resources; (b) accelerate environmental rehabilitation
14 and restoration projects for the improvement of the state's natural
15 environment; (c) reduce additional costs associated with acquisition
16 and construction inflationary pressures; and (d) provide additional
17 employment opportunities associated with capital expenditures.

18 (3) To the extent feasible, agencies are directed to accelerate
19 expenditure rates at their current level of permanent employees and
20 shall use contracted design and construction services wherever
21 necessary to meet the goals of this section.

22 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8009.** Any building project that receives over
23 \$10,000,000 in funding from the capital budget must be built to
24 sustainable standards. "Sustainable building" means a building that
25 integrates and optimizes all major high-performance building
26 attributes, including energy efficiency, durability, life-cycle
27 performance, and occupant productivity, and minimizes greenhouse gas
28 emissions. The following design and construction attributes must be
29 integrated into the building project:

30 (1) Employ integrated design principles: Use a collaborative,
31 integrated planning and design process that initiates and maintains
32 an integrated project team in all stages of a project's planning and
33 delivery. Establish performance goals for siting, energy, water,
34 materials, and indoor environmental quality along with other
35 comprehensive design goals and ensures incorporation of these goals
36 throughout the design and life-cycle of the building. Consider all
37 stages of the building's life-cycle, including deconstruction.

38 (2) Commissioning: Employ commissioning practices tailored to the
39 size and complexity of the building and its system components in

1 order to verify performance of building components and systems and
2 help ensure that design requirements are met. This should include an
3 experienced commissioning provider, inclusion of commissioning
4 requirements in construction documents, a commissioning plan,
5 verification of the installation and performance of systems to be
6 commissioned, and a commissioning report.

7 (3) Optimize energy performance: Establish a whole building
8 performance target that takes into account the intended use,
9 occupancy, operations, plug loads, other energy demands, and design
10 to earn the ENERGY STAR targets for new construction and major
11 renovation where applicable. For new construction target low energy
12 use index. For major renovations, target reducing energy use by 50
13 percent below preretrofit baseline.

14 (4) On-site renewable energy: Implement renewable energy
15 generation projects on agency property for agency use, when life-
16 cycle cost effective.

17 (5) High-efficiency electric equipment: Use only high-efficiency
18 electric equipment for water and space heating needs not met through
19 on-site renewable energy, when life-cycle cost effective.

20 (6) Measurement and verification: For buildings over 50,000
21 square feet, install building level electricity meters in new major
22 construction and renovation projects to track and continuously
23 optimize performance. Include equivalent meters for natural gas and
24 steam, where natural gas and steam are used. Where appropriate,
25 install dashboards inside buildings to display and incentivize
26 occupants on energy use.

27 (7) Benchmarking: Compare performance data from the first year of
28 operation with the energy design target. Verify that the building
29 performance meets or exceeds the design target. For other building
30 and space types, use an equivalent benchmarking tool.

31 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8010.** State agencies, including institutions
32 of higher education, shall allot and report full-time equivalent
33 staff for capital projects in a manner comparable to staff reporting
34 for operating expenditures.

35 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8011.** Executive Order No. 21-02,
36 archaeological and cultural resources, was issued effective April 7,
37 2021. Agencies shall comply with the requirements set forth in this
38 executive order and must consult with the department of archaeology

1 and historic preservation and affected tribes on the potential
2 effects of projects on cultural resources and historic properties
3 proposed in state-funded construction or acquisition projects,
4 including grant or pass-through funding that culminates in
5 construction or land acquisitions. Consultation with the department
6 of archaeology and historic preservation and affected tribes must be
7 initiated early in the project planning process, prior to
8 construction or taking title.

9 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8012.** FOR THE ARTS COMMISSION—ART WORK
10 ALLOWANCE. (1) One-half of one percent of the moneys appropriated in
11 this act for original construction of school plant facilities is
12 provided solely for the purposes of RCW 28A.335.210.

13 (2) One-half of one percent of the moneys appropriated in this
14 act for original construction, or any major renovation or remodel
15 work exceeding \$200,000 by colleges or universities is provided
16 solely for the purposes of RCW 28B.10.027.

17 (3) One-half of one percent of the moneys appropriated in this
18 act for original construction of any public building by a state
19 agency identified in RCW 43.17.200 is provided solely for the
20 purposes of RCW 43.17.200.

21 (4) At least 75 percent of the moneys spent by the Washington
22 state arts commission during the 2025-2027 fiscal biennium for the
23 purposes of RCW 28A.335.210, 28B.10.027, and 43.17.200 must be
24 expended solely for direct acquisition of works of art; no more than
25 20 percent may be expended for program administration; and no more
26 than four percent may be expended to conserve or maintain existing
27 pieces in the state art collection.

28 (5) Beginning with new appropriations made in the 2025-2027
29 fiscal biennium, art allocations not expended by the end of the
30 second full fiscal biennium from the issuance of a certificate of
31 occupancy shall lapse, except for art allocations made under K-3
32 class size reduction grants under section 6312 of this act.

33 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8013.** To carry out the provisions of this
34 act, the governor may assign responsibility for predesign, design,
35 construction, and other related activities to any appropriate agency.

36 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8014.** If any federal moneys appropriated by
37 this act for capital projects are not received by the state, the

1 department or agency to which the moneys were appropriated may
2 replace the federal moneys with funds available from private or local
3 sources. No replacement may occur under this section without the
4 prior approval of the director of financial management in
5 consultation with the senate ways and means committee and the house
6 of representatives capital budget committee.

7 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8015.** (1) Unless otherwise stated, for all
8 appropriations under this act that require a match of nonstate money
9 or in-kind contributions, the following requirement, consistent with
10 RCW 43.88.150, shall apply: Expenditures of state money shall be
11 timed so that the state share of project expenditures never exceeds
12 the intended state share of total project costs.

13 (2) Provision of the full amount of required matching funds is
14 not required to permit the expenditure of capital budget
15 appropriations for phased projects if a proportional amount of the
16 required matching funds is provided for each distinct, identifiable
17 phase of the project.

18 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8016.** NONTAXABLE AND TAXABLE BOND PROCEEDS.
19 Portions of the appropriation authority granted by this act from the
20 state building construction account, or any other account receiving
21 bond proceeds, may be transferred to the state taxable building
22 construction account as deemed necessary by the state treasurer, on
23 behalf of the state finance committee, to comply with the federal
24 internal revenue service rules and regulations pertaining to the use
25 of nontaxable bond proceeds. Portions of the general obligation bond
26 proceeds authorized by chapter . . ., Laws of 2025 ((H-2081.2/25)
27 state general obligation bonds and related accounts) for deposit into
28 the state taxable building construction account that are in excess of
29 amounts required to comply with the federal internal revenue service
30 rules and regulations shall be deposited into the state building
31 construction account. The state treasurer shall submit written
32 notification to the director of financial management and the
33 legislative evaluation and accountability program committee if it is
34 determined that a shift of appropriation authority between the state
35 building construction account, or any other account receiving bond
36 proceeds, and the state taxable building construction account is
37 necessary, or that a shift of appropriation authority from the state
38 taxable building construction account, or any other account receiving

1 taxable bond proceeds, to the state building construction account may
2 be made.

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8017.** (1) Minor works project lists are
4 single line appropriations that include multiple projects of a
5 similar nature and that are valued between \$25,000 and \$1,500,000
6 each, with the exception of higher education minor works projects
7 that may be valued up to \$2,000,000. Funds appropriated in this act
8 for minor works may not be initially allotted until agencies submit
9 project lists to the office of financial management for review and
10 approval.

11 (2) Revisions to the project lists, including the addition of
12 projects and the transfer of funds between projects, are allowed but
13 must be submitted to the office of financial management, the house of
14 representatives capital budget committee, and the senate ways and
15 means committee for review and comment, and must include an
16 explanation of variances from prior approved lists. Any project list
17 revisions must be approved by the office of financial management
18 before funds may be expended from the minor works appropriation.

19 (3)(a) All minor works projects should be completed within two
20 years of the appropriation with the funding provided.

21 (b) Agencies are prohibited from including projects on their
22 minor works lists that are a phase of a larger project, and that if
23 combined over a continuous period of time, would exceed \$1,500,000,
24 or \$2,000,000 for higher education minor works projects.

25 (c) Minor works appropriations may not be used for the following:
26 Studies, except for technical or engineering reviews or designs that
27 lead directly to and support a project on the same minor works list;
28 planning; design outside the scope of work on a minor works list;
29 movable, temporary, and traditionally funded operating equipment not
30 in compliance with the equipment criteria established by the office
31 of financial management; software not dedicated to control of a
32 specialized system; moving expenses; land or facility acquisition;
33 rolling stock; computers; or to supplement funding for projects with
34 funding shortfalls unless expressly authorized. The office of
35 financial management may make an exception to the limitations
36 described in this subsection (3)(c) for exigent circumstances after
37 notifying the legislative fiscal committees and waiting 10 days for
38 comments by the legislature regarding the proposed exception.

1 (d) Minor works preservation projects may include program
2 improvements of no more than 25 percent of the individual minor works
3 preservation project cost.

4 (e) Improvements for accessibility in compliance with the
5 Americans with disabilities act may be included in any of the minor
6 works categories.

7 (4) In the 2027-2029 capital budget instructions, the office of
8 financial management shall increase the minor works threshold to
9 \$2,000,000, with the exception of higher education minor works
10 projects that may be valued up to \$4,000,000. It is the intent of the
11 legislature to increase the minor works threshold for the 2027-2029
12 biennial budget to \$2,000,000, with the exception of higher education
13 minor works projects that may be valued up to \$4,000,000.

14 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8018.** To the extent that any appropriation
15 authorizes expenditures of state funds from the state building
16 construction account, or from any other capital project account in
17 the state treasury, for a capital project or program that is
18 specified to be funded with proceeds from the sale of bonds, the
19 legislature declares that any such expenditures for that project or
20 program made prior to the issue date of the applicable bonds are
21 intended to be reimbursed from proceeds of those bonds in a maximum
22 amount equal to the amount of such appropriation.

23 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8019. FOR THE STATE TREASURER—TRANSFERS**

- 24 (1) Public Works Assistance Account: For transfer to the
25 water pollution control revolving account—state, up to
26 \$20,500,000 for fiscal year 2026 and up to \$20,500,000
27 for fiscal year 2027. \$41,000,000
28 (2) Public Works Assistance Account: For transfer
29 to the drinking water assistance account—state, up to
30 \$12,500,000 for fiscal year 2026 and up to \$12,500,000
31 for fiscal year 2027. \$25,000,000

32 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8020.** On July 1, 2025, the state treasurer
33 shall transfer \$21,307,000 of federal funding, or as much thereof as
34 is remaining, from the appropriation in section 7017, chapter 474,
35 Laws of 2023 to the federal broadband account created in RCW
36 43.330.400 (section 8036 of this act).

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8021.** The department of natural resources
2 must coordinate with the department of social and health services on
3 any long-term, revenue-generating opportunities it pursues on the
4 Fircrest campus for the purpose of structuring projects to have the
5 least impact on the clients served by the residential habilitation
6 center and on the center's daily operations to the greatest extent
7 possible.

8 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8022.** (1)(a) The director of the office of
9 financial management, or the director's designee, shall collect a
10 list of clean energy projects from state agencies that may qualify
11 for elective payment under P.L. 117-169 (inflation reduction act of
12 2022), such as the purchase of electric vehicle fleets; alternative
13 fuel vehicle refueling and charging; and renewable energy projects
14 including wind, solar, geothermal, electrolytic hydrogen, and energy
15 storage.

16 (b) For tax years 2025 and 2026, the director or director's
17 designee shall work with agencies, including institutions of higher
18 education, to complete all steps necessary to file an annual tax
19 return with the United States internal revenue service on behalf of
20 the state in order to claim elective payments.

21 (2) The office of financial management shall provide a report to
22 the fiscal committees of the legislature by July 1, 2025, and June
23 30, 2026, that summarizes the state's tax return submitted that year,
24 including the total dollar value of projects included in the tax
25 return and the total dollar amount of direct pay tax credits sought.
26 The report must also include an itemized list of the projects that
27 displays the dollar amounts and types of tax credits sought.

28 (3) Funds received by the state pursuant to this section shall be
29 deposited into the inflation reduction elective pay account created
30 in RCW 43.79.572.

31 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8023.** In order to accelerate the reduction of
32 embodied carbon and improve the environmental performance of
33 construction materials, agencies shall, whenever possible, review and
34 consider embodied carbon reported in environmental product
35 declarations when evaluating proposed structural materials for
36 construction projects.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8024.** Any agency receiving appropriations in
2 this act from climate commitment act accounts created in RCW
3 70A.65.240 through 70A.65.280 must report to and coordinate with the
4 department of ecology to track expenditures as described in RCW
5 70A.65.300 and chapter 173-446B WAC.

6 **Sec. 8025.** RCW 79A.25.210 and 2024 c 375 s 8007 are each amended
7 to read as follows:

8 The firearms range account is hereby created in the state general
9 fund. Moneys in the account shall be subject to legislative
10 appropriation and shall be used for purchase and development of land,
11 construction or improvement of range facilities, including fixed
12 structure construction or remodeling, equipment purchase, safety or
13 environmental improvements, noise abatement, and liability protection
14 for public and nonprofit firearm range training and practice
15 facilities.

16 Grant funds shall not be used for expendable shooting supplies,
17 or normal operating expenses. In making grants, the board shall give
18 priority to projects for noise abatement or safety improvement. Grant
19 funds shall not supplant funds for other organization programs.

20 The funds will be available to nonprofit shooting organizations,
21 school districts, and state, county, or local governments on a match
22 basis. All entities receiving matching funds must be open on a
23 regular basis and usable by law enforcement personnel or the general
24 public who possess Washington concealed pistol licenses or Washington
25 hunting licenses or who are enrolled in a firearm safety class.

26 Applicants for a grant from the firearms range account shall
27 provide matching funds in either cash or in-kind contributions. The
28 match must represent one dollar in value for each one dollar of the
29 grant except that in the case of a grant for noise abatement or
30 safety improvements the match must represent one dollar in value for
31 each two dollars of the grant. In-kind contributions include but are
32 not limited to labor, materials, and new property. Existing assets
33 and existing development may not apply to the match.

34 Applicants other than school districts or local or state
35 government must be registered as a nonprofit or not-for-profit
36 organization with the Washington secretary of state. The
37 organization's articles of incorporation must contain provisions for
38 the organization's structure, officers, legal address, and registered
39 agent.

1 Organizations requesting grants must provide the hours of range
